Clifton was educated in the Durham Public School System. He graduated from Hillside High School in 1947. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in Architectural Engineering from Hampton University in Hampton, Virginia in 1952. Upon graduating from Hampton University, he served in the United States Army from 1952 to 1954 during the Korean War, and received the National Defense Service Medal and the Good Conduct Medal.

In his early years, Clifton was an avid athlete. He loved baseball. He served as a pitcher for the Durham Rams which was a part of the Negro League.

He was united in holy matrimony in 1958 to Bonnie Gooch of Durham, North Carolina. One child was born from this union.

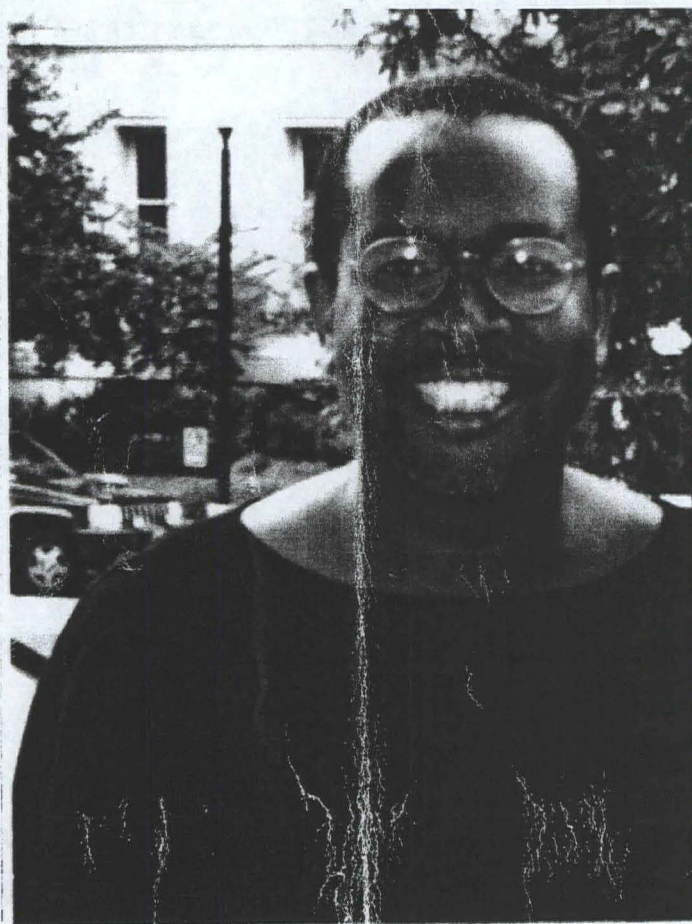

Charles was born December 2, 1953 in Los Angeles, CA. He was the second child born of the union of Dorothy Mae and Attris T. Brown. He was the sixth of seven children born to Dorothy Mae.

The family lived on East 54th Street during Charles' childhood. He attended the local elementary and junior high schools. His scholastic achievements at Thomas Jefferson High School earned him the privilege to participate in the Upward Bound program. He spent summers during those years attending advanced courses offered by Claremont College. These scholastic 'retreats' were educational, as well as recreational, and Charles enjoyed those summers away from the city. He graduated high school with honors in 1971.

As you might imagine, Charles had to hone his negotiating skills very early on. When you are the sixth of seven children, and live in an extended family of 13, you quickly learn what works, and what doesn't! With a combination of humor and wit, he made friends easily and avoided the perils that often befall young men in the inner city.

A few years after high school, Charles opted to enlist in the United States Army in April 1972. During his military career, he served his country abroad in both Germany and Bosnia. He was stationed stateside at Ft. Hood and Ft. Benning. Upon his honorable discharge from active duty, he chose North Carolina as home; he loved the area and the 'flavor' of the region.

Charles was a consummate student and enrolled in Winston Salem State University. His academic achievement earned him an internship with the Internal Revenue Service. He graduated from WSSU in May of 1987 with a BA in Public Administration and began a distinguished career with the IRS, which included numerous awards for outstanding service.

Charles renewed his service to the U.S. Army, this time in a reserve capacity. He joined the 982nd Signal Company where he was serving as a decorated Staff Sergeant.

Charles loved music! He taught himself to play piano and drums. He became an accomplished musician and one of his compositions is currently featured on an exercise video.

He was wed to Josephine D. Francis on August 24, 2001. She was the singular love of his life and he described her as his soul mate.

He is survived by four children: Christopher Charles Brown, Akeisha Brown, Crystal Daniel and Courtney Daniel; three grandchildren: Tatianna Brown, Charleia Chrishawna Brielle Sanders, and Mya Daniel; five sisters: Attricia Stroupe, of Gardena, CA.; Carol Boyd and Gloria Singleton, residing in Los Angeles, California; Pamela Ray, of Anaheim, California, and Sandra Trask, of Palmdale, Ca. Obituary

The Reverend Hugh Victor Brown, the eighth of fourteen children, was born to the late Edward C. and Georgianna Brown on June 20, 1891, in Henderson, Kentucky.

His early education was attained in the public schools of Henderson, and in 1908, following his brothers, Julian, he entered Hampton Institute (now Hampton University) in Virginia.

While at Hampton, he was a work student yet exhibited exceptional leadership ability in military training, drama, and literary arts. In 1912 he completed a course in Agriculture; however, he remained at Hampton another year and graduated May 23, 1913.

Hugh Victor's first professional assignment, which lasted for two years, was in Harrisburg, Virginia. During his tenure of service, his thirst for knowledge led him to seek further education at Virginia Union University, Richmond, where he studied for the Ministry.

After completing the course of study at Virginia Union University, he accepted a teaching assignment at Cape Charles, Virginia, at a salary of \$35.00 per month. During the summer of 1917, he worked for the J.W. Alsop Tobacco Corporation in Connecticut. (This association proved to be a long one and allowed him in later years to assist hundred of Dillard students and many educational personnel to have employment during the summers.)

In June, 1918, he entered the U.S. Army at Camp Lee, Virginia. One month later, he earned the rank of Corporal. By the time he was discharged he had earned the rank of Second Lieutenant.

In September, 1919, the Reverend Brown came to North Carolina as a Principal and teacher of Agriculture at the Columbus County Training School, Whiteville. In that same year, he was married to the late Alice Harper Brown of Louisville, Kentucky, who departed this life in March, 1948.

After a short experience in Columbus County, his continued thirst for improvement led him to return to Hampton Institute in 1921 to pursue the Bachelor's Degree in Education. His Master's Degree in Education was awarded in 1947.

In 1923, he became Principal of the Goldsboro "Colored" Schools. Immediately after accepting this position, he induced the Board of Education to delete the word "Colored". Many citizens expressed the desire to have the name of the high school changed to "Brown High School", but the new Principal felt that the school should be named for the Reverend Clarence Dillard, who had served as Principal for many years.

As an educator, Professor Brown (as he was affectionately called) made great strides in education locally and statewide. Further, he made his mark as a community leader as well as a religious leader.

Under his administration, Dillard High School became one of the most outstanding high schools in North Carolina. The staff, the library, the Commercial Department, and the Vocational Department were exemplary, and many Dillard graduates excelled in college and in the work place wherever they went. Participation by students in many clubs and other activities played a vital part in the life of the school. "Let's Have The Best School" was the motto, and students were challenged to do the best they could in every endeavor.

Professor Brown's love for "Dear Old Dillard High" led him in 1955 to organize the Dillard Alumni Association which now includes Chapters in several states, and each year awards hundreds of dollars in Scholarships to assist high school graduates to further their education.

As an ardent supporter of education statewide, Hugh Victor was outstanding in promoting activities of the North Carolina Teachers Association. During his presidency, the Association completed payment of its Executive Office in Raleigh – the old North Carolina Mutual Life Insurance Company Building – and moved forward founding and promoting four District Organizations throughout the State. After his retirement, he recorded the history of education for Afro-Americans in this State in two books – A HISTORY OF EDUCATION OF NEGROES IN NORTH CAROLINA and EQUALITY EDUCATION OF NEGROES IN NORTH CAROLINA.

At home, he founded the regional H.V. Brown School Masters Club. His civic leadership was felt as promoter and first Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Community Center (now W.A. Foster Community Center); as columnist for the "Goldsboro News-Argus" (Among the Colored, and Browsings); and as founder of the C.S. Brown Lodge #782. He was a 33rd Degree Mason and for several years was 4th District Deputy Grand Master. In his later years he was honored for his civic work by having a street (H.V. Brown Lane) and a park named for him. Politically, he was a registered Republican.

As an ordained Minister, Mr. Brown's concern for the well-being of the religious community led him to be closely involved in church work. A member of the First African Baptist Church, he served in many capacities – Associate Pastor, Sunday School teacher, and keeper of financial records. He also sponsored "Religious Emphasis Week" in the high school to involve local ministers with the school.

Hampton University remained dear to Mr. Brown's heart throughout his adult life. He organized the local Hampton Alumni Association, and worked so diligently with the National Alumni Association that he was elected president and represented that organization on the Hampton Board of Trustees for several years. He was also founder of the Hampton Alumni Association in North Carolina on the Regional and State levels.

In 1948, Hugh Victor was married to Elizabeth Bright of Dafuskie Island, South Carolina, a Wayne County Home Agent with the North Carolina Extension Service. This couple shared a deep religious faith. Hugh Victor's "walk with God" was evident in his diary which he kept from 1908 through 1990. Throughout the pages, he made references to our Lord, and noted many Scriptures which were meaningful to him. He sought the Lord. Early in the morning, he knelt to pray; at noon, he stole away to read his Bible and pray; before retiring, he knelt to pray. Surley, he walked with God!

His survivors include his devoted wife - Elizabeth of the home; one sister - Mrs. Mary B. Ashford of New Haven, Connecticut; a foster granddaughter - Mrs. Jacqueline Harper Hardy of Baltimore, Maryland; (a foster daughter - Mrs. Iva Brown Harper, preceded him in death); eight nieces and nephews - George W. Brown and Aurela B. MacIntosh of Detroit, Michigan, Edwino Bl Pratt of Chicago, Illinois, M. Douglas Brown and Hugh Victor Brown, II both of Woodbury, New Jersey, Arthur W. Brown of Virginia Beach, Virginia, Roscoe Lee Brown of Los Angeles, California, and Juanita B. Neal of Linderwold, New Jersey; and many grand and great grand nieces and nephews.

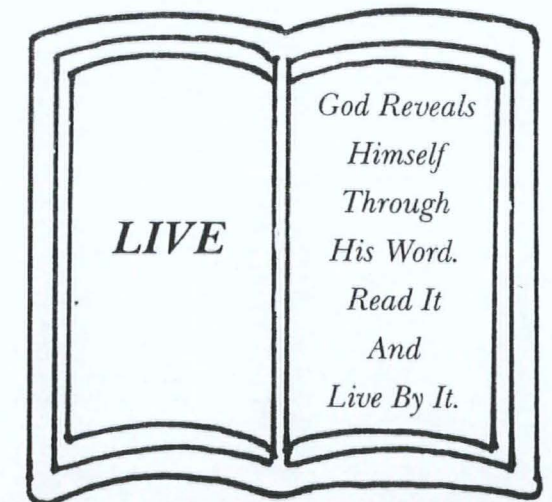
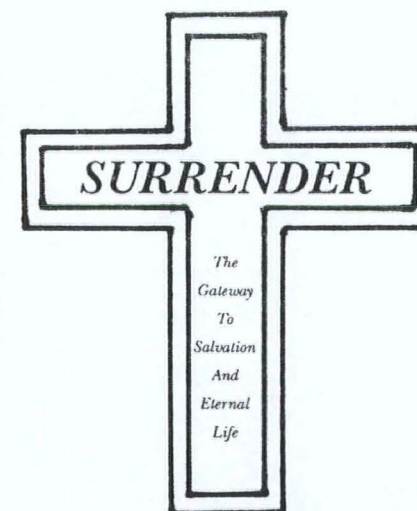

The Rev. James A. Brown dies

The Rev. James Arthur Brown, 87, of 214 Normandy St., died Wednesday, Sept. 28, at his home.

The Rev. Brown, the son of the late Shephard and Bettie Brown, was born in Robeson County and raised in Wilson. He

moved to Durham in 1929 and joined Mount Vernon Baptist Church.

The Rev. Brown received his ministerial training at the Baptist Seminary in Lynchburg, Va. He pastored Community Baptist Church in Durham and Second Baptist Church in Chapel Hill. In 1951, he became pastor of Ebenezer Baptist Church and served there until 1967. He then returned to pastor Second Baptist Church, where he served until his retirement in 1984.

The Rev. Brown was a member of the interdenominational Ministerial Alliance of Durham, in which he served as the group's critic. He was past president of the Durham chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People in the late 1950s and early '60s.

In 1984, the Rev. Brown received the NAACP Freedom Award for his work during the sit-in demonstrations for desegregation in the early '60s, and for his involvement in the lawsuit filed by the NAACP against the Durham City Schools to equalize the schools. Gov. James B. Hunt conferred the honor of the Long Leaf Pine on the Rev. Brown in September 1984.

Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m. Monday at Mount Vernon Baptist Church with the Rev. Percy L. High officiating. Burial will follow in Beechwood Cemetery.

The Rev. Brown is survived by his wife, Mattie Scott Brown.

The family will receive visitors from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m. today at Mount Vernon Baptist Church. Funeral arrangements are by Ellis D. Jones & Sons Funeral Directors.

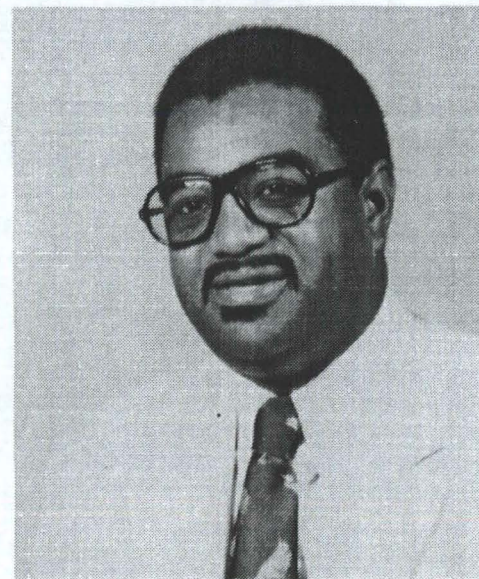

Former City Council member dead at 48

Mr. James Walter Brown Jr., a former county tax appraiser and Durham City Council member, died Thursday at Duke University Hospital. He was 48.

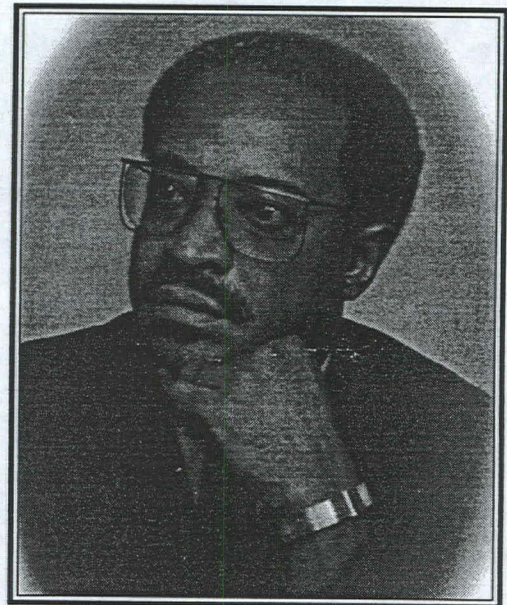

Dr. Rose Butler Browne, daughter of the late John R. Butler and Mrs. Hannah F. McClenney, was born March 19, 1897 in Boston, Massachusetts. She died Monday, December 1, 1986 in Providence, Rhode Island, following an extended illness.

While in Durham, Dr. Browne was a member of the Executive Committee, National Adult Education Association; vice chairman, Hillside High School Precinct Committee; member, National Field Committee, Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. In the community, she served as chairman of the Program Committee, Whitted School PTA; district chairman, Whitted School PTA; district chairman, Bright Leaf Area Girl Scout Council, Inc.; leader, Troop 23, GSA; Membership Committee, Harriett Tubman Branch YWCA; counselor to youth at Mt. Vernon Baptist Church where her late husband, Rev. Emmett T. Browne, Sr., was pastor.

She was a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Sciences, American Association of University Professors, Pi Lambda Theta Honor Society for Women in Education, N.C. State Teachers Association, National Association of College Women, N.C. Federation of Negro Women's Clubs, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority in which she had held the posts of National Parliamentarian, South Atlantic Regional Director and Mid-Atlantic Regional Director; Association of College Teachers of Education, American Childhood Education International, Association of Student-Teachers, National Society for the Study of Education.

Prior to her position at North Carolina College, Dr. Browne was an instructor at Virginia State College; chairman, Psychology Department, Virginia State College; head, Psychology Department, West Virginia State College; and head, Department of Education, Bluefield State Teachers College.

Dr. Browne was the 1963 recipient of the Hamilton Watch Award at North Carolina College for outstanding service as a teacher, leader and scholar.

Dr. Browne was the moving force in the establishment of the Happy Hours Child Care Center at Mt. Vernon Baptist Church and served as its first director. The E.T. Browne Education Building, which houses the center at Mt. Vernon, is named in honor of her husband.

She was appointed by former Gov. Terry Sanford to the Governor's Committee to Study the Needs of the Mentally Retarded in North Carolina.

Surviving are a son, Emmett T. Browne, Jr.; three sisters, Mrs. Charlotte Lee, Miss Florence Butler and Mrs. Henrietta Tidball, all of Providence.
