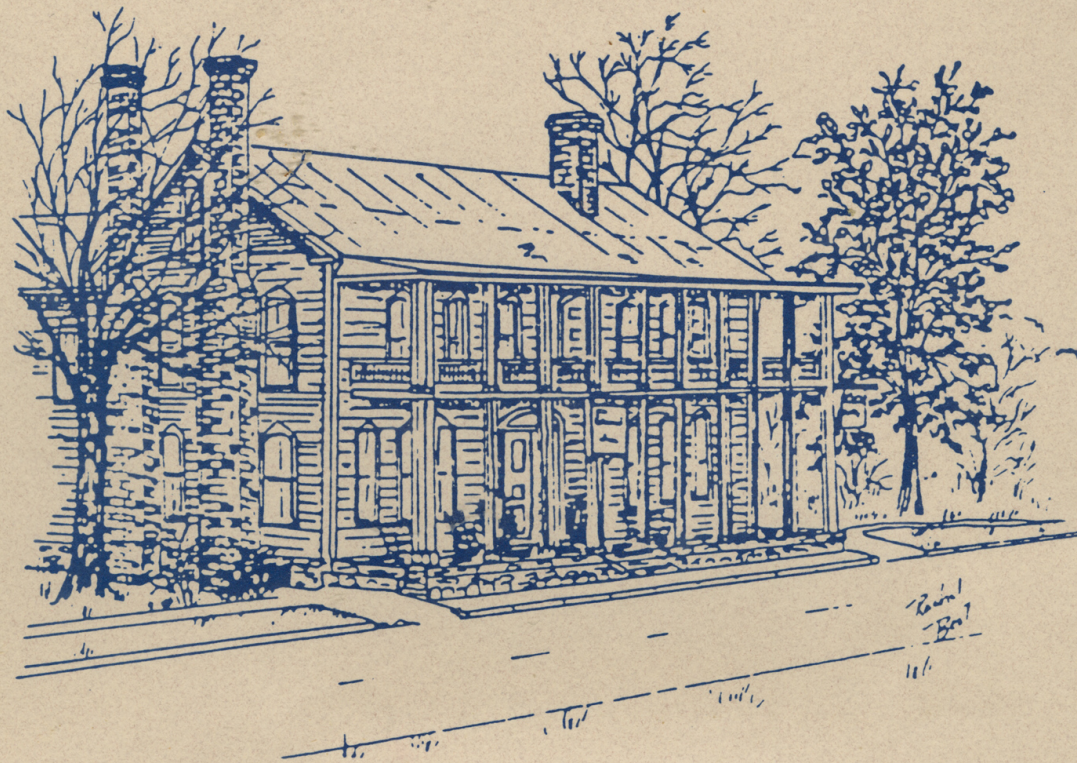



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## *About the History of the Colonial Inn*

THE COLONIAL INN is one of the ten oldest inns in the United States and possibly the most venerable in continuous operation. The oldest part was built about 1759 on the site of a tavern and hospitality house which was constructed in 1752 and burned in 1758. Resistance to British rule was intense in the area, and Hillsborough was the center of the Regulator Movement, a rebellion prior to the outbreak of the Revolutionary War. During the Revolution, Cornwallis is said to have made the Inn his home while in Hillsborough before taunting the local patriots by raising the Royal Standard in Hillsborough on February 22, 1781.

Aaron Burr, third Vice President of the United States, but more famous for his duel with Alexander Hamilton, was also a guest at the Inn. Dolley Madison, wife of President James Madison, is also reported to have stayed at the Inn.

Deeds show that prior to the Civil War, H.C. Stroud and two of his brothers purchased the Inn from Rick Nichols - presumed the previous Innkeeper. Stroud, Master of the Masonic Eagle Lodge No. 19, joined the Confederate Army, leaving behind his wife Octavia and eight daughters. As Sherman's army neared Hillsborough, Mrs. Stroud was determined to keep them from raiding the Inn. She hid her daughters and waited, but the "bummers" promptly began ransacking the Hotel. Remembering her husband's masonic apron, she raced to her bedroom, carried the apron to an upstairs window and waved it at the yankees below. A Sergeant, who was a Mason, spotted it and ordered his troops to return everything stolen from the Inn. He also guarded the Inn from further pillage.

Restored to its Revolutionary prominence, and outfitted with conveniences for the modern traveler, the Inn provides overnight accommodations as well as area for banquet facilities, weddings, receptions, business meetings and a variety of other services. The Colonial Inn welcomes you to Hillsborough. May your visit be an enjoyable experience.
