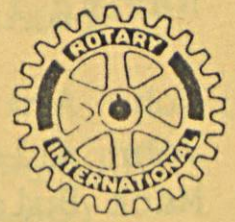

DEEP GRATITUDE. We dedicate this special issue of The Wheelhorse to the members, former members, and with a special sense of gratitude to the deceased who once were active in Troy Rotary Club. A special word of thanks to Worth Franklin, our club historian, to whom we are indebted for so much of the historic material in this issue of the bulletin.

BRIEF HISTORY. Troy Rotary Club was organized In November 1936 and chartered January 22, 1937 with 26 members. Worth Franklin is the last charter member in the club with James B. Allen and O. B. Deaton still living, but no longer members of the club. Among the achievements of the club are included aid for children with defective vision, aid for crippled children, nursing scholarship, citizenship medals, cooperation with the American Legion Post in erecting a community building, the marking of the streets in Troy, organizing and sponsoring a Boy Scout troop, sponsoring of a Little League ball club under the capable leadership of Rotarian James B. Allen, Jr., aid in transporting disabled children, cooperation with Troy Civic Council which serves to initiate such projects as Montgomery United Services, Troy City signs at the entrances to the city. The club was nationally and internationally recognized for a 67 point program of community betterment projects many of which have already been completed. Contributions have been made to the Rotary cottage at the Lake Waccamaw Boys' Home. We have had two District Governors of Rotary International from our club -- Spurgeon Edwards 1959-60 and Austin Garriss 1968-69. We have sponsored two Rotary Fellows for a year's study abroad -- Joe Hough, Jr. and Beaman Griffin, both of whom are very successful in their respective fields. We most recently sponsored Miss Jeannie Reynolds for a Journalism scholarship to study for a year in Australia, but were not successful in this venture. We are an 1800% club in Rotary Foundation giving having contributed approximately \$8500.00. We are honored to be a vital part of the oldest civic organization for men in the world -- Rotary International which is now international in scope with clubs in most of the free world and all working under the slogan of "service above self" in the four avenues of service through the local club, the vocation, the community and around the world in international service building bridges of friendship and understanding.

ROTARY INFORMATION. "You can't make a Rotarian by giving a man a Rotary button, but after he receives his button you can help teach him Rotary. A man in Rotary is one thing; Rotary in a man is something else."

MEANING OF THE ROTARY BUTTON. A new Rotarian paused to examine his Rotary lapel button, which he was changing from one jacket to another. "Why do I wear this? What does it mean? he asked himself. "It grants me a great and honorable privilege anywhere I go, for each wearer of this noble badge is my friend," he answered himself. "It requires of me that I think in harmony with the precepts of Rotary, the highest in the land and broad enough to encompass every daily activity. It requires that I dispel the prejudices of race, creed and political views. I must be patient, liberal, just and upright, all to a noticeable degree."

ATTENDANCE AND FELLOWSHIP. "Attendance does not make a Rotarian, but it does give a man a chance to be one. It is only when all members attend weekly club meetings regularly that fellowship, which is at the heart of Rotary, has an opportunity to flourish."

THURSDAY'S FORECAST. At Thanksgiving time, meteorologist Elliott Abrams broadcast the following forecast: "Turkeys will thaw out in the morning, then warm in the oven to 350° this afternoon.
