DAVIS BUCHANNAN MARTIN

BORN: May 1, 1899, Albany, Georgia, the son of J. H. and Mattie Bailey Martin.

EDUCATION: Completed grammar courses in Albany public schools, high school at Georgia State Normal and Industrial Institute and college at Lincoln University, Pennsylvania.

MARRIED: On August 14, 1929, he married Miss Theola Green of Oxford, who was his helpmate and inspiration until his death.

WORK AND ACHIEVEMENT: He taught Latin and English at Kittrell College and Hillside High School before entering the life insurance business. On September 6, 1926, he joined the Field Staff of North Carolina Mutual as a Special Agent on the Albany, Georgia, District. He was transferred to the Home Office September 12, 1927 and assigned to the Industrial Department, later becoming Chief Clerk of that Department. On January 14, 1946, he was appointed Assistant to the Agency Director. He was elected a member of the Official Staff of the Company on January 13, 1947 and advanced to the position of Associate Agency Director March 11, 1953, serving in this capacity until his death.

OTHER BUSINESS AND CIVIC AFFILIATIONS: Mr. Martin was a member of the Board of Directors of the Mutual Savings and Loan Association and the John Avery Boys' Club. He was a member of St. Joseph's A. M. E. Church, having served for eight years as Superintendent of its Sunday School and was a Class Leader until the time of his death. He was a Mason, a Shriner, member of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Durham Business and Professional Chain, Durham Committee on Negro Affairs, Durham County Democratic Executive Committee and Chairman of the Whitted School Precinct.

BEREAVED: He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Theola Martin; one daughter, Carolyn Patricia; three sons, Davis B., Jr., Joseph Henry, and Winfred Augustus; Mrs. Mary Martin, stepmother, Albany, Georgia; Arthur Gibson, half brother, Columbus, Ohio; a grandson, and other relatives, friends and associates.

MRS. FLORENCE SELF HUDSON MARTIN was born in Hemingway, South Carolina November 17, 1899, the daughter of the late Monroe and Sarah Owens Self. She departed this life on Tuesday, April 18, 1972 in Lincoln Hospital.

She was reared in Hemingway, where she attended grade school and high school. In 1919 she married the late Reverend Meredith Hudson. To this union, four children were born, three of whom preceeded her in death. After the death of the Reverend Hudson, she moved to North Carolina with her brothers and sisters and two small children. Here she met and married the late Clinton Martin.

She was a faithful and devoted Christian, joining the Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church in the early 1940's. She was a charter member of the Cox Memorial Free Will Baptist Church where she attended regularly until ill health prevented her attendance. She was a faithful member of the Senior Choir for several years.

When she first came to Durham, she sought and found employment at the American Tobacco Company as a seasonal worker. She remained in the employment of this company until the seasonal job was discontinued. She was then hired as a seasonal worker at the W. L. Robinson Tobacco Company until her retirement, as the result of illness. Throughout her illness "Granny" as she was affectionately known remained cheerful even though pain was etched in her face. She was a source of comfort whenever it was needed.

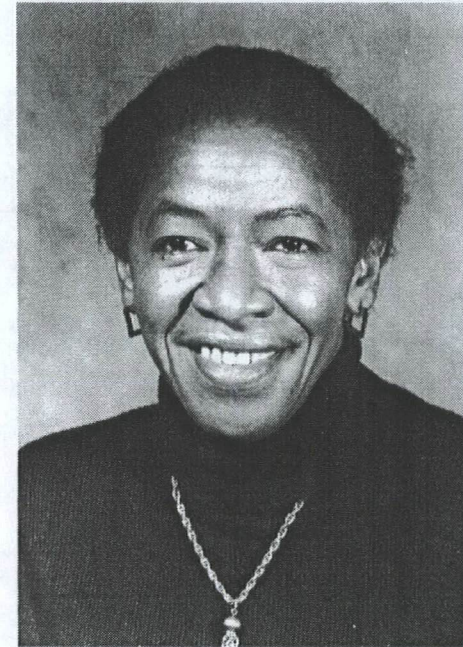

OBITUARY

MRS. WINNIE CHAMBERS MARTIN, daughter of the late Westley and Carrie Chambers, was born on January 26, 1921 in Mt. Gilead, North Carolina. She died on July 10, 1996.

Winnie was educated in the Montgomery County Schools and continued her education in later life at Durham Technical Institute. For a number of years, she was a cook in the Burton Elementary School cafeteria where she became well known to students and teachers alike who remembered her and whom she remembered all through her life. She retired in 1985 as Receptionist from the Foundation for Research on the Nature of Man (Institute for Parapsychology); she was recognized for her work and loyalty to the organization.

At a young age she joined the McCauley Memorial AME Zion Church in Mt. Gilead and on moving to Durham, she became a member of White Rock Baptist Church where she remained faithful for almost fifty years. She was a member of the Gospel Choir, the Tempie Whitted Bible Class, and the College View District.

In the early 1970's, Winnie became a dedicated community leader as an advocate for public housing residents. She was instrumental in the growth and development of the McDougald Terrace Tenants Council, the Durham Tenant Steering Committee, and was chairperson of the Durham Housing Authority Tenant Grievance Committee. She was also a member of several national housing organizations, and travelled frequently to the nation's capitol to represent the interests of public housing residents at congressional meetings. The picture on this program was taken during this time which she considered to be one of the most rewarding and productive periods of her life. She received several awards for her work from the City of Durham Housing Authority and she was selected as a "Woman of the Year" by the Today's Woman Organization.

In 1985 her health began to fail and she faced many debilitating illnesses. She was blessed, however, with strength, courage and the faith to endure until the end. God lifted her up many times when it was thought that death had her in its grasp. She became known as the "miracle woman" and her strength was an inspiration to many. She finally asked God to bring her home and He did. To God be the glory!

She was the mother of four children; Ulysses Martin, Jr. preceded her in death and she leaves to mourn her passing Mary Martin of Durham, Carolyn Martin of Mitchellville, Maryland, and William Martin of College Park, Georgia. She is also survived by five grand children, David Ruffner of Virginia, Yashante S. Martin and Anwar K. Murray Joseph Marvin

Murray Joseph Marvin was born June 15, 1913 to the late Iona Gee and Murray J. Marvin Sr. in Green County, Ohio. He died September 24, 1979.

He was a graduate of West Virginia State College and the University of Chicago, where he received the Masters of Business Administration degree. He also attended General Theological Seminary in New York City where he cultivated an interest in theology that he nurtured throughout his life. He was an active churchman, serving as a member of the Vestry at St. Titus Episcopal Church in Durham and as a licensed Lay Reader. He also was a member of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew.

Mr. Marvin's professional career was a broad one, as befitted a man with varied interests. During World War II, he was a correspondent and photographer with the Public Information Office at the Naval Training Center at Great Lakes, Illinois. He later was assigned to travel with Lester Granger, a civilian aide to the Secretary of the Navy, who was investigating the conditions of black troops in the Pacific area.

Following the war, he became public relations director for a management firm in Chicago, but in 1947 formed his own public and industrial relations consulting firm in Chicago, with his wife, Delores, as his business partner.

For eleven years he served with distinction as executive director of the National Insurance Association, headquartered in Chicago, and left in 1961 to join North Carolina Mutual as planning director. One of his first and perhaps most important assignments was to serve as the company's representative during the construction of North Carolina Mutual's home office building at Mutual Plaza.

He was named vice president of the company in 1970, and senior vice president, director of corporate planning and communications in 1977.

Mr. Marvin was a member of numerous professional, civic and social organizations. Among those in which he was most active were the Board of Directors of the North Carolina School of the Arts Foundation, the Governor's Business Council on the Arts and Humanities and the American Dance Festival Association.

At the time of his death, Mr. Marvin was nearing completion of an assignment as leader of a task force charged with developing a new management information system for North Carolina Mutual.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Delores Marvin; a sister, Mrs. Pauline M. Coffee of Atlanta; an aunt, Mrs. Mary Gray of Ohio; and several nieces and nephews.

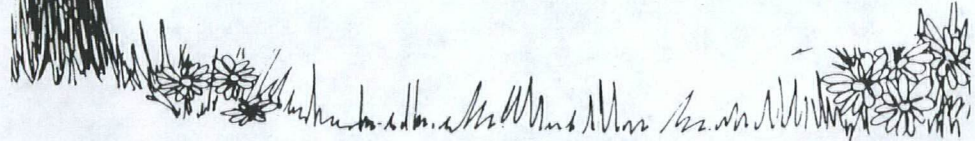
