




To Our Young People,



MS CAMPAIGN A SUCCESS

April 5, 1993 ended this years' fund-raising efforts for the Muscular Dystrophy (MS) Program. Over \$5000.00 was raised to aide in the treatment of over forty different muscular diseases.

The Reidsville Post Office worked through Reidsville Bowling Lanes and sponsored a Bowl-for-MS. Insights staff member, Rosetta Badgett asked over 200 people to sponsor her by donating a penny a pin or by giving a donation. She raised \$1,020.00 which was the largest amount reported. She received a trip for two to Cancun, Mexico.

Black Educator:

William Edward Burghardt Du Bois (1868 - 1963)

William Edward Burghardt Du Bois was an educator who had a profound and far-reaching impact on American social history. He promoted world wide liberation for blacks and co-founded several organizations that now continue the struggle for justice and racial equality.

Du Bois was born in 1868 and was brought up in Great Barrington, Mass. At an early age, he displayed a natural curiosity and sharp intelligence. Although his mother died shortly after his high school graduation, neighbors, friends and relatives recognized the importance of furthering his education. They raised enough money to send him to Fisk University in Nashville.

Du Bois won a scholarship in 1888 to attend Harvard as a junior. Upon graduation, he was appointed a Henry Bromfield Rogers fellow in the Harvard University graduate school and earned his master degree in 1891. His following two years of study in Europe had the most impact on his future research and work. A grant allowed him to work on his doctoral thesis at the University of Berlin where he developed a global outlook on race relations.

After two years of teaching at Wilberforce College in Ohio and one year at the University of Pennsylvania, he set up and administered one of the nations first departments of Sociology at Atlanta University. But Du Bois role as a classroom educator did not fully satisfy his desire to effect rapid social change. In 1905, he

called together a group of militant blacks and formed the Niagara Movement, which demanded freedom and equality for Blacks. Several years later, it expanded and joined with other groups to become the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP). Du Bois also served as the editor of the NAACP's magazine, The Crisis.

When the NAACP refused to include African concerns on its agenda, Du Bois quit in protest. He continued his efforts to improve society by directing the U.S. Peace Information Center, an organization that distributed and promoted the Stockholm Peace Appeal petition demanding the banning of the atom bomb. This activity led to an indictment by the U.S. government, which tried him on charges of being an unregistered foreign agent. Although he was acquitted, this experience embittered the man who had fought so hard for world peace.

At age 93, he left for Africa as director of Encyclopedia Africana, a project he had long considered, but never had time to pursue. He died in 1963 on the eve of Martin Luther King's Peace March on Washington, D.C.

Du Bois is remembered and revered today as a scholar, author and activist. But, above all, he was an educator. In the classroom, he taught students how to critically examine social change. His 95 years of dedication and hard work laid the foundation for modern social studies and furthered the cause of social justice.

Without a doubt, Christopher Roger Price touched more lives in his short twenty-seven years than many people do who live three times as long. His love of people did not stop at color lines, as was obvious from the line of mourners who came to show their love and affection for their friend and loved one.




THE PRAYER OF FAITH
