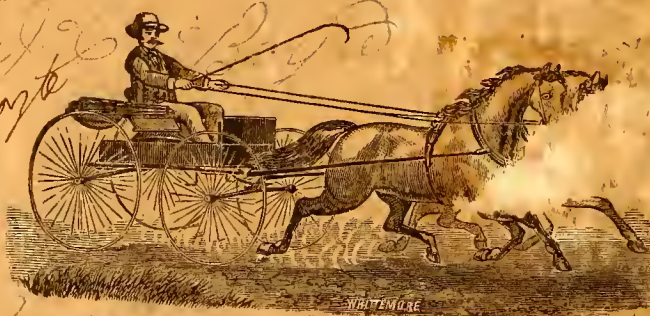

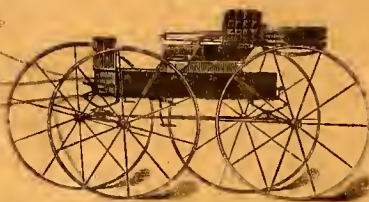

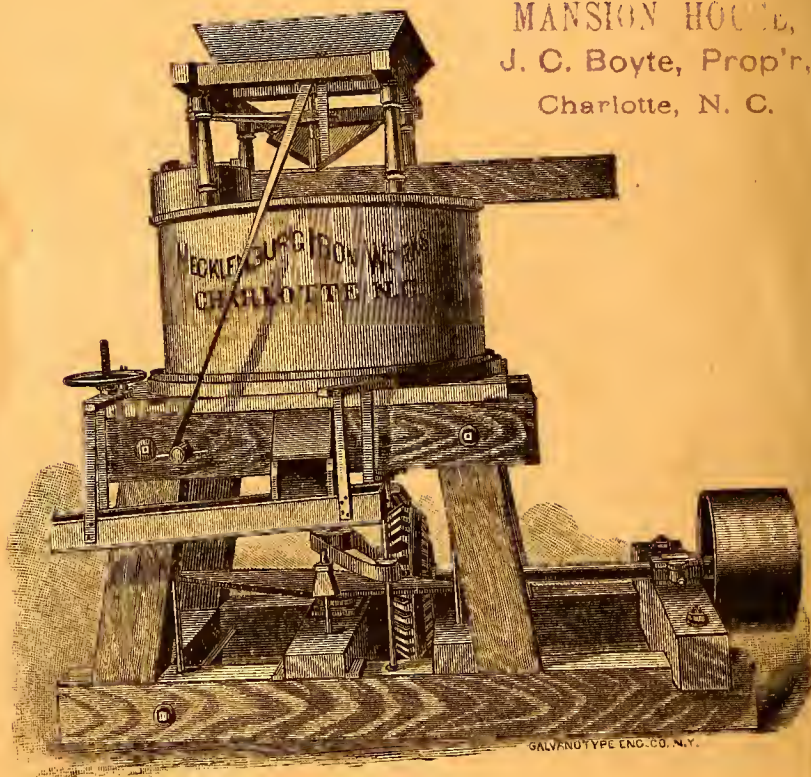

Supreme Court.

Wm. N. H. Smith, of Raleigh, Chief Justice; Joseph J. Davis, of Franklin, and A. S. Merrimon, of Raleigh, Associate Justices; T. F. Davidson, of Buncombe, Reporter; T. S. Kenan, of Raleigh, Clerk; Robert H. Bradley, of Raleigh, Marshal.

The Supreme Court meets in Raleigh on the first Mondays in February and October of each year, and its sessions continue until its business is disposed of.

Criminal Court.

This court is composed of the counties of Mecklenburg and New Hanover, Oliver P. Meares, Judge; B. R. Moore, solicitor, and John W. Dunham, clerk, for New Hanover; G. E. Wilson, solicitor, and T. R. Robertson, clerk, for Mecklenburg.

Superior Courts.

The State is divided into twelve Judicial Districts, and for each a judge and Solicitor are elected by the voters of the State at large, who are required by the constitution to reside in their respective districts.

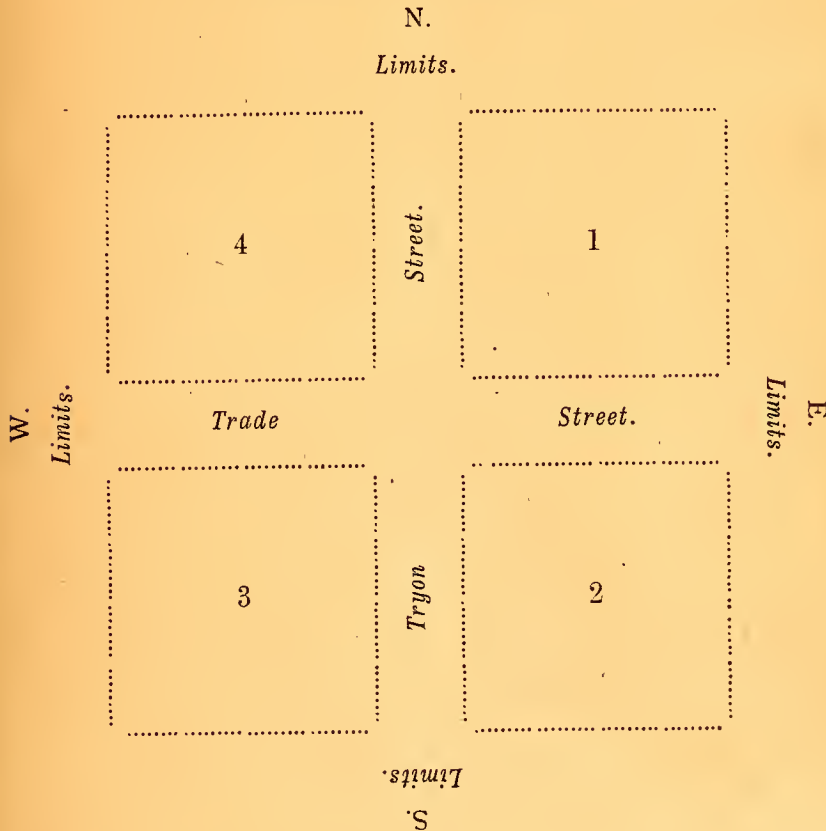
