

SHOT STONEWALL JACKSON.

Mr. W. I. WHITEHURST, of near Bethel, an old Confederate, was in town Wednesday and told us a little about the part he took in the volley that killed Stonewall Jackson. He was in the Brigade to guard the road with orders to let no one pass. Having just driven HOOKER into his defenses at Chancellorsville, Gen. JACKSON was very anxious to follow up the fruits of the battle and reconnortering at night, and refusing to halt as demanded, was fired into by his own men and mortally wounded, on the night of May 2nd 1863, dying the 10th.

Mr. WHITEHURST was in the Brigade and fired at JACKSON.

Who hit him can not be known.

The trio was faithful followers of Lee and were the sons of Calvin and Susan CRAWFORD, born in Beaver Dam near Piney Grove church. David enlisted in the old Marlboro Company four brave young stalwart brothers a hard fought battle. engaged in that death pit at Bristow Station. Frank and George enlisted in the 44 N. C. Regiment. They too were at the bloody battle of Bristow Station. All were in the trenches before Petersburg. George was in the sharpshooter department. This writer has heard old comrades speak of him as the bravest of the brave on the deadly front. noble brothers were born poor (in a log cabin) though patriotic. Three harder or faithful followers of the lost cause would be hard to find. They were true while some of their neighbors deserted the grand old state and hid out in the woods.

All had by hard work and economy owned a plain country home and raised large families and died at peace with all They too, have another brother surviving (Allen). too, followed the lost flag.

Young men of the day think of the four brave young stalwart brothers that went out from that little log cabin by the old plank road.

They left five children at home, the eldest a daughter about 10 years old and on their return home found the house consumed by fire with four other children, one of the eldest escaped but is so dreadfully burned it is feared she will die.

TOJO HITLER MILLS' NAME BE CHANGED

Tojo Hitler MILLS, Negro infant born near Winterville on January 24, 1945 had his name changed today when his parents, Nasby R. MILLS, 68 year old farmer, and his wife, Marie DIXON MILLS, requested Register of Deeds Roy T. COX to change it to Odell MILLS.

The child's father, a respected Negro citizen of Winterville township, who has two boys in the armed forces, said he selected the names because they were unusual—nothing else. He wanted the youngster to have a name different from other boys when he goes to school, he said. Incidentally the MILLS son, Pvt. Emerson MILLS has been in service three years and in the South Pacific two years. Another son Pvt. Romia A. MILLS has been in the armed forces a year and in the South Pacific six months and he has "been sleeping in foxholes the past three months," he wrote his parents.

People in Winterville who know the MILLS died not take seriously the naming of the baby. They incline to the belief that MILLS simply picked the names Tojo and Hitler because they are unusual. From now on it is Odell MILLS--minus the German and Japananese cognomens.

FATAL AFFRAY

We understand that on Thursday last, in the town of Greenville, Pitt County, an affray occurred which resulted in the death of Mr. John CHERRY, of that place. It appears that a misunderstanding existed between Mr. CHERRY and Mr. Dempsey EASON, and on that day as Mr. EASON was passing the store of Mr. CHERRY he discharged a gun loaded with buck shot at Mr. EASON, wounding him severely. Mr. EASON then fired a pistol at Mr. CHERRY and wounded him also. The parties separated—but meeting in the street shortly afterwards, Mr. EASON fired his pistol a second time, giving Mr. CHERRY a mortal wound of which he died in about fifteen minutes. Mr. EASON is badly, though not considered dangerously wounded.

MURDER

A young man named Sherwood H. BROOM, a shoemaker, was killed in this place (says the Milton Gazette) on the 4th inst. by Henry BREWER. BROOM was stabbed in the breast, and only lived two or three minutes. We understand BROOM was born near Greenville, Pitt County, in this state, where his relations now live. He has been in this place several months, and it is said has conducted himself very prudently.

KILLING

Mr. J. N. BELL Jr. of this town informs us that he has information of the killing of Burt PARAMORE and one Dick PEEBLES while they were attempting to break into a house near Baltimore, Md. they were shot and killed. Burt PARAMORE will be remembered as one of the PARAMORE brothers. Dick PEEBLES was a native of Pitt County.

FAMILY HISTORIES

Gleaned by Roger Kammerer from the Daily Reflector, Greenville, North Carolina.

"Interesting History of an Old Family of Early Settlers. -Ayden, N.C., Jan. 28 [1910]. Editor Reflector:

About 1719, there came from England three brothers named HANCOCK, and settled in Pennsylvania, Maryland and North Carolina.

William HANCOCK settled in North Carolina, on Durham's Creek, in Beaufort county, and married soon thereafter Miss Bettie DURHAM, and to their union was born a son whom they christened Durham HANCOCK. When this son attained his majority he moved to the little village of New Bern, and was one of the first trustees of that town. He was soon married and raised a family near the placid waters of the Neuse. Durham HANCOCK'S oldest son was named George HANCOCK, and when he had developed into manhood he moved on Stoneton creek in Lenoir county near where the late Fred JONES and John NELSON once lived, and where the town of Grainger is now situated. He raised a large family of boys and girls. One of his boys was killed by Tories and his sister took his remains behind an old blind horse in a rickety cart with white oak tires, to the old burying ground on Durham's creek, and during her lonely trip she encountered the savage Indians, who detained her. Upon finding only a fearless woman with a corpse they fled in dismay, and while crossing the Dismal or Savannah she was accosted by some wild hyenas, but she still continued her lonely journey.

George had a son named James, who was fond of agriculture, and when he grew into manhood moved into Pitt county and settled on Swift creek, in the vicinity known as Fork swamp. He soon married and raised a family. His oldest son was named Herman HANCOCK, who wooed the heart of Miss Rhoda WORTHINGTON and lived near Hancock's, a Primitive Baptist church. To them was born several children, among them one girl named Mary, better known as "Pollie," who after her father's death lived with her widowed mother, and was quite prominent in that day as an herb and root doctor, and also told fortunes, etc. After the death of her mother she still lived alone, with only a few pet cats and a dog, until quite old. At her death of course all her belongings were converted into money. The famous jug that had been handed down through many generations was sold. Mr. R. L. COX tells us he was the highest bidder, for 35 cents, and it was then full of honey. Since then had dedicated its use to vinegar.

'Gideon <u>PELLET</u> [PETTIT], who married one of James HANCOCK'S daughters, was the first man who ever owned a set of steel cart <u>tiers</u> [tires] in Pitt county.

Dr. HASKETT, the famous root and herb doctor, married one of $H\underline{a}$ rman HANCOCK'S daughters, and lived near New Bern, and some of their direct descendants live in both New Bern and Kinston and still practice the same profession.

These facts are correct as near as I can get them.—R. W. SMITH."

"Local News. [1898] Remarkable Family.

Charles HARRIS left England in 1760, came to America and settled in Pitt county which was formed the same year. He was then twenty two years old. He served in three wars. He joined the Free Will Baptist church in 1845, when he was 107 years old. He never used any strong drink or tobacco. He died in 1860 at the advanced age of 122 years. His wife was Loany MCLAWHON, whose parents came from Scotland. They had nine children, none dying under eigth-six years of age. The youngest, the late Charles HARRIS died about a year ago, aged eighty eight years.

Charles HARRIS Jr. married very young, Betsey NICHOLS. They had twelve children, six boys and six girls. Three sons went through the late was without a scratch. A fouth was killed at Manassas. There are near two hundred living descendants of this couple. They are noted for quiet life, physical manhood and unusual longerity.

These facts are gathered from "Uncle" Josh TRIPP, who wife is a grand-daughter of Charles HARRIS. He saw the old man baptized in Swift Creek in 1845. People from far and near were present.

There are many relics of old times in the family. Our townsman Mr. H. B. HARRIS has a sword that his great grand father, Charles HARRIS Sr. used, probably in the Revolution."

"Desires to Get in Correspondence with Relatives. [1911] The following letter, recently received by Sheriff S. I. DUDLEY, was handed to The Reflector for publication that any relatives of the gentleman writing it may be read the letter and correspond with him if they desire:

-Aledo, Tex., Feb. 1, 1911.

To the Sheriff of Pitt County, N.C.:

Will you please inform me if there is living in your county at this time any persons by the name of BRAXTON. If there are, I suppose they are relatives of mine and I would be glad to correspond with them. My father and mother were born and raised in Pitt county. My grandfather BRAXTON'S given name was John, and my grandmother was named Hannah. My father's name was Lacy BRAXTON. One of his brothers was named Councel (or Counce), another was named John, and I think another was Charles. He had one sister who married a man by the name of Luke LOHON or MCLOHON. There may have been more brothers and sisters, but these are all that I can call to mind now.

My father's first wife and my mother was Elizabeth PARKER. There were three children born to that union; they first one named Marion died in infancy, the second, Elbert, lived to be about 12 years old and died in Tennessee, the third and last one was myself, Elias, and I am 66 years old. My mother died in Pitt county in 1846 and my father married a second time in 1848 or '49. His last wife was named Lizzina TRIPP, daughter of Arter TRIPP, of Pitt county. They moved to Tennessee in 1849 and raised six children, all of whom are living there, except one who is living in Texas.

My father has been dead near 25 years. My grandfather PARKER, I think, lived and died in Pitt county. My mother had two brothers and two sisters that I can remember, the brothers being Frank and James PARKER, the sisters Sylva, who married Simon HAMILTON and Rachael, who married a man by the name of Jesse BRAXTON. They moved to Tennessee in an early day.

If you can place this letter in the hands of any of my relatives you will confer a very great favor upon me, and I will be glad if they will write to me immediately.

(As BRAXTON is a very famil<u>a</u>r name in this county, and many people by that name are still living, we suppose relatives of the writer of the above letter will be easily found.—Ed.) "

He left a wife, 6 children and 25 grand children and 7 great grand children who mourn their loss.

Pension Abstracted by Roger Kammerer from National Archives

WILLIAM HARDEE

Application of William HARDEE, age 65, of Horry County, South Carolina. April 4, 1821.

He says he enlisted for one year on May 3, 1776 in Capt. Redin **BLOUNT'S** Company and Col. **BUNCOMBE**. He served until May 3, 1777 and discharged at Halifax, N.C. He was in no engagement during service. Wife is age 64 and infirm and he is infirm laboring under a rupture. Affidavits included of Joseph **HARDEE**

Averilli HARDEE
Thomas WALLACE

Affidavit January 6, 1844 of Nancy HARDEE, age 88 on 2nd May last, the widow of William HARDEE.

She says she married in Pitt County on April 2, 1776 to William HARDEE. He died August 18, 1827. He served in the army 3 months after marriage. They moved to Horry District, South Carolina in 1805.

Affidavit January 1, 1844 of Andrew HARDEE, age 67, brother of William HARDEE.

He says that William and Nancy and William's oldest children were all born in N.C. One child was born on the day of **GATES** Defeat. One child is the wife of a clergyman and lives in their neighborhood.

Affidavit January 14, 1822 of Philip CAUSEY of Horry District, South Carolina. He says William HARDEE served in Revolution.

Affidavit October 30, 1821 of Thomas WALLACE of Horry District, South Carolina. He says William HARDEE served in Revolution.

Affidavit March 13, 1819 of Averilla **HARDEE**, mother of William **HARDEE**, the soldier. She says he enlisted in the 5th NC Regiment.

Affidavit June 15, 1844 of Mrs. Elizabeth MILLS, of Pike Co. Alabama. She says she saw William HARDY and Nancy STOCKS married on April 2, 1776.

Affidavit August 6, 1844 of Mrs. Elizabeth MILLS, of Pike County, Ala. She says she was born and raised and married in Pitt County, N.C. and a short time after marriage moved to Horry District, S.C. She lived there until about 1836 when she moved to Pike County, Ala. She attended Good Hope Baptist Church in Horry District.

William **HARDEE** of Horry County, S.C. Private in Col. **BUNCOMBE'S** NC Line for one year 1776 On rolls of South Carolina April 4, 1821 Widow's pension of \$40.00 per year starting March 4, 1843.

Affidavit April 12, 1844 of Peter VAUCHT.

He says William **HARDEE** and Nancy lived in Pitt County, N. C. and moved to S. C. and settled in this district near **VAUCHT'S** father. He says William **HARDY** and wife had a large family of children and from their ages must have been married during the Revolutionary War.

Affidavit April 10, 1844 of Reverend John LEE.

He says William HARDEE moved there in 1806. LEE kept a schoohouse near William HARDEE and HARDEE brought to him a book containing the ages of his children, which was old and dim and requested him to copy the ages into another book. When LEE mentioned one of HARDEE'S daughters names, HARDEE observed to his wife that she was born the day of GATES Defeat. LEE says William HARDEE died August 18, 1827.

Affidavit January 6, 1844 of Amy HARRIS, daughter of William HARDEE She says Nancy HARDEE was age 64 in August last.

Affidavit April 4, 1821 of Thomas WALLACE, of Horry District, S. C. He says he served in same regiment as William HARDEE for 12 months.

SON SHOOTS FATHER (Daily Reflector May 10, 1909)

N. L. GRAY Badly Wounded by His Son "Bud" GRAY

On Sunday the colored people had a quarterly meeting at their church, Post Oak, in Carolina Township, and a large number of their race were in attendance. A young white man, "Bud" GRAY went out to this meeting. His father, Mr. N. L. GRAY. learning that the young man had gone there, went after him and reprimanded him for being there, and also accused him of going for the purpose of selling liquor to the colored people. Young GRAY resented the interference of his father and cursed the latter for accusing him of selling liquor, whereupon his father slapped him. This angered the young man more and he left the place and went home for a gun. On his way back with the weapon he met his father in front of the latter's home and shot him at close range in the bowels with a load of bird shot. The elder Mr. GRAY was struck with about 80 shots ranging from his waist line downward. From last account today he was resting as comfortably as could be expected.

A small son of Mr. GRAY who was near the scene was also struck by some of the stray shot.



Abstracts of Supreme Court Cases

The following are abstracts from NC Supreme Court Cases, located in the search room at the NC State Archives. These records are not indexed.

[Fred JOHNSON, Jr. vs. David CHAPMAN] 1853 —— Craven County #5888

> Frederick JOHNSON, Sr., of Craven County made his Will June 6, 1818. He devised to his wife Penelope and to his 2 daughters: Sarah JOHNSON (md.1st Hilan GODLEY and 2nd to Joseph G. GODLEY), and Mary JOHNSON (md. 1st to Benjamin GODLEY and 2nd to Frederick BRYAN).

> Frederick JOHNSON, Sr., died in March 1819 and his will was proved in June 1819, David CHAPMAN and William HARDY, executors.

> Frederick JOHNSON, Sr., had a son, Frederick JOHNSON, Jr., who was born a few months after his death. After the death of Frederick JOHNSON, Sr., his widow Penelope remarried to Stephen CHAPMAN. Stephen CHAPMAN after marriage carried Frederick JOHNSON, Jr., to Tennessee with him and claimed him as his son and Fred JOHNSON, Jr., went by the name Fred CHAPMAN.

Frederick JOHNSON, Jr., was born in April or May 1819 and came of age in April or May 1840.

Frederick JOHNSON, Sr., as well as the family and neighborhood, knew that Penelope had an adulterous relationship with Stephen CHAPMAN and they had the child now called Frederick JOHNSON, Jr.

Frederick CHAPMAN, alias Frederick JOHNSON, Jr., had been poor since birth. Stephen CHAPMAN died intestate in Tennessee. Frederick CHAPMAN came back to N.C. from Tennessee in Sept. 1832. Frederick CHAPMAN married and had 6 children.

Pitt County marriage bond, Feb. 28, 1839, between Frederick CHAPMAN and Sally WHITE.

Frederick JOHNSON, Sr., married Penelope HARDY. Mary JOHNSON married first to Benjamin GODLEY and second in 1835 to Frederick BRYAN.

Johnson BRYAN was uncle of Frederick BRYAN.

Hannah SMITH was sister of Frederick JOHNSON, Sr.

Argent ADAMS was sister of Stephen CHAPMAN.

Esther CHAPMAN was mother of Stephen CHAPMAN.

Furnifold CHAPMAN was brother of David CHAPMAN.

Benjamin GODLEY was the son of Robert GODLEY.

Hilan GODLEY was the son of Robert GODLEY. Henry HARDING became administrator of Hilan's estate in 1836.

John GALLOWAY bought the slave Ezekiel and carried him to Tennessee.

Joseph G. GODLEY died insolvent.

After Frederick CHAPMAN came back from Tennessee, he began using the name Frederick JOHNSON, Jr., to get a share of the estate of Frederick JOHNSON, Sr.

[Alice HAMILTON, extrx of F. HAMILTON vs. James SHEPPERD] 1818 —— Wayne #525 County

A Deed on June 4, 1806 from Oliver SMITH of Pitt County to Ferdinand HAMILTON of Jackson County, Tenn. for \$520.00 for Oliver SMITH'S interest in a land warrant transferred to Nancy SHEPPARD of 640 acres. Warrant #1721 in Secretary of State Office in North Carolina.

Oliver SMITH married Jan. 24, 1786 to Nancy SHEPPARD. Oliver SMITH died Aug. 1807. This suit commenced in Nov. 1811 for fraud since Oliver and Nancy SMITH sold the same warrant on Jan. 25, 1798 to John Gray BLOUNT.

#301 [BENTLEY vs. FORBES] no date —— Pitt County

Luke BENTLEY, Whitney NICHOLS and wife Mary, Ben BENTLEY (admin. of Elizabeth BENTLEY), John BENTLEY, Mark BENTLEY, Matthew BENTLEY versus

Benjamin FORBES, Robert R. GWALTNEY and wife Polly, William ROUNTREE and wife Sally, Honour BARROW.

Tapley BENTLEY (died Pitt County Sept. 1796) married Elizabeth _____ (died June 1, 1797).

Tapley was poor and had little property, a few cattle, hogs and two horses at his death. He left five small children:

- 1) Luke BENTLEY
- 2) Mary BENTLEY md. age 20 to Whitney NICHOLS
- 3) John BENTLEY (died 1811)
- 4) Mark BENTLEY (died Aug. 1804)
- 5) Matthew BENTLEY (died under age 21)

Thomas BENTLEY'S mother (also the mother of Tapley BENTLEY) stayed with the children for one year after the death of Tapley. He left provision for the childrens' support.

Benjamin BARROW clothed and boarded the five children of Tapley BENTLEY for 18 months and he had a great deal of trouble with them. After that, two died and two, John and Mary (Polly) BENTLEY, were bound out apprentice.

Amy HANDCOCK took in Mark BENTLEY and he died at her house and was buried there.

John BENTLEY was apprenticed by Benjamin BARROW to Richard BALDREE at age 6 or 7. John BENTLEY died at house of Richard BALDREE at age 13 or 14.

Mrs. Mathiah BRILEY kept Polly BENTLEY. William NICHOLS says Mary (Polly) BENTLEY was no older than 20 when she married Whitney NICHOLS.

The Will of Tapley BENTLEY was proved by Benjamin BARROW, executor. The childrens' grandmother stayed with the children until the day of the estate sale. Then John BENTLEY took the two smallest children and old Benjamin BARROW took the rest of the children. After 18 months, John BENTLEY broke up house and moved to the southward. He took the two smallest children to Mr. BARROW. John BENTLEY was paid \$60.00 at Holland JOHNSON's Shop for keeping the two children. While at BARROWS, Mark and Luke BENTLEY ran away together, but Luke returned.

Honour married Benjamin BARROW (he died 1808) and she remarried and removed to Tennessee.

The Will of Benjamin BARROW of Pitt County was dated Sept. 5, 1807 and probated August term 1808. He left legacies to wife Honor; grandson Benjamin FORBES; grand-daughters Polly and Sally FORBES.

Polly FORBES married Robert R. GWALTNEY.

Sally FORBES married William ROUNTREE (died by Dec. 1827)

Benjamin FORBES removed out of state.

In October term 1836, Martin County Court, Administration of the estate of Hillary WHITEHURST was granted to Thomas HOWELL. Also the guardianship of Hillary's infant child, Mary E. WHITEHURST.

Hillary WHITEHURST died owning land in Martin County adjacent to the lands of John PHILPOT, Thomas HOWELL, and the heirs of Kenneth HYMAN.

The other child of Hillary WHITEHURST was John H. WHITEHURST, who was born between Oct. Court 1836 and before the petition of sale of land at January term 1837. At January Court 1837, HOWELL petitioned the court to sell Hillary WHITEHURST's land. He sold it at public sale and gave Sarah MANNING a deed for it.

In 1856, MANNING owned no title and the deed conveyed no title. Fred J. BRYAN and wife Mary Jane BRYAN and John H. WHITEHURST, infant under 21, by his guardian John WHITEHURST, sued to gain title.

PECULIAR DEATHS: TWO LADIES DIE WHILE VISITING A SICK SISTER. (Eastern Reflector, Apr. 18, 1896)

The REFLECTOR learns of two strange deaths that recently occurred in Bethel township. About three weeks ago Miss Chrissie CARSON went to visit her niece, Mrs. M. A. JAMES, near Conetoe, and while there was taken sick with fever. A week later her sister, Miss Bedie CARSON, went to Mr. JAMES' to see her. Not long after reaching there she was sitting in a chair talking with the family, when she was suddenly seized with some trouble and died in a few minutes, as was told a few days later by our Bethel correspondent. Miss Chrissie CARSON's sickness continued and on last Saturday another sisier, Mrs. Theophilus BARNHILL, went to Mr. JAMES' to see her. Mrs. BARNHILL sat up with the family until bed time and retire. Next morning she was found dead in bed. She showed no signs of sickness the night before.



JONES & Jemima his wife, Elizabeth SMITH, and John WINGATE & Frances his wife, shewing that Abraham SMITH late of Pitt County died in the year 1818 seized & possessed in fee simple of the following tracts of land—Viz One tract whereon he resided estimated to contain 73 acres—One piece adjoining the last granted by the State to Abraham SMITH containing 70 acres—One piece called the Joseph VENTERS place containing 150 acres—One piece adjoining the VENTERS land containing 130 [?] acres—One piece called the TAYLOR place bought of Joseph TOOKE by Abraham SMITH estimated to contain 400 acres—One piece adjoining the TAYLOR place bought by Abraham SMITH of Edward GATLIN estimated to contain 200 acres—Said Abraham SMITH left a last will & testament but not being executed as by law wills are required to be executed to pass lands, the sd. lands descended to the children and heirs at law of the said SMITH—Viz your Petitioners Sarah, Mary, Jemima, Elizabeth, Frances & to James SMITH & William SMITH—&c.

These are therefore to command you to lay off and allot to each of the above named petitioners his & her share of the aforesaid lands, in severalty—

And return you at our Court to be helf for the County aforesaid on the first Monday in August next, Under your hands & seals, what you have done in this behalf

A GOOD WOMAN GONE. (Daily Reflector; June 4, 1906)

Mrs. Isabella MOORE, widow of James Spencer MOORE, died at her home in Pactolus township the 28th day of May, 1906, aged about 84 years. She was born in 1822, and was married in 1835, and was the mother of twelve children, G. L. MOORE, L. C. MOORE, Z. L. MOORE, Mrs. David HYMAN and Mrs. J. J. FLEMING, of Pactolus, Mrs. B. H. HEARNE, of Greenville, G. C. MOORE, Zeno MOORE, Miss Melissa MOORE, Miss Jacky MOORE and Miss Ellen MOORE of Whitakers, N. C., and McG. MOORE, who was wounded and captured at Fort Harrison in 1864, and died of wounds in Prison.

Mrs. MOORE was indeed a good woman, up to the close of the civil war she was surrounded by considerable wealth and her charity to the poor was unbounded. She united with the Primative Baptist church many years ago, and was a consistent member up to the time of her death. Her church life was truly beautiful. For the last few years of her life she was feeble and bent with age, but the warm grasp of her hand, and her cheerful voice will long be remmebered by the members of her church and the public generally. — A FRIEND.



A SAD DEATH.

(Eastern Reflector; Sept. 17, 1901)

Mr. J. P. MANNING, who was accidentally hurt while in bathing in Grindle creek on Aug. 7th, 1901, from which he became paralyzed, died Sept. 5th in the hospital at Tarboro. Everything that was possible was done for him by the physicians of this section. He was taken to John Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore where it was found no relief could be given him, when he was brought back home and placed in the hospital at Tarboro. His father attended him faithfully there until the end.

Few young men raised in Pitt county started out in life with brighter prospects than the subject of this sketch. He was raised in Bethel township where he lived until the age of twenty-one when with his older brother, W. J. MANNING, he purchased the Edgar BUCK farm, three miles from Greenville, and resided there until he met the terrible accident which cost him his life. The death of this young man, who was cut down just as he was entering the prime of life has cast a gloom over his friends and the community.

He was 24 years old and a son of J. L. G. MANNING, Esq., of Bethel township. The father, a sister and three brothers survive him, and they have the sincere sympathy of a large circle of friends in the untimely death of their loved one. He will be missed by friends and associates as few young men of his age are missed. — J.



A VETERAN DEAD.

Thursday afternoon Mr. G. S. JOHNSON died suddenly at the home of his son near Grimesland. He was 68 years of age and leaves a wife and six children. He was a member of the Free Will Baptist church.

Swift Creet also lost another highly respected citizen in the death of Mr. Theophiles BLAND, sr. the 1st of November, Mr. BLAND was 82 years old. He had lived to see his eight sons and five daughters all grown and married. He was a good neighbor and a lose to his community. He was a member of the

Disciples.

Swift Creek has other men who have passed many years. A very few more years will make one a centenarian and it the wish of his many friends that he may be spared ever more and that the others may be likeness blest.



R. A. WILLOUGHBY

Died February 26th — A Short Sketch of His Life. (Daily Reflector; Mar. 25, 1910)

He was born in what is now Beaver Dam township, Pitt county, Feb. 16th 1835, and was raised on the farm on which he died. Not knowing much about his boyhood life I will say nothing of that, but after he grew to manhood I moved in his neighborhood and he and I became very intimate friends and remained so until his death. He took up the carpenter's trade and carried on his farm also. He was very industrious and ingenious. He joined the Confederate army Sept. 1862 in Co. G., 8th NC Regt. under Capt. E. C. YELLOWLEY and made one of the very best soliders, remaining in the war until it ended. He was taken prisoner at Cole Harbor June 2nd, 1864, and remained in prison until Feb. 1865.

Some time after the close of the war he put up a work shop at Rochdale and did much repair work, and was the coffin builder of the community. The writer was often called on to help make coffins. He has with my help made many on Sundays. He was so good and kind that he would often let the work go without the cash and in many cases, yes, very many, he failed to get his pay. So he gave away consid-

erable of his labor.

Mr. WILLOUGHBY was married in 1867 to Miss Caroline F. COBB, daughter of the late J. C. COBB, and had five children born unto him, four of whom are now living. J. H. and B. P. WILLOUGHBY, Mrs. C. D. SMITH and Mrs. C. L. TYSON. His first wife died in June 1879, and he remained a widower for a year or two, and finding that it was not good to be alone he married Miss Christiana CRAWFORD in 1881 and had three other children born unto him, two of whom are now living, R. E. WILLOUGHBY and Mrs. C. E. MCLAWHORN.

Mr. Willoughby was a very good and kind neighbor and one of the best citizens. He was a hard worker, and worked as long as he was able and then he stayed around the house and did many little jobs that some of the hands would had to have done. He was one of five of we old soldiers that lived on the same road and the two farthest apart not more than one and a half miles. They were E. S. PARKER, B. F. CRAWFORD, Joab TYSON, R. A. WILLOUGHBY and T. E. LITTLE. Mr. WILLOUGHBY like the writer, never failed to attend the old soldiers' reunion as long as he was able to be present.

When Mr. WILLOUGHBLY was taken sick his friends, who were very many, paid all the attention

to him that friends could, and there was nothing left undone.

He lay speechless for about a week from the time he was first taken on the 16th of February, 1910, and passed quietly away February 26th, at the age of 75 years and ten days.

I have written the above sketch very briefly and have left out much that might have been said, but decided to let this suffice. — Thos. E. LITTLE.

Mrs. JENKINS was a member of the Christian church at Rountrees. She left seven children, W. I. and S. A. JENKINS, Mrs. J. S. HART, Mrs. FORREST, of Ayden, Mrs. Irvin JENKINS and R. F. JENKINS, of Grifton, T. A. NICHOLS, of Greenville. She lived to see her children all married and doing well, except R. F. JENKINS, who is still single.



MR. ALFRED JAMES DEAD. (Daily Reflector; June 15, 1908)

Mr. Alfred JAMES, one of the county's oldest citizens, died Thursday, June 11, at his home in Carolina township. In January he had a severe case of pneumonia, and had been confined to his bed ever since. Sometimes he could sit up for an hour but was never able to walk any more. He bore his suffereing with all patience, at first he was very anxious to get well and hoped to be able to walk by his 84th birthday, March 12th, but toward the last he was willing to die and said he was going to rest. We feel sure that he has gone there, still it was hard for the family to give him up.

He was a good neighbor, always doing something for his community never had a dispute or lawsuit with anybody. Was a true Christian, having belonged to the Primitive Baptist church at Flat Swamp for

29 years, and no man could be truer to his church.

He had been twice married, his last wife having preceded him into eternity by five years. One of his sons with his family has lived with him since her death. He was a native of Pitt county and served in the 17th N.C. regiment as a Confederate soldier, fighting in the battle of Seven Pines and with LEE in the battle of the Wilderness.

Eight children, fifty-six grand children, and thirty-five great-grand children, besides a host of friends, are left to mourn their loss, but their loss is his eternal gain.

The funeral services were conducted by Elders ROBERSON and LAWRENCE and the body was laid to rest in the family burying ground. — M.



MRS. M. A. HOYT (Eastern Reflector; Sept. 25, 1889)

Mrs. M. A. HOYT, who was the oldest white person in Greenville, and whose death we announced two weeks ago, was born September 9th 1804, on the old SIMPSON plantation, six miles below town, where her father, Mr. Joseph BRICKELL, then resided. Her death occurring on the 20th of September, 1889, made her age 85 years and 1 day. When she was three years old, her parents moved to Greenville

and the remainder of her life was spent here. On the 17th of November, 1841, when little more than 21 years of age, she was married to Mr. Gould HOYT, who was a native of New York, but had moved South and made Greenville his home. Mr. HOYT was one of the leading men here in his day, being for several years Clerk and Master in Equity of Pitt county. He also kept the hotel for a term of years and had the southern wing of the building added while in his hands. To this couple were born three children, all girls. One of them, the oldest, was married to Mr. William SHERROD, of Martin co., in 1842 in which county the remainder of her life was spent. The second daughter married Mr. A. W. MARSHAL, of Greenville. Later they moved to Georgia, then to Louisiana. After the death of her husband, Mrs. MARSHAL returned to Greenville and is now living here. The youngest daughter married Mr. J. J. DANCY in 1850 and that couple are still living in Greenville. Mrs. HOYT was left a widow in 1861, and the last years of her life were spent with her daughter, Mrs. DANCY. In 1841 she joined the M. E. Church, and many of our people know what a faithful member she was. Her remaining years were spent as a consistent Christian and she was devoted to her church. So long as health and strength permitted her seat in the church was never vacant when there was service. Some years ago when the congregation desired to build a new house of worship and at a location more convenient, Mrs. HOYT donated a part of her lot upon which to build it, but before the work commenced an opportunity was presented to secure a corner lot with parsonage attached, whereupon she permitted the lot donated by her to be sold and the proceeds applied to the purchase of the other site. While she was anxious to see a new church erected, we never will forget how much she loved that old building. When it was about to be torn down and removed this writer (who was christened by Mrs. HOYT) remembers to have published a poem concerning it, and was told by her that she preserved a copy and wept like a child every time she read the poem. The day following her death the remains of the excellent woman were carried to the old family burial ground near where she was born, and interred by the side of her husband.



WILLIAM ROBERT HORNE

Sketch of His Life by an Intimate Friend (Daily Reflector; Feb. 1, 1910)

William Robert HORNE was born in 1857. He came of sturdy old English stock on his paternal side. His great grand father, Jacob HORNE, came from East Virginia and settled where the city of Rocky Mount now stands, where his grand father, Henry HORNE, was born in 1805. He moved to Pitt county in 1827 where he married Eliza BON [BOND]. From this union Josiah Robert HORNE was born. Robert HORNE married Martha JOYNER, mother of Amos JOYNER, and to them two children were born, William and Eliza. His father having died before he was 8 years old he was raised by his uncle, Franklin JOYNER.

The writer had been closely associated with deceased all his life. He was my brother-in-law, cousin and my true friend. He was of that type of men known as country gentlemen, lived on his own soil, subsisting on the flesh of his own animals reared by him, and the fruits of his own field and garden. At his death he owned a large fertile farm, owned fine herds, had comfortable houses for his laborers and stables for his stock; plenty of turkeys and chickens and fruit for his family and all friends that came his way.

William R. HORNE married Florence EDWARDS in June, 1887. No children were born to them. She was one of those true and good helpmates and was as devoted to him as any wife the writer has ever known, nursing and cheering him 'till the summons came.

Bill HORNE, as he was familiarly known, was a lover of books and newspapers. He was the best posted country gentlemen to be found. His tact for reading with his wonderful memory and business judgment made his counsel sought after by the best men of his acquaintance. His good wife and aged mother, (the latter 76) two half sisters, Mrs. ASKEW and Mrs. POLLARD, of Farmville and a nephew, John TYSON, of Ensley, Ala., survive him.

This good and worthy man had for some months been suffering with bladder trouble. The best physicians were called to his bedside but nothing could be done to save him. On the 23rd day of Jan. 1910, his soul passed over the river to realms above, and on the 24th his ashes were laid to rest in the cemetery at Farmville. — G. T. TYSON.



MR. JESSE COX (Tarboro Southerner; Oct. 12, 1871)



1795 PITT COUNTY DIARY

Found in a garret in his later residence at Fort Barnwell, Craven Co., NC, it was presented to the North Carolina Archives in the 1880s. MORE THAN A CENTENARIAN

(Eastern Reflector, March 12, 1890)

Mr. Blaney BAKER, the oldest man in Pitt county, died at his home five miles from Greenville on the 27th day of February. Mr. BAKER leaves a record behind him that is remarkable. That he was far over a hundred years old is undeniable, and in all his career he never had a professional visit from a physician nor did he ever take a dose of medicine from one. He was a man of good, moral habits, peaceable and quiet. He was a lifelong Democrat and voted for every Democratic candidate for President from Jefferson down to Cleveland. As to his age two reports have come to us. One is from a man who has known Mr. BAKER for a number of years and says he claimed to have been born on the 2nd of March of the same year the Declaration of Independence was signed, 1776, which would have made him 114 years old lacking 3 days. This age is also accredited to him by some of the people of his neighborhood. But his Pastor, Rev. R. C. GLENN, (Mr. BAKER was a member of Tripp's Chapel Methodist Church and died in triumphant faith) tells us that Mr. BAKER told him frequently that his mother used to say he was born on the 2nd day of March of the year the Revolutionary War closed. This war closed in 1782 (though the records show the treaty not to have been signed until 1783) which would make his age lack 3 days of 108 years. Mr. GLENN asked him over about this on several occasions and found his mind to be very clear upon the subject, his answer everytime the same. So we can say with all saftly that he was at least 108 years old, while by many he is believed to have been 114. Mr. BAKER was a man of wonderful vigor. Up to five years ago he was able to perform his task with a grub hoe. To within a day or two of his death, his mind was clear and strong showing remarkable preservation for a man of his extreme age.

DIED

(King's Weekly, Oct 19, 1897, Friday)

Cornelius KINSAULS, Greenville's oldest citizen, died at home here Monday morning. Old age was the primary cause of his death. No one spoke of him but as one the best citizens Greenville ever had. Everybody like him. He was buried Monday evening from the Methodist church, Rev. Mr. WATSON conducting the funeral. He leaves, but one relative, his son W. M. KINSAUL. His age is given as 81 years last February, but on his last birthday he told this writer that he was born in 1817. Greenville was his birthplace and with the exception of a few years which he spent on his farm in

Scuffleton 11th of April 1849

Dear Sister,

I write to you for the first time. Mother and family is well. Brother Jonathan and his family are well. Jarusha and Zilpha ROUNTRE was up to Joseph MURPHEY on the 7th of April they were all wel. Siser Apsley and family is wel. Charles ROGERS and family is wel. Brother Warren is gorn South he Started the last of March. I was at Greenville and saw that Negro hung on the 6th of April. I was in ten steps of him he never Spoke so that I could hear him he talk Some to the preacher and got down on his nees and the preacher praid for him and the preacher bid him farewel by shakeing hands with him then he walk up on the galos. I heard from sister Zilpha they was all wel. I wil send thoes things down which you spoke of by the first opitunity I expect to com down after I get my crops planted if they come water enough. Nothing more at present but that I am your affectionate Brother.

Dear Daughter,

I recently received your communication and am sorry that an opportunity has not presented itself of my gratifying your request relative to the sending of your things to you; they are ready and will be transmitted the first opportunity. You will see some of your aquaintances from Green at the Convention and If not before I will try to send your things to you then. If you stand in need of anything and the circumstances are such that immediately require it, I want Miss Verina to procure it for you and she can be renumerated for the same. I would be very glad an opportunity would permit of my having the pleasure of seeing you and Frances but I do not anticipate anything of the kind for the distance is too far for me; and since you have left for the purpose of the improvement of your minds. I want you to disengage your minds an thoughts about home or things thereunto appertaining and prosecute with unabated diligence the object you had in view prior to your leaving. Knowing your studious habits I can take pleasure in advising and upon due reflection I have no doubt but what your views will coinside with mine for without application time may be wasted and money squandered. Literature not only elevates and expands the mind but makes it more scientific and leads to developements which the illiterate never can aspire to and is further a consolation under the most trying circumstances and is well calculated to eradicate and absolve the confused state the mind is often left in through ignorance. The aquisition of knowledge is one of the noblest and sublime undertakings and serves as a shied to virtue and a strong bulwark against the machinations of the seducer for its presense will dissipate his delusion.

There has been no very strange or commercal occurrences since you left. There has been some few marriages, Calvin RUFF and Cornelious KINSALLS were married lately to a couple of Isaaih JOYNER's daughters. Jethrew MURPHREY married Miss MUSHGRAVE, I believe her name was Elizabeth. —Nancy WARREN (Rich'd WARREN's wife) died the 21 inst and left a young child a son he wanted day of being a month old. So it is health and pleasure formed associations and matrimonial ties, yet the unwelcome messenger death disaoppoints and severs them. The health of the neighborhood so far as my knowledge extends is as good as usual. Absley P. ROUNTREE's Caleb SPIVEYs brother Jonathans and Charles ROGER's family were enjoying as good health as usual when heard from last. —Jerusha sewed your flower seed and the cold weather destroyed them and said if you could get any in newbern time enough

to sow send them up and she would try her luck again. You must give my respects to Miss Verina and in your next I want her to write to me how you are getting along with your studies. Warren has written since he left, he was in Montgomery, Ala, he was well at the time he wrote. There was a man killed in Pitt the lower close to Beaufort County line. I understand he has been committed to Beaufort Gaol. I want you to direct your letters Scuffleton instead of Hookerton.

My family are in tolerable good health at present and home [hope?] when this you receive you will be enjoying a reasonable portion of the same blessing. Jerusha and Frances send their love to you

both.

NARROW ESCAPE. YOUNG LADY CAUGHT IN BUGGY WHEEL

(Eastern Reflector, Sept. 12, 1899)

Wednesday night there were services at Reedy Branch church, about six miles from town. Several members of the family of Mr. J. W. SMITH, Superintendent of the County Home, were in attendance, and returning home two of his daughters and a young man named Will SERMONS were riding together. The mule they were driving run away and one wheel of the buggy run in a ditch. One of the young ladies, Miss Nannie, was thrown out of the buggy and fell in the ditch. Her head caught between the spokes of the wheel, and when the mule pulled the wheel out of the ditch the young lady was pulled out by the neck. She was badly bruised and skinned by the accident, and it is almost miraculous that she escaped being killed.

NARROW ESCAPE

(Eastern Reflector, June 16, 1897)

Mr. R. L. NICHOLS, of Beaver Dam township, tells us of a narrow escape his mother had a few days ago from serious if not fatal injury. Mrs. NICHOLS went to the well to draw a bucket of water. The bucket was fastened to an old fashioned sweep, and in lowering it the sweep broke, one end narrowly missing her head. Fortunately the falling sweep just grazed her left shoulder and arm and her injury was only slight. Had the sweep struck her on the head no doubt it would have killed her.

BITTEN BY A SPIDER

(Eastern Reflector, May 20, 1896, Wed.)

Wednesday afternoon Mr. Jesse TYSON, living about four miles from town, wanted to come to Greenville on business. He hitched up his horse to come and went in the house to put on his coat. As he started out again he remarked to his wife that something had bit him on the shoulder. He started on to town without thinking anything serious of it, but after coming about two miles began to feel sick and noticed that he was turning blind and dizzy. By the time he reached town he was suffering intensely and drove at once to the office of Dr. Zeno BROWN. The latter was in the country but his father, Dr. William BROWN, began treating Mr. TYSON until Dr. Zeno BROWN should return. The doctor tells us that Mr. TYSON was in a right bad condition, but is now improving and he hopes soon will be all right again. His suffering threw him into convulsions for a while. It is supposed that the trouble was caused by the bite of a spider that had taken refuge in Mr. TYSON's coat while it was hanging up in his house.

BADLY HURT

(Eastern Reflector, May 20, 1896, Wed.)

Monday afternoon a 10-year-old son of Mr. Marshal COX, of Chicod township, was driving a log cart. In some way the windlass that held up the log became unfastened and the lever flew over and struck the boy on the back. The boy was badly hurt and narrowly escaped being instantly killed.

(JAMES WILLIS BIBLE, con'd.)

Clark is a descendant of Benjamin Gwaltney, brother of Sarah Gwaltney Willis. The Bible passing to the Mitchell family is explained by the fact that Mary (Polly) Willis, daughter of Joshua Willis married Joshua Mitchell.

Since receiving this record I have done considerable research on the Delamar family. I am convinced, but lack conclusive proof, that Susannah Willis was the daughter of Francis Delamar Jr and his wife Susannha. Francis Jr made his will May 15 1739. He died in 1741 and his will mentions sons Francis and Thomas and later 'all my children.', indicating there were daughters. Francis Jr was the only son of Francis Sr and his first wife, Susannah Travis, widow of Daniel Travis. Francis Sr was a French Huguenot who came to the Panquotank area from France about 1686. Francis Sr died in 1713 during the Tuscarora Indian War, possibly a casualty of that war. He was one of the Justices of the Colonial Court."

Comment by Charles B. Schweizer:

"Mr Willis is deceased. I understand his family has the Bible in question. I am descended from Joel Willis Sr who is a proven Revolutionary War soldier. His father, James Willis, fought in the French and Indian War. . . . I am also a descendant of Robert Worthington born 23 Feb 1801 in North Carolina who married Holland and whose first child was Susan Marie Worthington born ca 1822 in North Carolina. . . . "

117 YEARS OLD

(King's Weekly, Oct. 7, 1898)

Fane TUCKER, a negro woman pauper, who lived at Mr. G. M. TUCKER's, died about two weeks ago, aged 117 years. There is no doubt about this. She was one year older than her Mistress, Mrs. Sara TUCKER, who died in 1873, aged ninety-one. This is well known in the TUCKER family. Again, Lem TEEL, Fane's brother who is in the poor house, is about 100 years old and he says his sister was grown the first he could remember of her.

I Dinah WHITEHURST of the County of Pitt and of the State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existance do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say

First That my executor hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts howsoever and to whomsoever owing out of the money that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of Item. I will that the balance of my property consisting of land and negroes hereinafter my estate. named and all of my other property both personal and domestic be equally divided amongst my children and my grandchildren that are now living to their representation with exception hereinafter mentioned to wit.-

my land whereon I now live and all and every tract of land now belonging to me, and all of my negroes namely Susan, Elizabeth, Hary Mahaly, Esther, Charity, Jom [Jam?], Sarah, Orrange, Areny, Winsor, Peny and all of the increase of negroes and Stock at my death, to be as aforesaid equally divided as follows. Namely My son Reuben WHITEHURST to have one share to hime and his heirs forever with this exception that is one note that I now hold against him amt. at this time to \$48.44 to be paid over to the said Reuben as a part of his share. Item. I will to my son William WHITEHURST one equal share to him and his heirs forever. Item. I will to son James WHITEHURST one equal share to him and his heirs forever

Item. I will to my son John WHITEHURST one equal share to him and his heirs forever. Item. I will to my daughter Elizabeth BARNHILL one equal share to her and her heirs forever. Item. I will that my daughter Dicy HATHAWAY shall have two notes that I now hold against Sampson HATHAWAY amt. at this time to thirty three Dollars and thirty nine cts and five Dollars in money. Item I Will that the children of Dicy HATHAWAY lawfully begotton of her body shall have one share in proportion to the foregoing items with this exception that is to be deducted out the amt. that I give to Dicy HATHAWAY to them and their heirs forever

Item I will that my Granchild Jesse BARNHILL share equal to the foregoing items to him and his heirs forever

Item I will that my Grandchildren Mary Jane WHITEHURST and John H. WHITEHURST shall have one share in proportion to the before mentioned items to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I will that my grandchildren Bery A. HOUSE and James W. J. HOUSE shall have one share in proportion to the foregoing items to them and their heirs forever.

Item I will that my granddaughter M. J. WHITEHURST shall have one third of my clothing And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my worthy sons William WHITEHURST & John WHITEHURST my lawful executors to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof herby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I the said Dinah WHITHURST do set my hand and seal this the 12th day of February A. D. 1847.

PITT COUNTY FAMILY

GWALTNEY FAMILY IN INDIANA

By Charles B. Schweizer, 2 Lakewood Drive, Glen Carbon, IL 62034.

My son's wife remarked, "There are a lot of Gwaltneys in Surry County Virginia." She should know since she is a Virginian. I am a descendant of Joel WILLIS, Sr., who married Sarah GWALTNEY, which is the reason for my interest in the Gwaltney family.

Two principal references to the Gwaltney family are "Gwaltney of Surry and Isle of Wight" by Boddie, published in Vol. II of Historical Southern Families in 1970, and #218 "Thomas Gwaltney and Descendants" published in Vol. I, 1984, of the Heritage of Craven County North Carolina. This article concerns John GWALTNEY whose family emigrated from North Carolina to Kentucky and then to Indiana in 1818.

A bit of background: I am a member of the Sons of the American Revolution and as such help many prospective applicants prepare their SAR membership applications. Not too long ago a man in Madison County, IL, called me, and in discussing his ancestors mentioned a Gwaltney. I never expected to hear of a Gwaltney descendant in Illinois because most North Carolinians had gone south to Georgia and beyond. It turned out a Gwaltney had moved to Indiana. Here is the story.

Thomas GWALTNEY, Jr., son of Thomas GWALTNEY, Sr., was born in Surry County, Virginia, and moved to present day Pitt County, North Carolina about 1737 where he died in June 1783. He married twice; his first wife was Mary GOODMAN by whom he had Thomas Gwaltney, III, and William Gwaltney (the elder) who married Lydia RIVES. Not much is known about Thomas III. William (the elder) and Lydia had William Gwaltney (the younger). Mary Goodman Gwaltney died and Thomas, Jr., married second Hannah, whose maiden name is unknown. Thomas Gwaltney, Jr., served on the Committee of Safety of Pitt County during the American Revolution and signed the Pitt County Resolves. As such, he qualifies as a Revolutionary War Patriot.

Thomas and Hannah GWALTNEY had four children: Sarah, who married Joel WILLIS, Sr., and is the writer's 5th great-grandmother; Rhoda, who married Jacob HICKMAN; John, who married Ann MURPHY; and Benjamin, who married Rachael GARRELL. This article concerns John and Anne (Murphy) Gwaltney.

John was born 25 Nov. 1765 in present day Pitt County and died in Posey County, Indiana, 8 Oct 1818. He married Anne MURPHY 12 Aug. 1789 in Pitt County. Anne was born 21 Feb 1771 or 1772 in Craven Co., NC, and died in Dec. 1827 in Posey County. In addition to acquiring much land in Indiana, John and Anne had nine children. These children were (1) Thomas, born 13 Dec. 1796 and died 7 Jul. 1873, who married Nancy REEDER 13 Nov. 1818 in Posey Co. She was born 13 Nov. 1818* in Kentucky. (2) John, born 15 Oct. 1798 and died 9 Nov. 1870, who married Mary "Polly" WILLIS 19 April 1827. (3) Benjamin, born 29 Oct. 1800 and died 30 Mar. 1886, who married Sarah MURPHY 13 Sep. 1821. (4) Harris, born 28 March 1802 and married Anna MURPHY 16 Jan. 1823. (5) Amariah, born 9 Feb. 1804 and died 7 Jul. 1848, who married Sarah REEDER 24 July 1828. (6) Elizabeth "Betsy," born 29 Jul. 1806 in Kentucky and died 8 Sep. 1825, who married Joseph CAMPBELL 8 Sep. 1825. (7) Frances "Fannie," born 24 Sep. 1809 in Muhlenburg Co., Kentucky, and died 3 Mar. 1894, who married James COX 9 Aug. 1832. (8) Adah, born 18 Jan. 1812; and (9) Cynthia, born 3 Dec. 1816, and married Thomas J. MITCHALL 31 Jan. 1833. Their descendants have populated southwestern Indiana and southeastern Illinois.

Mr. Henry R. GWALTNEY of Washington, Indiana, employed a professional genealogist in England to research the Gwaltney family in Europe. He determined the family could be traced back to Edward GWALCHMAI in 1681 in Wales. The earliest records of the family are believed to be in the township of Kevenkleisiog in Llanfihangel-yn-Ngwynfa in 1626 in Wales. Proof that John GWALTNEY moved to Posey Co., Indiana, is an indenture in Pitt Co., NC, Book CC, page 6, where Anne Gwaltney sold land to Amos EVANS.

*Nancy Reeder's birth date is in error; she was married on that date.
