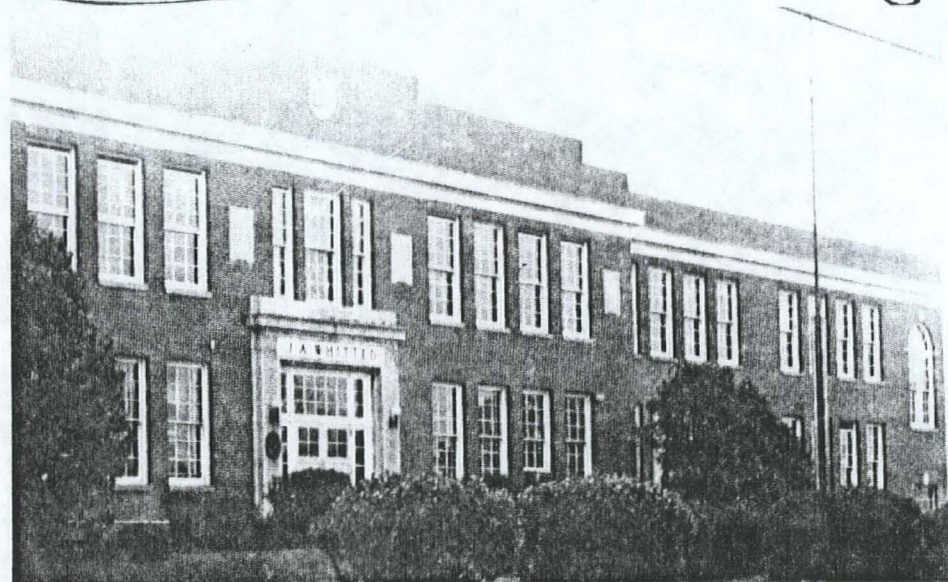

Obituary

A beautiful person in spirit, "Mr. Mac" was loved by all who knew him. Through his thirty-eight years as a teacher, principal and school superintendent, he was instrumental in effecting many innovative educational programs, and he has influenced many young lives through his educational expertise. A true scholar and a genius in the art of human relations, Howard was a diligent worker who stressed dedication and hard work through his service.

Born on July 4, 1928, Howard was educated in the public schools of Durham, N.C., and Fayetteville State, North Carolina Central, Shaw and New York Universities. His professional experience included teacher and coach, Henderson Institute; teacher, assistant principal and principal, J.A. Whitted School; supervisor of adult education program, director of pupil personnel services, director of personnel, and assistant superintendent, Durham City Schools.

Volunteer Services Bureau; Executive Committee, Goodwill Industries, Inc.; Advisory Council, Operation Breakthrough-Headstart; trustee, former Sunday School teacher, former member of Sunday School Orchestra, former manager of Community Center, White Rock Baptist Church; Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity; past potentate, Zafa Temple #176 Shriners; 32 Degree Mason member, Consistory #128; 3rd Degree Mason, Doric #28.

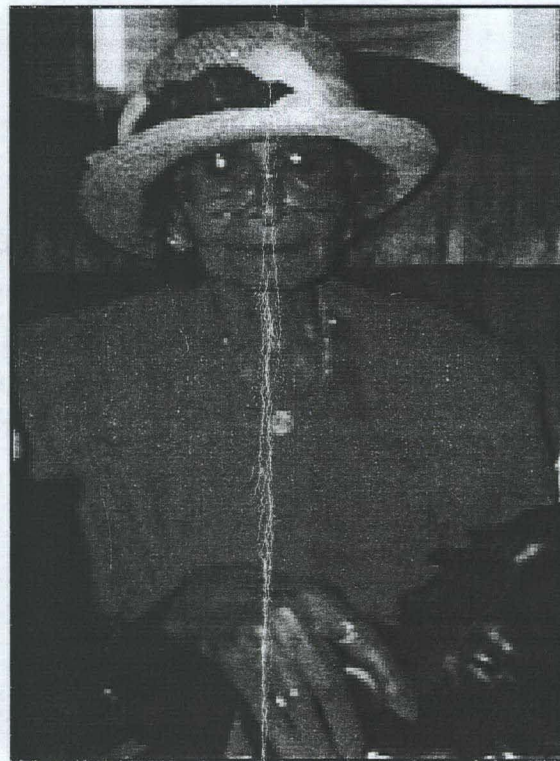
