





## The Obituary

On April 5, 1940 Deacon Charlie Goldston was born to the late Wesley and Pearlie Goldston. No one knew the words that the Lord whispered into the ears of Charlie on Saturday morning, July 29, 2006 but he knew the voice and that he should obey. Very quietly and peacefully he slipped away.

He was educated in the Chatham County School System. He continued his learning in the area of communication with AT&T where he received numerous certificates and awards for his outstanding work and services. During Charlie's last 3 years at AT&T, he traveled to Haiti three times and during his tour there he reached many of the Haitians with his Christian ministry. During his tenure, one particular family relationship developed with the Alston Chapel Church family through Deacon Goldston and a sponsorship of a Haitian family began. He retired with 34 years of service.

In December 1959, he married the former Mozelle Headen. To this union three children were born, Drusilla, Angela and Vinson.

He was a strong, loving and giving man that always thought of others before himself. He was a warrior for mankind and was dedicated to his commitments. At an early age, he joined the church and sang in the church choir. Later on, he was baptized at Fisher Memorial UHC. He served on the Deacon Board of Alston Chapel Church. There he also served as the chairperson of the Finance Committee, Pastor Aide Committee, President of the Male Chorus, member of the Usher Board, Sunday School Teacher, and worked as a volunteer for the Alston Chapel Food Bank. He worked diligently to take care of the church's domestic and financial needs. Deacon Goldston was always well respected and served as a mentor for many. He was a member of St. Mark Lodge #829, where he served as Worship Master for eight years, G. Wesley Allen Consistory #324, Khalif Temple #114, Commander of Rites 33°. He served on numerous committees and boards through out the community. He was recognized by the NAACP and was given the Humanitarian Award in 2004. During his spare time he had a love for barbecuing and was well known for his delicious barbecue and special homemade sauce. Charlie was endowed with the spirit of giving and encouragement. His deeds yielded many significant contributions to the community and surrounding areas.
