Obituary

Robert Kelly Corbett, Sr., the fifth of seven children, was born to the late Willie L. and Mary J. Corbett on September 15, 1920 in Falkland, NC. He died peacefully, early Sunday morning, November 13, 2005. He received his high school diploma in 1936 from Booker T. Washington High School, Rocky Mount, NC. In 1940, "Baby Corbett" (as he was widely known), graduated Summa Cum Laude, from Johnson C. Smith University, Charlotte, NC with a triple major in English, French and History. While there he pledged Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. in 1937. Robert did further studies at the University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, PA, the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, NC and East Carolina University, Greenville, NC.

Robert began his teaching career in 1941 at Harnett County Training School, Dunn, NC. His career was interrupted in 1942 when he was drafted into the U. S. Army. In the U. S. Army "Baby Corbett" became Master Sergeant Corbett. He was honorably discharged from the army in 1946 and immediately resumed his teaching career in Harnett County. Robert began teaching at Nash County Training School (now Nash Central High School) in 1953. During his tenure in Nash County, he served as teacher, principal and Director of Migrant Education. Robert retired from his career as an educator in 1985. During his 44 year career he never missed a day's work.

Robert accepted Christ at an early age, and was an active member of Mt. Zion First Baptist Church. Later in life he became an active member of Metropolitan Baptist Church, Rocky Mount, NC, where he served on the Board of Trustees, served as president of the Senior Choir and taught the Daughters of Zion Sunday School Class.

Among the many awards he received are his 50 year membership award from Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity (1988), Volunteer of the Year award from Rocky Mount Schools (1993) and the Governor's Award for Volunteer Service in Nash County (1993). As a strong supporter of the Nash Central Senior High Alumni Association and serving as Master of Ceremony for the annual fundraiser reunion for many years, the Nashville Chapter inducted him to the Wall of Fame, May 2001.

He was preceded in death by three brothers William Corbett, Frank Corbett, James Corbett; one sister Iva Smith and a son-in-law James I. Hargrove. He is survived by his loving wife of 58 years Cleo Nelson Corbett; a son Robert Kelly Corbett, Jr. (Linda) of Charlotte, NC, a daughter Shermayne Corbett Hargrove; a godson Dr. Willis McLeod (Jacqueline) of Fayetteville, NC; four grandchildren Attorney Robert Kelly Corbett, III (Colena) of Charlotte, NC, Monique Hargrove-Jones (Chauncey), Jasmine Corbett of Durham, NC, James Corbett Hargrove of Greensboro, NC; a sister Mary Bryant, a brother Alfred B. Corbett (Joyce) of Phoenix, AZ; two sisters-in-law Naomi Corbett of Rocky Mount and Elizabeth Corbett of St. Petersburg, FL; four nieces and four nephews.
