



The Reverend Dr. W. T. Bigelow, the son of the late Walter Bigelow and the late Melissa Bigelow, was born on March 15, 1929 in Yanceyville, NC. He peacefully entered into eternal rest on Tuesday, June 29, 1993 at Duke University Medical Center, Durham, NC, after a brief illness.

He continued his education, earning a Doctor of Divinity degree from the Virginia Seminary, Lynchburg, VA and a Doctor of Divinity degree from the Shaw University Divinity School, Raleigh, NC, where he was also a member of the faculty.

Dr. Bigelow was an active member of the General Baptist State Convention, the Baptist Pastors Conference, Columbus, OH, the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign and Home Missionaries and the National Baptist Evangelistic Association. Also known as the "Radio Pastor", he broadcast the International Sunday School Lesson every Sunday on radio station WSRC for twentynine years. He was a recording artist with sermons, prayers and meditations published nationwide.

Dr. Bigelow was a 32nd degree Mason and a member of Doric Masonic Lodge No. 28, PHA, Durham, NC.
