


WHAT IS A SPECIAL GIFT?

WHAT ARE SOME RECENT SPECIAL GIFTS?

The Bingham House, a temporary home for furloughing or returned missionaries and for other mission needs.

The Memorial Prayer Garden.

Beautification of the grounds of the church property.

A playground for small children.

New equipment for educational and recreational needs.

Renovation of the Church Parlor and the Recreation Room.

Purchase and display of flags of nations where there is Southern Baptist mission work.

WHERE ARE SPECIAL GIFTS NEEDED?


1. Contributions to the general budget of the church can be designated for current programs and projects. Such gifts could expand funds already allocated for:

Sunday School. New equipment, furnishings and instructional materials would be greatly appreciated.

Library. A good collection of books and other learning resources cannot remain stagnant. It is necessary to work constantly to replenish, discard, or enlarge the collection so that materials are available when needed.

Missions. In addition to gifts to the regular special missions offerings, financial assistance is needed for our members who are more and more frequently taking part in mission trips both at home and abroad.

Worship. A new communion set, additional hearing aids, pew Bibles and new hymnals are among items which are needed.




2. Projects already approved by the church which need further funding before they can be completed:

Debt Retirement. By vote of the church members, the current debt must be eliminated before we can initiate the Facilities Master Plan.

Facilities Master Plan. In October 1989, the church voted to pursue construction of an elevator and classrooms, a music suite, improvement of the sanctuary heating and ventilation system, and purchase of a pipe organ. We continue to add to the two funds already established:

Elevator. The Gilma Brown Memorial was designated for purchase and installation of an elevator needed by many of our older or handicapped members.

Pipe Organ. Installation of a new pipe organ has been a dream of many members for many years. A pipe organ fund has been growing slowly for more than twenty years.




WHAT CAN YOU DO?

The Pastor or members of the Special Gifts Committee will be happy to discuss needs and opportunities with you.


