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War of 1812 Pensions

The following are abstracts of pensions from the War of 1812, found at National Archives, Washington, DC.



RICHARD CARSON (#WO31289)

Richard CARSON was drafted in Greenville, NC, entering service as a Private in Capt. George EASON's Co. He served for 6 months, from Sept. 28, 1814 to March 22, 1815. He was discharged at New Bern, NC. He was married April 19, 1826 to Martha BAKER, at her father's house, by Sherrod TYSON. William J. BAKER and Willie WILLIAMS were at the marriage.

Deposition of Martha CARSON, age 44, dated March 4, 1851: She said that her husband died at the home of Joseph WYNN in Pitt County on Jan. 19, 1839.

Deposition of John SMITH, Jr., dated Nov. 4, 1851: He states he served in the War of 1812 with Richard CARSON in the same company.

CANNON CHANCE (#SO27739)

Deposition of Cannon CHANCE, age 86, dated Jan. 15, 1873, at Dallas, Paulding Co., GA.: Cannon CHANCE volunteered in Pitt County in Capt. Redding SHIPP's Co. of Infantry, from July 15 to Aug. 5, 1813. They marched to New Bern, NC, and there worked on a fort. From there they went to Beaufort, NC, where they were stationed for awhile and then went home. Cannon CHANCE drew a land warrant in 1855/1856 and sold it to Thomas CHANDLER of Carrollton, GA.

Cannon CHANCE married in 1808 in Pitt Co., NC, to Nancy McGOWAN. He lived in Carroll Co., GA, but the nearest post office was at Dallas, Paulding Co., GA.



JOHN M. BARNHILL (#WO36298)

John M. BARNHILL was drafted in Greenville, NC, in July or August 1814 for 6 months service in Capt. George EASON's Reg. of NC Detached Militia. He was discharged at New Bern, NC, March 27, 1815.

John M. BARNHILL married Harriett BRYAN in Pitt Co., NC, about 1852 or 1853, by Eason JAMES, JP. Witness to the marriage was Theophilus BARNHILL (also called Riley in several places). John M. BARNHILL died in 1863 or May 23, 1864, in Pitt County. Harriett BARNHILL died Nov. 1, 1886.

Deposition of Henry BARNHILL of Pitt Co., NC, Aug. 26, 1854: He states he was a member of the same company as John M. BARNHILL.



WILSON BALL (#205661)

He served in Capt. John COX's Co. of NC Militia, enlisting Sept. 28, 1814. He was discharged March 22, 1815.

Wilson BALL married in Dec. 1811 on Tranters Creek, Beaufort Co., NC, to Margaret PINKHAM. Wilson BALL died June 26, 1861, Tranters Creek, Beaufort Co., NC. Margaret BALL died about 1891.



CHERRY/CHENY BALL (#SO28552/WO42364)

He served in Capt. John COX's Co. of NC Militia, enlisting Sept. 28, 1814. He was discharged March 22, 1815. He served as a substitute for Charles H. MAUL.

Cherry BALL married Feb. 15, 1832, in Washington Township, Beaufort Co., NC, to Sally Ann (Sarah) FLOYD. Cherry BALL died on Aug. 26, 1882, in Beaufort Co., NC. Sarah Ann BALL died on Oct. 9, 1883, in Beaufort Co., NC.



WILLIAM E. EDWARDS (#WO38961)

William E. EDWARDS enlisted in New Bern, NC, as a private in Capt. John COX's Co. for 6 months. He enlisted about Oct. 15, 1812, and served to May 2, 1813. He was 5 ft., 9 or 10 inches tall, and had blue eyes and dark brown hair.

William E. EDWARDS married on March 16, 1811, in Chocowinity, Beaufort Co., NC, to Louisa EDWARDS, by Henry HARDING, IP. William E. EDWARDS died near Washington, NC, May 29, 1869. Louisa EDWARDS states her oldest child was a daughter born March 1812. Her fourth child was Mary N. EDWARDS who was born Sept. 15, 1815, and was still living in May 1880.

Deposition of Robert HILL, age 73 (would be age 74 on Nov. 30, 1880), dated May 6, 1880: He states he was a near neighbor of William E. EDWARDS and helped to make his coffin and bury him.



NOAH HARRIS (#WO6743)

Noah HARRIS was drafted for 6 months in August 1814 at the usual muster grounds at Greenville, NC, as a private in Capt. EASON's Co., 2nd NC Militia. He was discharged at Beaufort, NC, in March 1815.

Noah HARRIS married on April 6, 1810, to Hannah BRAXTON, at her father's, James BRAXTON, home in Pitt Co., NC, by Elder ALBERT, a Baptist preacher. Elsewhere in these papers it said they married at a church in Pitt Co. by Rev. Mr. HOWELL. Noah HARRIS and wife moved from Pitt County to Wayne Co., NC, about 1815. Hannah HARRIS was age 64 in 1845 and lived at Dudley's Depot, Wayne Co., NC. Noah HARRIS died Sept. 5, 1847, in Wayne Co., NC.

Deposition of Rev. Matthew MANNING and wife Elvy, of Wayne Co., NC, 1854: They stated they lived in the neighborhood of James BRAXTON in Pitt County and witnessed the wedding of Noah HARRIS and Hannah BRAXTON.

Deposition of Richard ROLLINS, April 18, 1854, Wayne Co., NC: He stated he served with Noah HARRIS at Beacon Island, NC.

MOSES HARRINGTON (#WO43008)

Moses HARRINGTON served in Capt. George EASON's Co., NC Militia, from April 28, 1814, to March 22, 1815.

Moses HARRINGTON married Sept. 15, 1833, in Pitt Co., NC, to Rhoda PAGE, by Frederick HAD-DOCK, JP. Moses HARRINGTON died Aug. 1, 1844, in Pitt County.

Rhoda HARRINGTON, age 81, of Idalia, Beaufort Co., NC, Sept. 1883: States she had not remarried since her marriage of Moses HARRINGTON. [Her application for pension was denied because she had lied about not remarrying.]

Deposition of Frederick HADDOCK, age 86, Greenville Post Office, Sept. 1883; Says the marriage bond of Moses HARRINGTON and Rhoda PAGE was dated Sept. 5, 1833.



WILLIAM KITTRELL (#WO35976)

William KITTRELL volunteered for war on July 20, 1812, in Kinston, NC. He served as a private in Capt. Francis KILPATRICK'S Co., 2nd NC Militia. He enlisted Nov. 7, 1812, at Beaufort, NC, for regular service under Capt. NIX. He was stationed at Ft. Hampton, NC, and afterwards marched to Ft. Hawkins and Ft. Gaines, GA. He died Jan. 18, 1814, at Ft. Claiborne, before his term of service expired.

WILLIAM KITTRELL was age 25 at enlistment, born in Lenoir Co., a farmer, about 5 ft. 10 inches tall, had brown hair, dark eyes and a light complexion.

William KITTRELL married April 15, 1812, in Lenoir Co., NC, to Chloe CLARK. Chloe KITTRELL was living in Pitt County 1853–1854. In 1879 she was living on the Pitt County line, Kinston Post Office route.

Deposition of Elizabeth BOND, age 78, and Tearcy PATE, age 65, of Lenoir Co., NC: They stated that they were present at William KITTRELL's wedding, and William KITTRELL was married at William MOORE's residence in Lenoir Co. by William BRANTLEY, JP.



ALLEN SMITH (#SO19451/WO44667)

Allen SMITH enlisted in New Bern, NC, about Sept. 17, 1814, as a private in Capt. Minor HUNTINGTON'S Co. of Craven County, 2nd Reg. Detached Militia under Lt. Col. Simon BRUTON. He was honorably discharged about March 10, 1815.

At enlistment, Allen SMITH was described as a farmer, born in Craven County, 5 ft. 10 inches tall, having dark hair, black eyes and a dark complexion. He was living at Swift Creek bridge in Craven County.

Allen SMITH married first in 1815 to Charity COX. He married second on May 2, 1840 [or June 21, 1841] to Rebecca SUTTON, by John CHAPMAN, JP. Allen SMITH moved from Craven Co., NC, to Sparta, White Co., Tennessee, where they stayed for 18 years and then moved to Barren Co., KY.

Allen SMITH died March 2, 1873, aged 76. [He had given conflicting information in his application for pension. He was later being confused with another Allen SMITH whose wife was named Rachel, of Pitt County, who also served in the same company.]

Deposition of Rebecca NICHOLS, age 65, of Munfordsville, Hart Co., Kentucky, Nov. 1887: She was former widow of Allen SMITH. [She gave conflicting information, and her pension application was rejected.] She had remarried to a Thomas NICHOLS, who was also dead by 1887.



CANNON SMITH

Cannon SMITH served as a private in Capt. Minor HUNTINGTON's Co., Craven Co. Detached Militia, in 1814. He served as a substitute for Samuel AVERY. He was discharged at Hanging Point, near New Bern, NC, March 28, 1815.

At enlistment, Cannon SMITH, age 24, was described as being a farmer, born in Pitt County, reared in Craven Co., 5 ft. 4 inches tall, having blue eyes, black hair and a dark complexion. After his discharge, he lived in Tennessee for one year and the rest of his life in Craven County.

Cannon SMITH married first in 1832 to Mary JONES (who died May 4, 1857). He married second on Nov. 24, 1858, in Jones Co., NC, to Susan KOONCE, at Calvin KOONCE's, JP. Cannon SMITH died March 11, 1869, near New Bern, NC. Susan SMITH lived on Batchelors Creek, Craven County, where she died in June 1895 after being bedridden the last year of her life.

Cannon and Susan SMITH had a daughter, Linda WEEKS, who lived at Tuscarora, Craven Co., in 1895.

[Editor's Note: It is not our habit to interpret records, but the researcher is encouraged to consult the John A. CLARK, Jr., Papers, ECU Manu. Coll. #427.4.j, Joyner Library, ECU. These papers provide Bible evidence that Cannon SMITH was married 3 times—first to Anna MORRIS on Dec. 12, 1817.]



CANNON STOCKS

Cannon STOCKS enlisted for war about May 10, 1812, at Greenville, NC, in Capt. Redding SHIPP's Co., Col. Simon BRUTON's 2nd Regiment, 1st Brigade, BROWN's Division, for 6 months. He served at New Bern, NC, for 2 weeks and spent the rest of the time at Beaufort, NC. He was honorably discharged at Beaufort, NC, on Dec. 1, 1812.

At enlistment, Cannon STOCKS, age 25, was described as being born in Pitt County, having blue eyes, sandy hair, and a light complexion.

Cannon STOCKS married first in 1836 to Elizabeth HATHAWAY (who died in 1860). He married second on April 7, 1871, in Swift Creek Twsp., Pitt Co., to Mrs. Elizabeth BOYD COX, by Rev. C. C. BLAND.

Elizabeth BOYD COX was the widow of Dennis COX. She was born in July 1835 near Tarboro, Edgecombe Co., NC. Cannon STOCKS died April 15, 1881, at Johnson's Mill's, Swift Creek Twsp., Pitt County. Elizabeth STOCKS was still living in Oct. 1916 near LaGrange, Lenoir Co., NC.

Deposition of D. H. SMITH, age 54, and C. S. SMITH, age 21, of Pitt County, dated Dec. 16, 1881: They stated they were present at the marriage of Cannon STOCKS and Elizabeth BOYD.

THE MATTHEW HART CARR BIBLE

Records from Lula Carr Payne

Her grandson, Carr Payne, Jr. lives (in 1994) in Atlanta where he has retired from teaching at Georgia Tech. Carr said his grandmother was fairly old when she put the Carr information together and it is not organized. Carr said his grandmother was raised where the Dupont plant is now in Kinston. Her father was much older than her mother. Her papers give no indication where she got the information regarding Matthew's wife's name and the names of their children or what her source was for stating that Lawrence P. was the son of Matthew. According to Carr Payne, Lula's grandmother Carr was very elderly when she died and she gave this information to Lula. This would make it far enough back where the grandmother would probably remember family members herself.

Most of the information in her notes have been incorporated into the "Lines" section as they just regard the descendants of Matthew Hart Carr.

Below is what came from the Matthew Hart Carr Bible. The original whereabouts is unknown at this time as the person who was supposed to have it can not be traced.

Last Will and Testament of Geo. S. Wallace decd.

State of North Carolina Pitt County

In the name of God Amen. I George S. WALLACE of the Same State and County aforesaid being in a low state of health but of sound mind and memory do hereby make and constitute this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Viz:

I hereby lend to my beloved wife Jane WALLACE during her life or widowhood all my lands on the north West side of the the Road except one hundred and ten yards breadth down near joining the Bran Lot then to run a stright line so as to hit the Road one hundred and ten yards distance adjoining Warren WALLACE's land, also one negro boy hand Joshua and one negro Woman Hetty, one mare a bay two beds steads and furniture one table her choice also for my said said wife to have the privilege of fire wood and lightwood and also the privilege of Rail Timber of the short leaf pine to fence her land and it is also my desire that my executors have my said wife part of said land well fenced and the old hedge roe grubbed up to set the fence on and that my said wife have one years provisions allowed her out of my estate.

I give and bequeath to my Son Warren WALLACE the peace of land as above described of one hundred and ten yards as above described for him to take in possession at my death to him and his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my Son George W. WALLACE the residue of lands not yet disposed of on the proviso of his advancing and paying to Wealthy HARRELL to her only or her children the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars as she may most stand in need, then my said son Geo. W. Wallace to have to him his heirs and assigns forever

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Willie WALLACE the Sum of thirty dollars to be raised out of my estate and all the property I have heretofore put him in possession of to him his heirs and assigns forever.

I also give to my grand daughter Lucinda MOORING thirty dollars money. Item.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Welthy HARRELL the sum of one hundred and Item. twenty dollars as I have provision for in consideration of giving my lands as above to W. WALLACE.

My desire further that my grand daughter Martha Jane & Churchill PATRICK my Grand children have fifty dollars laid out to them for schooling and also for my Grand son Churchwill PATRICK to have the land that I have loaned to my wife after her death then to him his heirs and assigns forever.

My will and desire is further that my executors should cause to be sold the residue of my property not yet disposed off as the law directs and the money arising thereform to first pay all my just debts and such legacies as I have devised and then equally divide the residue of such remainder between my sons and daughters now living and after the death of my wife what she may have that I have lent her be divided as above.

And finally I do nominate constitute and appoint my two Sons Warren & G. W. WALLACE Executors to this my last Will and testament whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12th day of April A. D. 1836

REV. WAR PENSION OF REUBEN GURGANUS

From Revolutionary War Pension of Reuben Gurganus, #\$8638, National Archives.



Reuben GURGANUS of Pitt Co., NC was a private in Capt. CHILDS' Co., Gen. CASWELL's Regiment of the NC Line for 12 months. He received a pension of \$40.00 per year starting March 4, 1831. Pension certificate issued May 28, 1836 & sent to J. R. HOYLE, Postmaster at Greenville, NC.

DEPOSITION of Reuben GURGANUS, age 71, a resident of Pitt Co., before the Justices of Pleas and Quarter Sessions of Pitt Co., May 9, 1833 [abstracted]:

He was born in Pitt County in 1762 and has no record of his age. He was living in Pitt Co. when he was called into service and lived in Pitt Co. after the war. He volunteered in May 1778 in the 10th Regiment commanded by Col. HOGAN and Capt. CHILDS and was marched north through Philadelphia to West Point where he remained seven months. From West Point he marched to Philadelphia where he stayed a short time and was put on a vessel which sailed and landed at Suffolk, Va. . . . From there he marched to Halifax, NC, where he was discharged after nine months.

Reuben volunteered again in May 1780 in the militia service under Capt. Samuel DUDLEY in the Regiment commanded by Gen. CASWELL. He marched to Kinston, NC, where he remained two months and then marched to Cross Creek and then on to Charleston, SC. Before arriving at Charleston, that city was taken by the British and they marched back to Cross Creek, at which place he was discharged after six months.

Reuben states he was well acquainted with Capt. Reading BLOUNT and Major HOGG and that he recovered a discharge from Capt. McNEATH, which has since been lost.

Reuben GURGANUS stated he sent David PERKINS his discharge that he received from Capt. McNEATH, to draw his wages and PERKINS never returned it. GURGANUS lost the other discharge signed by Capt. Samuel DUDLEY.

He states he knows GURGANUS served in militia service in Revolutionary War and that KEEL returned with said GURGANUS at Cross Creek, Cumberland Co., NC.

Mr. Fred OLDS Raleigh, N.C. Dear Sir;

I hope that you will not think me a nuisance, but I have been told that you have the care of records and are most kind about giving information. At any rate if you cannot tell me what I wish to find out, will you please just write and tell me so, as uncertainty is the hardest thing to stand. What I wish to know is the given, or Christian name, of my great-great grandfather LESLIE, father of my great grandfather William LESLIE (Lefslie, as he signed it) of Pitt Co. This William lived at Greenville on the Tar River, had a brother John (who never married), and two sisters Grizel and Apsley, and my grandmother Emelie LESLIE born Oct. 12th 1797 was his only child. He having died in April or spring 1798, at Washington N. C. of smallpox contracted in N. Y. where he nursed a friend, who recovered. He had only gotten that far on his return journey, and was at the house of an uncle there. His mother was a widow KENNEDY (nee HOLLAND) and his father John or James LESLIE, whose parents were John and Grizel LESLIE (nee HUME) of Edinburgh Scotland. His wife was Ann MOYE, also of Greenville, a daughter of John and Patience (nee CHERRY?) MOYE. William was a planter and merchant of Greenville. He had two half brothers John and William KENNEDY, and a half sister Grizel KENNEDY who married a Mr. Thomas HANRAHAN, who lived in Washington, N. C. This is the tradition, but would they have been his uncles? Wills must show this, as names of children are given. If uncles there is another generation of LESLIEs in the line in N. C. There is a John LESLIE in Greenvill, mentioned in several places in "Sketches of Pitt Co.," by King, who was an adjutant in the Pitt Co. Militia just before the battle of Alamance, in whose house court was held while the Court House was being removed after the Co. was cut from Beaufort. Greenville was called Martinborough (I am almost certain that he was the father of WIlliam). He was on important committees also, and seemed to be a man of influence. If not it might have been a James LESLIE of Halifax, who was in the Committee of Safety. If you will help me to find out this I shall be so much indebted to you. I would like to know on which side they were in the "Revolutionary War." I know the LESLIE family record in Scotland, have sent to Edinburgh for books, which I have, but want the N. C. line completed. I have read that many of the Scotch had taken the Oath of Allegiance to the king before coming to this country, so took no part in the war. I am not trying to join any society (can do that through lines here) only wish a complete record, but if either John or James is William's father, I could join "Colonial Dames through my LESLIE line in which I take particular interest, on account of my name, Emelie Leslie for grandma, who was brought here when three years old by her mothers stepfather, Mr. Thomas DYER, of Rhode Island. Did the LESLIE's come with the Arron on Black River Colony of Scotch, or at what date did they arrive, and where settle first? Now I wish facts complimentary, or otherwise, please, but of course prefer the former, and have no reason to expect them to be adverse.

Hoping very much to hear favorable from you before long.

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
