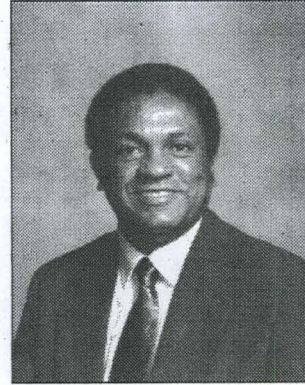

peace."

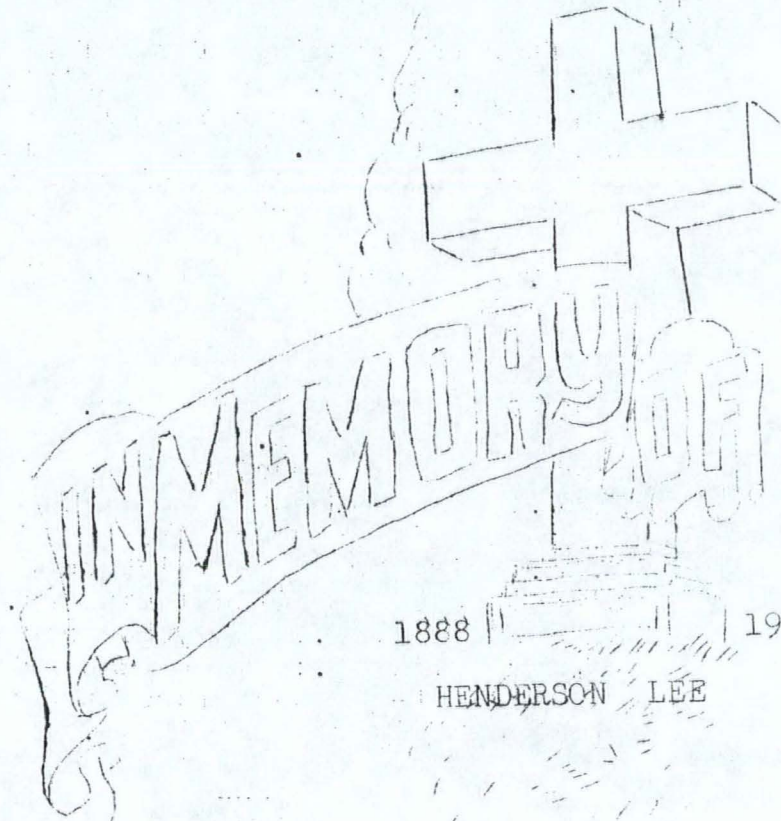

Mrs. Jeanette Allen Lee, the daughter of the late John Allen and the late Lessie Bass Allen, began her journey in life in Rougemont, Durham County, NC. She was the fourth of four children.

Her early education was received in the Durham County Public School System and she was graduated from Little River High School, Bahama, NC. She received her B.S. and M.S. degrees from North Carolina Central University, Durham, NC and studied further at Indiana University, Bloomington, IN and the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, Greensboro, NC.

She joined the Saint Paul's College family, Lawrenceville, VA in 1961 after having taught in the public schools of North Carolina and Virginia from 1955 until 1961. For over twenty years, young ladies lived in her home so that they would have the opportunity to receive a college education. Her life was one of service, dedication and love.

MRS. ANNIE MAGGIE MOORE LENNON, daughter of the Reverend Daniel J. and Mrs. Francenia Mitchell Moore, was born in Columbus County, North Carolina. She was educated in the public schools of her community.

She was married to Montgomery Lennon; to this union two children were born. After the passing of her husband and children Mrs. Lennon moved, in September 1909 to Durham to become a member of the family of Dr. A. M. and Mrs. Cottie S. Moore. She remained in the Moore home for forty two years, caring for the members of the immediate family, for a number of relatives from the home community who came to Durham for education and employment, and for several young businessmen who resided with the Moores at the beginning of their careers in the city's fast-growing business community. She was exceedingly proud of the achievements and successes of her "boys."

For many years she served on its Baptismal and Communion Committees; she was Superintendent of the Primary Department of its Sunday School, Treasurer of the Sunday School Forum, and Treasurer of District Four.

In this respect, he served as former president of the City Schools System Parent-Teacher Council, the Durham County Human Relations Commission, the North Carolina Agriculture Teachers Association, Chairman of the Retired Senior Citizens Volunteer Program, Troy House and Family Counseling Services.

This was JOHN DOUGLAS LENNON, the manner of the man, giant-like in SERVICE.

His places among us may be substituted, but they can never be filled. Only seldom can one so gifted, so willing, so tenacious, so dedicated pass our way.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Thelma Cumbo Lennon; two daughters, Mrs. Carolyn Shannon of Los Angeles and Mrs. Marjorie Paul of Miami; four sisters Mrs. Jessie Jacobs of Wilmington, Miss Mamie Lennon, Dr. Marjorie Zobier and Mrs. Elizabeth Martin, all of New York City, ten nieces and nephews.

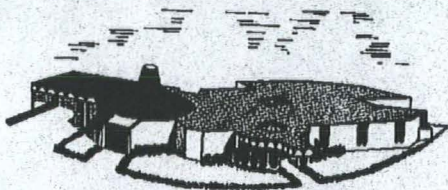

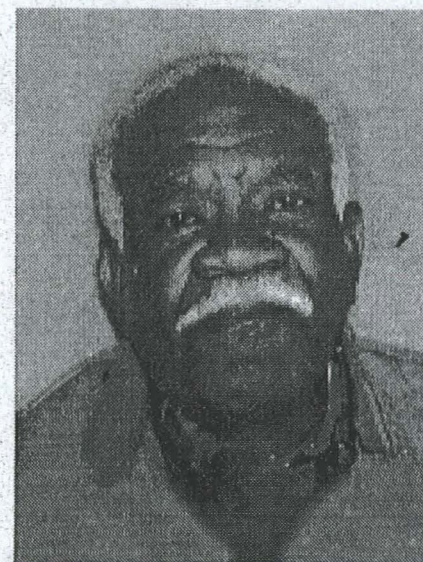
