

Ms. Little was born on April 7, 1929, in Durham to the late Hattie Shaw Peaks and

Theodore Roosevelt Peaks. She was educated in Durham County Public Schools.

Denise L. Harrington, Ms. Little's daughter, said her mother's greatest accomplishment was "being a divorced woman, building her own house, and just surviving on her own, being divorced and having two children."

In 1979, 30 years after graduating from high school, Ms. Little graduated from N.C. Central University.

Ms. Little worked at NCCU for 25 years. While there, she also served as an adviser for the university's cheerleading squad and the collegiate chapter of Delta Sigma Theta sorority.

After retiring from the university in 1992, Ms. Little continued to volunteer with the Durham Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta sorority, serving on the board and in many leadership roles, including treasurer. According to a friend and neighbor, Mudy Stone, Ms. Little was instrumental in getting the Durham Alumnae Delta House Inc. and was an adviser of the collegiate chapter for 15 years.

In 1997, Ms. Little began working for the Durham Police Department's records office. She "was one of the most dedicated workers down there," said Durham police Chief Steve Chalmers.

She "brought something different and unique to the organization," Chief Chalmers said, noting that she was the department's oldest employee and was considered something of a "mother figure" among her coworkers.

In addition, Ms. Little was a member of the District 4 Partners Against Crime and volunteered annually for the Duke Children's Classic charity golf tournament.

Chief Chalmers said he remembered her as always active and that she seemed to be much younger than her 74 years. "She had that youthful charisma about herself," he said. "She will

never be replaced."

Throughout her life, Ms. Little enjoyed and excelled in sports, playing basketball during high school. She was an avid fan of basketball and football, especially the NCCU Eagles. Ms. Little also bowled for more than 30 years and coached children's bowling teams for 20 years.

Her sister, Gertrude P. Burnett, said the two regularly bowled together and were the first African Americans to win the city of Durham's bowling tournament. They also competed in bowling tournaments around the country from 1969 to 2001.

Ms. Little enjoyed traveling, as well, and went to France, Germany and Jamaica with her family.

"I can recall a trip we all took to Jamaica and we rented a villa," said her son-in-law, the Rev. Everett Harrington. "There was a dog who had had some puppies, and she didn't realize that and petted it. It snapped at her and she started chasing it around with a stick and saying she was going to get it. We videotaped that, and watching it still makes me laugh and laugh."

Ms. Little is survived by her siblings Clarabell Amos, 80;

Gertrude P. Burnett, 70; Hattie Mebane, 68; James Peaks, 65; Barbara Peaks Berry, 64; and Dorothy Johnson, 62; all of Durham. She also is survived by her children, Denise L. Harrington of Alpharetta, Ga., and Terrence Orlando Little of Yanceyville; two grandsons, Everett Harrington Jr. and Krestian Harrington; and one greatgrandson, Cameron E. Q. Harrington.
