Cora Claine Cooke, was born on November 9, 1921 to James C. Hubbard, Sr. and Leah E. (Carter) Hubbard. Both parents, two brothers, James C. Hubbard, Jr., Curtis H. In 1950 Mrs. Cooke organized the first Modern Dance Group at Roosevelt. The Modern Dance Class was primarily for girls who wished to become cheerleaders and majorettes. Her cheerleading groups won more than 19 state championships. She enjoyed and participated in many sports, especially bowling and swimming. She received her Masters Degree from Indiana University where she was elected to the Honorary Society by Pi Lamba Theta; affiliated with Zeta Phi Beta. She attended St. Timothy Church in Gary, IN. Until her death, she was a member of Zion Baptist Church in Pheobus. She traveled to Hawaii, went to Nigeria in 1977 and attended a seminar in Africa headed by Percy Barde of NYU. She danced at Constitutional Hall where the DAR refused to allow Marian Andersen to sing. She was one of the founding members of the Virginia Society for Black Historical & Genealogical Research (VSBHGR), now known as AAHGS.

DR. DAVID B. COOKE, JR. the son of the late David B. and Lucille Edwards Cooke of Weldon, North Carolina, died at the Hillhaven La Salle Nursing Center on Thursday, April 22, 1982.

Dr. Cooke received his early education in the public schools of Weldon. He came to North Carolina College for Negros (now North Carolina Central University) to pursue courses leading to the Bachelor of Science degree and then went on to Meharry Medical College in Nashville, Tennessee, for the study of medicine. Before a tragic illness cut short his career, Dr. Cooke gave himself without stint to the practice of his profession for more than thirty years. As a physician he was like "Luke, the beloved physician," and his patients will cherish his memory.

Dr. Cooke's fortitude in illness won for him the admiration of all who knew him. Those who visited him always came away marveling that even in the face of inscrutable fortune he had learned the "sweet magic of a cheerful face." 




