

When the children's department was set up for 1952-53, Mrs. Goodwin and Mrs. Bruce decided to use the same subject divisions for Story Hour and the Older Boys and Girls, to facilitate our visual aid allotment.

For the first semester the five tentative divisions were:

1. Fairy stories

2. Colored Children of other lands

3. Animal stories 4. Travel stories

5. Indian and western stories

During the meetings of each group, New Books are discussed in order that the children be intelligent in selecting the books by title and content when

they come to the library.

Films have been secured from the Bureau of Visual Education, Chapel Hill, North Carolina. Some of those that have been used are: Children of Japan, Children of Mexico, Children of Holland, and Care of Pets. Many Filmstrips from the library's collection have been used throughout the year also.

Two parties were planned, one for Hallowe'en and one for Christmas, each

group reciprocating.

Story telling by the children has been encouraged. Also reading aloud. Also included in the plans for the Older Boys and Girls is the reading of a favorite story, chapter by chapter each week. The magazines Child Life and Jack and Jill have provided many interesting games, puzzles, and stories for both groups.

There has been some handicraft work with paper in the Older Boys and Girls group, but due to the large number that attend each meeting, not too much has been acomplished. After Christmas the group will be split up and both Mrs.

Goodwin and Mrs. Bruce will teach varied handicraft.

The Young Adult group was set up to stimulate the reading interests of teen-

agers, and to acquaint them with library procedures.

For the first semester the subjects discussed were Personality Priblems, which include popularity, manners, dating, grooming, attitudes etc., and the Race question. Films secured also from the Bureau of Visual Education are shown to explain various aspects of the subject. From time to time, speakers are asked to address the group.

The Young Adults have chosen seven officers from their group to plan their activities with the help of Mrs. Bruce. A play was given for national Book Weekcelled "A Night in the Library". For Christmas, the group plans to give

a party for themselves and their guests.
