Requests for copies of Bugle for study have come from high schools all over the U.S. In one week requests received from Portland, Oregan, New Hampshire, and South Dakota. Requests also from Japan, France, and England.

The Bugle is self-supporting and has been able to pay approximately one half the expenses of the journalism class to the Columbia Scholastic Press Association for the last five years. No complimentary ads ever accepted.

Salesmen for the A. B. Dick Co., manufacturers of mimeograph machines and supplies, use the Bugle as an example of what can be done with their products.

Award for one of the best feature stories written for 1954 newspapers was won by Wayne Lamm, a three-year journalism student in BHS. Governor Hodges presented the award at the State Press Association Banquet at Duke University, January, 1955. Lamm is 18 and began working for the Wilson Times after graduating from high school in 1954.

Evelyn Poole, ex-journalism student, is adviser for the Martinsville, Virginia, High School paper and has been recommended as an Exchange Teacher to England.

Octavia Beard and Sidney Jones, past editors of the Bugle, majored in journalism in college; Octavia at the University of North Carolina; Jones at Tulane.

Mrs. L. T. Lassiter and Mrs. Howard Farmer have served this year as judges for the Columbia Scholastic Press Association for duplicated papers of the same classification as the Bugle.

At present they are serving as Chairman of a state committee to work out a year's course of study for high school journalism, said course to be published by the State Department of Education.
