Her service in key leadership positions in numerous organizations included her devotion as a member of St. Joseph's A.M.E. Church, where she was a member of the Ladies Aid Society, the Mary C. Evans Sunday School Class, the Wednesday Night Bible Study Group and the Senior Choir.

Her career as an elementary school teacher in the Durham City Schools is remembered by countless pupils who returned to thank her for encouraging them to strive for excellence.

Mrs. McLaurin is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Eva Croom and Mrs. Ethel George of Maryville, Tennessee; a son, Robert L. Perry, Durham, NC; and three sisters, Marie Eaton, New York City, NY, Mrs. Viola Pindle and Mrs. Jessie Brown of Durham. Also surviving are two sons-in-law, Edward George and Roscoe Croom of Maryville, Tennessee; a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Annetta B. Perry of Durham; six granddaughters, Nancy Tapp, Kim Hayes, Jennifer F. Spence, Sharon D. Sharpe of Durham and Eva Chambers and Patricia Allen of Iselin, NJ; two grandsons, Paul M. Croom, Maryville, Tennessee and Ronald Croom of Iselin, NJ.





Early Civil Rights Leader Charles A. McLean Dies

WINSTON-SALEM (AP) — Charles A. McLean, one of the early leaders of the civil rights movement in North Carolina, was buried Monday.

McLean was the state field director for the NAACP from 1951 to 1979. He traveled the state investigating charges of racial discrimination and helping establish local NAACP chapters.

McLean, 82, died Thursday after an extended illness.

The Rev. Jerry Drayton, who served as a board member of the local NAACP from the 1940s through the 1970s, said McLean was one of the most dedicated black leaders in the state.

"He was a pioneer at a time when you had to do it at great risk," Drayton said.

McLean was born in Harnett County and attended Hillside High School in Durham before graduating from West Virginia State University in 1935.

He became active in the NAACP after moving to Winston-Salem to work for his father at W.A. McLean and Son Monument Co.
