



Mrs. Betty Wilson Goodloe, 119 Masondale Avenue, Durham, North Carolina died at her home early Sunday morning, June 2, 1991 after many months of declining health.

She loved nature and all helpless creatures, even stranded birds and squirrels could find help at her door.

After retirement, Mrs. Goodloe became active in the Durham Arts Council and the Senior Citizens Coordinating Council. She was serving as secretary to the council in 1979, when her husband was disabled by a severe stroke.

Giving up all activities, Mrs. Goodloe served as her husbands's loyal companion until his death in November 1990. She was a devoted wife, mother, and grandmother, who taught that style, substance, and duty are all necessary for the well-lived life.

Mrs. Goodloe is survived by her daughter, Betty Jo Goodloe Cook, two grandsons, William Edward Merritt IV and Joseph Goodloe Cook, and a son-in-law, Willie Cook, all of whom reside in Berkley, California; a nephew, James Wilson Henson of Philadelphia, a great niece, Mrs. April Henson Moses, two great great nieces, Melanie and Amy Moses, a great great Nephew, John Moses and several cousins.

Someone has said that the remarkable thing about great human beings is that they live on long after their hearts stop beating. Believing this to be true, we know that Mrs. Goodloe lives on in so many ways.
