Charter bus company owner crushed during vehicle repairs

Even at 72 years old, <u>Samuel T. McBroom Sr.</u> still did much of his own maintenance work

HILLSBOROUGH — The owner of a charter bus company was killed Friday morning when one of his buses rolled onto him while he was doing maintenance work underneath it.

Samuel Thomas McBroom Sr., 72, apparently was dead when his son found him under the rear wheels of the full-size bus next door to their home on Station Road. McBroom owned McBroom Coach, a charter bus company.

His son, Samuel Thomas McBroom Jr., walked out of their home at about 11:15 a.m. to go to work in Durham when he saw his father lying under the bus.

"I was praying and hoping that what I was seeing, I wasn't seeing," McBroom Jr. said.

"I ran back and told my mom to call rescue, and then I backed the bus off him," the younger McBroom said.

The last time someone had seen the elder McBroom alive was about 15 minutes earlier, McBroom Jr. said.

The elder McBroom did much of the minor mechanical and maintenance work on the buses himself. He had just sold the bus on which he was working and was getting it ready for the new owner.


Everything about the accident was unusual, his son said. Normally, his father serviced the buses on a flat gravel area beside the house and didn't use a drop cloth, he said.

But on Tuesday, he laid out a blue plastic tarp, then drove the bus on top of the tarp and along a ditch in front of the house, apparently to give him room to crawl under the bus.

McBroom Sr. then placed pieces of railroad ties in front and in back of the tires to keep the bus from rolling. The bus was situated so that the back wheels were at the top of the ditch area. The younger McBroom said he thought the chocks didn't hold because they slipped on the blue plastic tarp.

One of eight brothers, he grew up in Orange County near where the family lives now. He lived with his wife, Annie, and had two grown children and two grandchildren, ages 15 and 10.

She was educated at Barbee's Chapel Elementary School up to 7th grade which was located behind her current home on Barbee's Chapel Road and she went on to Hillside High School in Durham, North Carolina where she graduated.

Mrs. McCallum recounted the inspirational story of how she was so determined to get a college degree that she went to Dr. James Shepard, the president of the National Religious Training School and Chautauqua (now North Carolina Central University). She asked if she could attend the college with what she had saved which was not enough; and she promised to pay later and to make good grades. He told her to keep her money and he gave her a scholarship to go to school. She also got the Durham County School Superintendent to allow her to ride the public school bus to the college. Graduating Magna Cum Laude, she received the Bachelors of Science in Social Studies and Biology in 1941.

In 1945 - 46 as a part of a unique initiative between the University of North Carolina's School of Public Health and North Carolina Central University, Mrs. McCallum received the Master of Science in Public Health Education becoming one of the first black health educators in the state. She also did graduate work at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, UNC at Greensboro and Yale University in Connecticut.

Professionally, she began her career in Edenton, Georgia as a high school teacher for one year. She taught another year at Piney Mountain School and she then taught at Horton High School in Pittsboro, North Carolina.

Her first job after graduate school was in Wayne County, North Carolina as a Health Educator with the school system and the health department. After several years of working with the State Department of Health and Public Instruction, she joined the faculty in the Department of Health Education at North Carolina Central University. She taught classes as well as served as a consultant to the public schools and other organizations in the Durham community. In this capacity, she also served as a liaison between North Carolina Central University and the Population Center at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Mrs. McCallum retired in 1974 after 32 years with the state.

Mrs. McCallum was very active in several organizations, both locally and statewide. 
