OBITUARY

MR. LOSSELL AARON JOHNSON was born March 16, 1924 in Chatham County to the late Lomis and Roberta Headen Johnson. He attended Shilon School located in Hickory Mountain, Pittsboro, NC. He later attended the Veterans Administrative School and also completed some correspondence Bible courses through the Bible Training Institute located in Cleveland, TN.

He was joined in holy matrimony to Mamie Johnson of Virginia Beach, VA on February 6, 1943. Lossell was a loving and devoted husband, and to this union were born nine children of whom he was very proud. Lossell was a farmer and a logger by trade. He loved the outdoors and his hobbies included hunting, fishing and caring for his many animals, which he loved dearly.

Lossell joined and served in the U.S. Army in 1944 where he served his country and fellow man. After being wounded in active duty, he received an honorable discharge. He remained an active member of the American Legion until his death.

There was no job too large nor too small for him. Never complaining and always ready to offer advice and lend a hand. He served God and his fellow man in every capacity one could mention.

When his load got heavy, and his road got long & hard, we would hear him singing these songs: "I Made A Vow To The Lord and I Want Take It Back; "I'm Running, Running, Running I Can't Tarry and "Power, Power Lord". Brother Johnson kept the "VOW" he made to the Lord and on November 30, 1994 at 7:10 PM he did not linger when the Lord in his magnificent power said "Your Race Is Over Brother Johnson" and called him home.
