



OBITUARY

Mrs. Bessie C. Bryant, one of the pioneer citizens of Rocky Mount, died Sunday, March 15, 1981 after a long period of declining health. She was born to the late James and Georgia Boddie Sessoms in Rocky Mount, North Carolina on August 4, 1884.

She was educated in the public schools of Rocky Mount and was graduated from Albion Academy in Franklinton, N. C. She taught in the public schools of Edgecombe County after graduation.

She joined Mount Zion Baptist Church at an early age and was a member for 84 years - being the oldest member of the church. She worked in almost every department of the church as long as her health permitted.

She was married to the late Walter C. Bryant on September 27, 1904. To this union were born nine children, four of whom preceded her in death - two infants; James H. Bryant and Elsie B. Miller. Survivors are three daughters, Mrs. Helena B. Thompson and Mrs. Mae B. Lee of Rocky Mount and Mrs. Georgia B. Pettigrew of Annapolis, Md.; two sons, Walter C. Bryant, Jr. and Dr. F. B. Bryant of Rocky Mount; two sisters, Mrs. Blanche S. Hines and Miss Daisy Sessoms of Rocky Mount; thirteen grandchildren, several great-grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

~ Obituary ~

Dr. Frederic Burnett Bryant departed this life on January 28, 2001 after a courageous battle with deteriorating health. Affectionately known as "Doc" and "F.B.", he was born in Rocky Mount, NC on November 8, 1918 to Walter and Bessie Bryant and made Rocky Mount his home until death.

F.B. was a born-again Christian and a member of Mount Zion First Baptist Church. The Word of God promises to each of His children a gift through which His light may be seen. To F.B. was given a passion for healing others. After serving his country in the United States Army, he made the decision to pursue a career in medicine. Upon graduating from North Carolina College for Negroes and Meharry Medical College, he committed his life to providing healthcare to residents of Nash, Edgecombe and Franklin counties.

F.B. was the first person of color to practice as a physician in Nashville, NC, quietly confronting the barriers of segregation by refusing to order prescriptions with drug stores not allowing his patients to come in the front door. His devotion to the sick and frail transcended consideration for the ability to pay, making him the primary source of healthcare for many of the lifelong and migrant residents of Nash County. Until his health failed, he worked tirelessly continuing to make house calls for patients needing visits at home. During his career which spanned more than forty-five years, he served as Nash County Medical Examiner, physician for the Nash County Jail and member of the Nash County Mental Health Advisory Board.

He leaves to cherish his memory: his wife, Dorris Reed Bryant; two daughters, Cheryl Bryant Shanks and Terri Bryant; two sons, Frederic Bryant, Jr. and Holly Bryant. He embraced into the family a son-in-law, Vernon Shanks, a daughter-in-law, Allyson Bryant and five grandchildren. Surviving also are sisters, Mae B. Lee, Georgia B. Pettigrew and Helena B. Thompson and brother, Walter C. Bryant, as well as numerous nieces and nephews.



Facing the rising sun of our new day begun, Let us march on till victory is won.


Stony the road we trod, Bitter the chast'ning rod, Felt in the days when hope unborn had died; yet with a steady beat,
