

Obituary

Mr. Jermal Aundrá Alston, the son of Alexander and Mary Paige Alston, was born at 8:20 p.m. on Monday, the 14th day of July 1969, in Chatham County; at birth he was 7 pounds, 0 ounces, and 20 inches in length. After a lifetime of ailment, he departed this life at 12:00 noon on Wednesday, the 12th day of August 2009.

Jermal graduated from Northwood High School and attended North Carolina State University where he studied Electrical Engineering. He later graduated from Central Carolina Community College in Sanford, North Carolina, with a degree in electronics. He started his own satellite installation business and was the community specialist that came to the rescue of those who knew him. He was an expert in high tech, state-of-the art computer and electrical problems. Any problems that arose, in those areas, Jermal knew how to solve them.

Jermal was a devoted member of Mitchell Chapel Church where he worked with and tutored children and young adults through the Christian Education Department. He also drove the church van to pick up those who needed a ride on Sunday mornings to Sunday School. He joined the Male Chorus and was a faithful member until his health began to fail.
