



Deacon Willie Edward Haskins Sr., son of the late Calvin and Mary Ella Harris was born December 31, 1915 in Durham, North Carolina. He was called to be with his heavenly father at 8:20 in the evening on February 16, after a brief illness.

At an early age he accepted Christ into his life and joined Second Baptist Church (now First Calvary). A membership which he held devotedly until illness befell him. For many years he served tirelessly as church clerk; chairman of the Deacon Board, male chorus, trustee board, H.H. Hart Eureka Bible Class, Sunday school teacher, and Church school superintendent. In 1978, he received Calvary a plaque for his over 50 years of dedicated service to his church.

Lyon Park is still today a place of enjoyment for the young and old. Installation of the park brought unity and pride to the neighborhood.

In 1969, the Durham Community Awarded him the Bronze Mayor of Lyon Park. He also served on the Durham Human Relations Committee, the Durham Branch NAACP, and the Lyon Park Senior Citizen Club.


