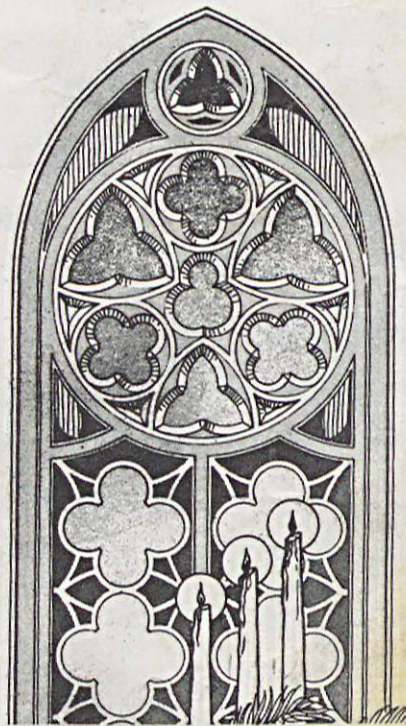

OBITUARY

On Tuesday, Nov. 9, 1976 at 2:43 A.M. **Mr. Johnnie Robert Rogers** departed this life.

Mr. Rodgers was the son of the late Mrs. Agnes Rodgers and the late Mr. Johnnie Rodgers of Greensboro, North Carolina.

Born Dec. 19, 1926 in Chatham County, he received his formal education in the Chatham County Training School, later serving in the U. S. Army from Nov. 23, 1945 to June 9, 1947. A veteran of World War II he distinguished himself with Army Occupational Medals and the World War II Victory Medal.

Mr. Rodgers furthered his education at A & T State University in Greensboro, N. C.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Cornelia O. Rodgers; two daughters Rochelle Rodgers and Linda Rodgers; three sons, Anthony Rogers and Darrel Rodgers of Siler City, N.
