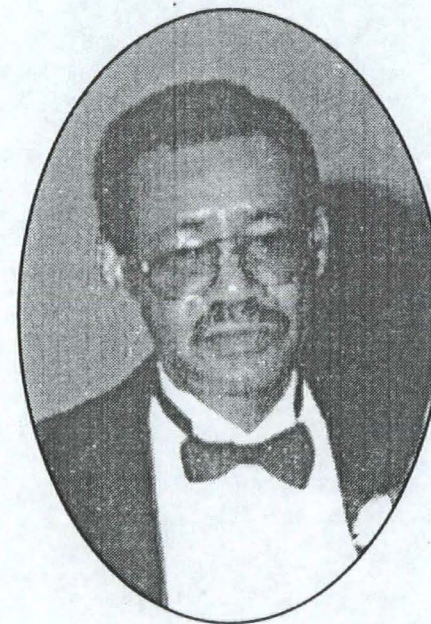

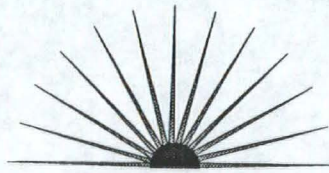

OBITUARY

We pause today to shed a tear in memory of one so dear, whose life stands forth as a guiding star. His deeds stand out like diamonds that brightly gleam. His many words of kindness and his tender grace will be remembered by us all.

EDDIE LEE "BUCK" CARROLL, SR., was born December 24, 1934, in Granville County, to the parentage of the late Jason Carroll and the late Catherine Wilkins Carroll. God called him to an eternal rest on Monday, May 31, 1993, at Durham Regional Hospital, Durham, North Carolina.

At an early age, he joined St. Peter's United Methodist Church, where he served as Lay Leader, Chairman of the Administrative Council, and a member of the Senior Choir. He also served on the District Parsonage Committee for the Durham District.

He attended Granville County Public Schools and graduated from Mary Potter High School in 1952, ninth in his class. While at Mary Potter, Eddie was a two-time All-State football player, and lettered in baseball and track. He was a member of the H. S. Davis Ensemble, the mixed choir, the Hi-Y Club, Crown and Scepter Honor Club, Agriculture Club, Agriculture Quartet and Drama Club. He later attended North Carolina College (now North Carolina Central University), North Carolina State University, and the University of North Carolina Law School Institute of Government.

Eddie became interested in music at a tender age. He was shaped and molded by C.C. Powell at Mary Potter Academy. He was a member of various bands and was always willing to assist or be of service whenever called upon. His musical career spanned well over forty years.

He retired as Superintendent of the Thorndale Country Club after twenty-one years of service and in 1979, he became Granville County's first Black magistrate, serving the Ninth Judicial District of North Carolina as a small claims judge. Magistrate Carroll was proud to serve Granville County and its people, never ceasing to be open, frank, and firm when applying the laws of the Great State in order that justice be served.

In the early 1970s, Eddie joined Blooming Star Lodge #53 and two years later, he became Worshipful Master. In the mid-seventies, he was appointed District Grand Master of the 13th Masonic District of North Carolina. He was also a very active member of Henderson Consistory #195, Imran Temple #168, and Queen Esther Chapter #536 Order of Eastern Star.

Eddie was a chartered member, chairman of the Board of Directors, and past president of the Goodwill Sertoma Club, always promoting quality life for all mankind.

He was past president of the Oxford-Granville County Chapter of the Mary Potter Club. He served on the Board of Directors on the national level. It has always been his hopes and desires that the "memories" of the original Mary Potter Academy/Mary Potter High School be kept alive.

Eddie was also a member of the City of Oxford Zoning Board of Adjustments.

In 1956, he was married to Mary Gladys Marrow. To this union, six children were born. Eddie was a kind, devoted husband, and an indulgent father. He loved his home, his wife, and his children, and saw to it that they were provided for first of all.
