Obituary

ALEXANDER G. FAUCETTE, SR. was born on February 13, 1915 in Efland, NC. Affectionately known to his friends as "A. G.," he departed this life on May 3, 1995 at his home in South Orange, NJ.

Alexander was the sixth child of Claude Faucette, a minister and the proprietor of a local store, and the former Minnie Corde, a school teacher. His siblings were: Evander, Milton, Thomas, Beatrice, LaFayette, Amos, and Fannie. His maternal grandparents were the Reverend A. J. Corde, who organized an A. M. E. Church in Efland, NC, and the former Fannie Williams.

He attended public school in Greensboro, NC, graduating from Dudley High School. He married Eloise Hall in 1934 in a union that lasted almost 55 years, and which produced six children. The couple moved from Greensboro to make their home in Washington, DC. There, Alexander joined the ranks of the Union of the Sleeping Car Porters, traveling on the Atlantic Coast Line from Washington, DC to St. Petersburg, FL for about seven years.

In 1948, with his wife, he opened the El Rocco Club, restaurant and supper club which became well known throughout the southeast for its Southern cuisine and fine entertainment. During the era of segregation, it was the only place in Greensboro where African-Americans could enjoy what was called "New York" entertainment. As a restaurateur and promoter, Alexander arranged bookings at the Club through New York talent agencies for jazz greats including Duke Ellington, Sarah Vaughn, Little Jimmy Scott and Ruth Brown. During the days of Rhythm and Blues, the Club featured artists including The Platters, Smokey Robinson and The Miracles, The Drifters, The Coasters, Jackie Wilson, Sam Cooke, Jerry Butler, Ben E. King, Curtis Mayfield and The Impressions, Otis Redding, Ike and Tina Turner, Gladys Knight and The Pips, Wilson Pickett, and James Brown. The club also featured comedy acts, including: Jackie "Moms" Mabley, Redd Foxx, Pigmeat Markham, Baby Seals, and Pinkie Lee. The Club has been chronicled in the history of the "Chitlin' Circuit," a reference to a string of African-American entertainment centers along the East Coast that thrived during segregation.

In addition to the El Rocco, Alexander and Eloise also operated a coffee shop at the L. Richardson Memorial Hospital and the Luncheonette at the King Cotton Hotel. Alexander was a past president of the North Carolina Restaurant Association. The couple retired from the business in 1970 and moved to Long Island, NY.

Alexander was a member of Bethel A. M. E. Church in Greensboro, NC. On Long Island, he worshipped at Union Baptist Church in Hempstead. He relocated to South Orange, NJ in 1991 following the death of his wife, and later joined St. Matthew A. M. E. Church in Orange, NJ.

Alexander leaves to mourn his passing: six children, Doris Drake of Irvington, NJ, Helen Faucette of New York City, Rev. Alexander Faucette, Jr. and Amos Faucette of Greensboro, NC, Jeanette Brummell and Joyce Faucette Farmer of South Orange, NJ; daughter-in-law, Katie Faucette; sons-in-law, Wilbur Drake, William Brummell and Kent Farmer; a sister-in-law, Mary McDaniel; brother-and sister-in-law, Robert and Jean Hall; eleven grandchildren; five great-grandchildren, and many other relatives and friends.







Faucette Last Rites Not Set Yet

"Uncle" Lindsey Faucette, Durham's oldest active merchant until his recent retirement at 98 and a venerable City landmark, died at 8 a.m. yesterday as he had wished, on a Sunday, at his residence, 109 South Alston Ave. He had been ill two weeks.

He attributed his longevity to faith, the Golden Rule and a small appetite. He was a deacon in the White Rock Baptist Church for 61 years, and on Sept. 10, 1951, he was honored with a testimonial service at the church. He would have been 99 years old next Nov. 16.

He was born in Orange County on the Norwood Plantation, an old Southern estate later known as the Occonechee Farm, near Hillsboro.

When he was a young man he came to Durham, and soon established a draying business which blossomed into a thriving occupation. He had the patronage of students at Trinity College (now Duke University), the University of North Carolina, and North Carolina College. By giving a commission to those who worked for him, Faucette soon cornered the drayage market here. At the peak of his business he owned five trucks, two double teams and three single teams.

He had many friends, white and Negro, and they patronized his confectionary stand after he left the drayage business about 16 years ago. His stand, "The Old Reliable," was on South Church Street.

Funeral arrangements were incomplete today.

DEDICATED TO MARGARET RUFFIN FAUCETTE

Mrs. MARGARET RUFFIN FAUCETTE, also known as "Maggie" Faucette, was born in 1822 in Hillsborough, North Carolina, and was the daughter of Jesse Ruffin (1806-March 1, 1901) and Rebecca "Becky" Norwood Ruffin (1808-1880). Her parents were married in 1829 in the manner in which slaves were married. Margaret Ruffin was married to William Faucette and they were parents of thirteen children. The children were: Jesse Faucette Norwood, Sallie Faucette Badie, Thomas Faucette, William "Bill" Faucette, Lindsey N. Faucette, Cornelia Faucette Mangum, Carolina Faucette Monroe, Annie Faucette, Beannie Poole Morgan, and Nannie Gazella Cooper. The children were born on the John W. Norwood (lawyer) plantation, now known as the Occaneechi Farm near Hillsborough in Orange County, North Carolina. Margaret Ruffin Faucette's ancestors were of the Occfaneechi Indian tribe from the Indian reservation. She departed this life on October 21, 1920.

William Faucette, her husband, was a slave on the plantation of David Faucette in Orange County. When David Faucette died in 1824, William, a boy, was sold to Joseph Faucette for \$100.00. He had a brother, Alexander Faucette, who was on Joseph Faucette's plantation. Alexander Faucette married Caroline McCully and they had seven sons and three daughters. The known children were: James Faucette, Major Faucette, Claude Faucette, Floyd Faucette, Frank Faucette, Edward Faucette, William F. Faucette, Annie Faucette, Mariah Faucette and Linda Faucette.

Jesse Faucette, Margaret Ruffin Faucette's oldest son, went with the Graham family to Georgia and took the name of Norwood. He married and lived in Atlanta and would come to Durham to visit his brother Henry and his family. Jesse's known children were: Ida Norwood, Maggie Norwood, John Norwood, Thomas "Tom" Norwood, Edward "Ed" Norwood, Fannie Norwood, George Norwood and Lucious Norwood.

Grandmother was not a field slave, but lived in the home of her mistress where she learned some of the finer things of life that her mistress enjoyed in the big house, such as the feel of fine silks and the use of crystal and china.

From observations and with very little tutoring, she taught herself to read, and the Bible was her constant companion. She was a devout Christian and sought every opportunity to let everyone with whom she came in contact know about the God she served, and tell of His goodness and sang of His praises.

Upon moving from Hillsborough to the station Durham, for a while she found lodging in the home of Mrs. Sallie Husband. Being a woman of prayer, she was found wherever there was a prayer meeting going on, this being any place that they could find -- often under a shed or grape harbor-- to praise God for His kindness, guidance and protection. She had a burning desire to have a definite place of worship, so in 1866 she invited Rev. Samuel "Daddy" Hunt, who was an early preacher to blacks in Durham, Mrs. Sallie Husband, Mr. Joshua Perry, Mr. Gos Lee and Mrs. Malissa Lee to come and have prayer meeting with her in her room. it was there that WHITE ROCK BAPTIST CHURCH was born. They later moved in a frame building on

White Kock Baptist

Pettigrew Street, and when this church was erected, it was Mrs. Margaret Ruffin Faucette who gave the first \$1.00 towards the new building. When the building was completed, it was Mr. Gos Lee who suggested the name "White Rock" from a large white flint rock found in the yard in front of the church. Thus, the name WHITE ROCK BAPTIST CHURCH.

"Grandmother soon moved to live with her daughter, Mrs. Nannie G. Cooper, who was my mother," said Mrs. Nannie James Greene. "I had the privilege and pleasure of living briefly under her Christian influence during the early years of my life. It was my mother who related to me how grandmother professed faith in Christ at an early age and how people during and after slavery had to worship wherever and whenever they could, often under adverse circumstances."

"I was told as Dorcas in the Bible went around doing almsdeeds, so it was with grandmother. When there was sickness in the neighborhood, she mad soup and packed her basket, threw her shawl around her shoulders and away she would go to do her deeds of love and kindness. No grandchild, or young person visited her without receiving her blessing. The blessing was a kiss, a piece of candy that she had saved for such an occasion, or bread and butter with preserves, or a little cinnamon sprinkled on the bread and butter."

"I am happy to say that this bit of her hospitality has drifted down among her children and grandchild, and I hope it will continue to live on. Mother said grandmother had a song in her heart at all times as she sent about her work, she said these are some of the songs she sang:

"Amazing Grace, How Sweet the Sound"

"I'm Bound for the Promised Land"

A Charge to Keep I Have, A God to Glorify"


"Soon I Will Be Done With the Troubles of This World"

"Go Down Moses, Tell Ole Pharaoh to Let My People Go"

She passed the three score years and ten and reached the age of 98 years. Had two of her children lived a month longer they would have been centurions --100 years old. She was buried in the old Geer Cemetery located on Colonial Street and Camden Avenue off Avondale Avenue in Durham.

We, the grandchildren, great grands, and great grandchildren of this Christian woman are happy to the fullest extent to have this opportunity to honor our grandmother tonight as one of the founders of White Rock Baptist Church. Her Christian influence will ever live on in us. She lit the torch of that great church and has passed it on to us with the words "carry on." As long as there is a White Rock Baptist Church, the name MARGARET RUFFIN FAUCETTE will live. It is the desire and determination of her descendants to do their part to help it continue to live.



Secret Secret Secret was a man tall in both stature and character. Although he had a quiet and somewhat shy demeanor, he had a keen mind and wry sense of humor. A man of faith, he was born to Cecelia Gladys Faucette and Henry Martin Faucette, on July 19, 1928, in Durham, North Carolina. At a very young age, Paul accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized at White Rock Baptist Church in Durham, North Carolina by Reverend Miles Mark Fisher. It is significant to note, White Rock was founded in the living room of the home of Paul's grandmother, Margaret Faucette.

After graduating from Hillside High School, Paul proudly served his country by enlisting in the United States Army in 1948. After completing his four year tour of duty, Paul enrolled at A&T State University in Greensboro, North Carolina, where he graduated in 1957 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mechanical Engineering. The couple later moved to San Diego, California where they took jobs and excelled in their respective professions, Myrtle, in education and Paul in the aerospace industry.

With a young family to raise and revere in the knowledge of faith and love of the Lord, the family became active members of All Saints Episcopal Church in San Diego where both sons served as altar boys. The eldest son, Brian Faucette, graduated from Point Loma Nazarene University, where he majored in music and computer science. Anthony Faucette, graduated from San Diego State University. Following graduation, Anthony entered and graduated from the San Diego County Sheriff's Academy. Shortly afterwards, while assigned as a sheriff, to the George Bailey Detention Facility, in 1994, Anthony died from an unexpected illness. Only two years later, Paul's beloved wife of thirty-seven years, Myrtle, also died.

Several years later, the Lord saw fit in His will and through some dear friends, to introduce Paul to Olivia Gilliam. Olivia became a new joy and blessing in Paul's life. Paul and Olivia developed a wonderful, loving and caring relationship that brought together two families, Paul's and Olivia's, as only the Lord could have done. Paul began worshiping with Olivia at Christ United Presbyterian Church in San Diego where he eventually joined and became an active member. Paul and Olivia's faith, love and relationship saw them through several of Paul's illnesses including a kidney transplant in 2003. Unfortunately, Paul's health again began to fail, but not before he had time to get his affairs in order and make peace with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Paul died peacefully at home, surrounded by loved ones, on Friday, February 2, 2007. He leaves to cherish his memory his son, Brian Faucette; companion, Olivia Gilliam and her family; sisters, Mary Faucette Way, Mattie Faucette Hall, Mildred Faucette Jones (Carl) and Cecilia Faucette Cook; brother, Henry Louis Faucette (Paulette), as well as many nieces and nephews and a host of other relatives and friends.
