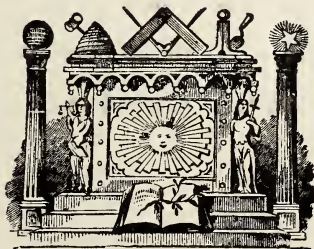

The Grand Master delivered his Annual Address, as follows, and referred the same to a special committee composed of Bre. John Nichols, P. G. M., James Southgate, and Samuel H. Rountree :

Brethren of the Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

It seems but yesterday when we were last here assembled. Yet another year has passed, and with it how much of good and evil. How much of joy and sorrow, of success and reverse, of prosperity and adversity, it were fruitless to endeavor a detail. Wisdom dictates that we profit by our experiences of sorrows, adversities, and reverses, by a proper application of the means suggested by those experiences, to their remedy in the future, and that we rejoice at the measure of prosperity, success and joy which hath fallen to our lot, both as men and as masons. The thanksgiving to the Almighty, our common Father, which we have just rendered, through our Grand Chaplain, met, I hope, a hearty and sincere response from every heart, thanksgiving for our preservation, for the blessings of life which He has bestowed, and especially for having permitted so many of us to re-assemble from all parts of our jurisdiction, around the Altar of Masonry to enjoy the highest and purest of earthly pleasures, the communion of brethren. Let our prayers ascend for His blessing upon our present convention, that He may guide our deliberations, and strengthen and support us by the power of His might, to the end that our order may be enlarged in usefulness, encouraged in its mission, and the name of the Most High exalted and glorified in us.

While we greet each other in joy at our re-union, while we feel the warm, fraternal grasp—in the midst of rejoicing we sorrow for many whom we loved, and whose memory we revere, now in the icy grasp of death.

Past Grand Master, Clement H. Jordan, Joseph H. Separk, Grand Tiler, and Thomas W. Dewey, Grand High Priest, have died. We hope that death was a kind messenger sent to translate them from this troublesome, transitory, existence to that blissful, eternal, one, where the Supreme Grand Master of Heaven and Earth is Lord of all, in whose presence is joy for ever more.

At every re-union we have to mourn for some of our loved ones; in every annual address there is the obitua. Every day death claims

some for his own. His sway is universal—his claims take no denial.

“No spot on earth but has supplied a grave,
And Human skulls the spacious ocean have.”

While we are taught to regard death as the pilot that shall guide our barques through the narrows into the *Haven* of rest, the broad ocean of eternity, and his coming as the “prelude of repose, the dawn of bliss, the twilight of our woes;” yet “’tis a dread and awful thing to die,” and there are few who can contemplate it with other than feelings of horror and dismay.

“Let us then, in view of the unsubstantial nature of all human pursuits, the certainty of death, the uncertainty of life, not fail to improve the opportunity which these reflections present, of preparation for Eternity.” We know not on whom the icy hand may next fall.

I have not been able to obtain data from which to make suitable mention of P. G. M. Jordan, whose private worth and high Masonic character demand more than a passing notice. The Grand Lodge will pay proper tribute to his memory.

Bro. Thomas W. Dewey died in Charlotte, on the 4th August last, in the meridian of his life and in the midst of his usefulness. He had just been elected to the position of Grand High Priest of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of North Carolina. I well remember the last time I saw him; how full of hope he was of a joyful re-union at Charlotte next June; within two months he joins the departed. A zealous mason, a genial, whole souled companion, a public spirited, useful, citizen, few men had more or warmer friends—few who so well deserved them.

Bro. Joseph H. Separk, our Grand Tiler, died on the 30th of August, 1875. Though in subordinate position in the Grand Lodge, yet he was universally beloved by the fraternity, and by all who knew him, and in our hearts he held a high place. By his inflexible integrity, sterling worth and indomitable energy he raised himself from the position of a poor apprentice boy to that of highest esteem in the hearts of his fellow citizens.

He was once selected by the political party to which he belonged as its candidate for the position of Superintendent of Public Works, and at the time of his death was Mayor of the City of Raleigh. As a private citizen, a public man, a mason, and a member of the Church, he had the confidence and respect of all who knew him.

DECISIONS.

The correspondence of the Grand Master has been quite voluminous,

the greater part unimportant to the craft in general. Much of it might have been saved had the correspondents availed themselves of the means of information which might have been reached by the slightest investigation. A large number of the questions presented had their solution in the Uniform Code of By-Laws adopted for Subordinate Lodges, a larger number in the Constitution, By-Laws and Resolutions of the Grand Lodge; and a great many had previously been decided by my predecessors.

I will submit a few of the decisions made by me for the purpose of having them reviewed by the Grand Lodge:

1. In answer to enquiries made by five Masters of Lodges, I held that no man so maimed as to be unable to learn, teach and exemplify the work, could be made a mason. Hence the loss of leg, or arm, the sense of seeing, hearing or feeling, would disqualify.

2. To a large number, as to the status of non-affiliates, I replied by referring to the resolutions on the subject passed by the last Grand Lodge; which gives them no right save that of petition.

3. That dimitts granted before the passage of the resolution above referred to, with the condition precedent as before required, did not sever the connection of the brother holding it, from the Lodge granting, until the condition had been complied with. That his membership still existed, intact, with the Lodge granting, which carried mutual obligation of the member to the Lodge and the Lodge to the member.

4. That a mason, having taken a dimit before the last session of the Grand Lodge with the intent to affiliate with a Lodge nearer his place of residence, or to join in petition for dispensation for a new Lodge, is not debarred of any right he may have of preferring charge, or having difficulty between himself and a member of the Lodge with which he proposes to affiliate, investigated before he offers to affiliate.

5. A mason dimitted since last Grand Lodge cannot prefer charges against an affiliate, but he may give information which should be acted upon by the Lodge, if the nature of the offense be such as to work scandal or reproach upon the fraternity; but not if the charge be to gratify a private animosity or avenge a personal pique or individual quarrel.

6. To several enquiries answer was made that the Worshipful Master, Senior or Junior Warden, after installation, could not resign or dimit, and in one case, where the Worshipful Master had done so, I declared his action contrary to law, and that of the Lodge in accepting and granting as null and void, and directed that the record be expunged. The Master, so acting, did so, I am satisfied, believing his

action was warranted by law, and for the best interests of the craft, and was influenced by circumstances which he deemed justifiable. He is one for whom I have high personal regard, and whose masonic worth is known and has been recognized by this Grand Lodge. He protests against my action. To the Grand Lodge I submit my decision for confirmation or reversal.

7. That a motion to "lay on table" is admissible in Masonic bodies, according to invariable precedent and general parliamentary law.

8. That Lodge-rooms should be used exclusively for Masonic purposes. Their use for balls, parties, &c., should be forbidden. Joint proprietorship with other societies is not favored, though this may be regulated by each Lodge according to its circumstances and surroundings.

9. That a Subordinate Lodge may proceed to receive and act upon the petition for affiliation of a Master Mason whose Lodge has become defunct, without the certificate of the Grand Secretary, as provided by resolution, of satisfactory evidence from the Grand Secretary that such certificate cannot be given by reason of loss of the records by fire, or otherwise.

10. That the jurisdiction of Lodges, in adjoining villages is, in respect to the villages, confined to their own corporate limits. As to material out of and beyond the town lines the rule as to proximity by nearest route of travel, prevails; e. g. the Lodge situate in Salem cannot use material resident in Winston (an adjoining town) without the consent of the Lodge in Winston.

11. Non-payment of a debt, from one brother to another, unaccompanied with any fraudulent intent, is not sufficient ground on which to base a charge of unmasonic conduct.

The unfortunate circumstances of a brother should call for commiseration rather than a visitation of punishment.

12. The only prohibition as to investment or appropriation of the funds of a Lodge, is as to those derived from initiation fees. Therefore a Lodge may appropriate funds arising from dues or subscription to the purchase of stock in the Masonic Temple Association.

13. Accused cannot testify in his own behalf, the Lodge may hear his statement, giving to it such weight as it deserves.

The testimony of a freedman is competent, taken as the testimony of other profanes. As to the credibility of any testimony the Lodge must be the judge, from the character of the witness, his demeanor, and general bearing on the stand.

14. That testimony taken in a civil suit is not competent, and cannot be read in evidence against one accused of Masonic crime in a trial

by a Lodge, nor can the letters of a non-resident in answer to questions touching the case, unless by the consent of the accused and the Lodge. Conviction by the civil courts does not, of course, carry conviction by the Lodge. The mason, under charges, must be tried according to Masonic usages.

15. That a petition for the degrees must be presented at a regular meeting and lie over a month, under reference to the usual committee of enquiry into character. Being about to travel to be absent several months is not such an emergency as would justify the suspension of the law by dispensation, except, perhaps, in the case of a young man who had just attained majority. The sudden discovery of "a favorable opinion of the Ancient Institution" on the eve of a journey, smacks rather much of a desire for the secrets of masonry for other purposes than a desire for knowledge. Masonry is designed for the education and enlightenment of its votaries, and not for convenience solely.

16. That a unanimous ballot was necessary to restore an expelled or suspended Mason. He should not expect higher privilege than one holding in his hand a certificate of his being in good standing in his former Lodge.

17. That the marriage of a Mason's widow annuls her claims as such to Masonic charity, but does not affect the rights of the children.

18. That no one has a right to question a brother's vote on petition for degrees or membership, no one has any right to know how another voted. It is unmasonic to disclose how any one voted or to exhibit his ballot that it may be known.

19. Non-age of applicant, good ground for adverse report of committee of enquiry, petition filed and referred must take the regular course, it cannot be withdrawn.

20. A levy of a tax by way of contribution for a benevolent object is not unconstitutional.

21. The resolution forbidding Mock Masonic burial, has been repealed. It should not be favored except under peculiar circumstances.

22. A charge once preferred and filed by the Lodge over the signature of a Master Mason, must take the regular course of trial prescribed; the subsequent preferring of charges against the Master Mason signing the first does not hinder the prosecution.

WORK.

I felt justified by the action of the last Grand Lodge (see page 41, Proceedings of 1874,) in discarding the interpolations and addenda to

the work and lectures, and in declaring that taught by Stevenson as the Ancient Work of Masonry, and that intended by the Grand Lodge to be taught and practiced. In the convention of Grand Lectures it was agreed that all who desired to teach would first qualify themselves by immediately learning the work. Upon examination and comparison it was found that Brethren Samuel H. Rountree and Bernice Walker, of those present, had the work in its original purity as taught by Stevenson. They were then appointed custodians upon whose certificate commissions would be issued. Upon this recommendation commissions were issued to brethren W. F. Davis, Thomas Palmer and T. M. Gardner. Upon proper recommendation I afterwards commissioned Bro. C. D. Rice. The action taken has received the approbation of the large mass of old Masons, from many of whom I have received letters commendatory of the action looking to the re-establishment of the ancient work.

Uniformity in work throughout the jurisdiction is what we sincerely desire, but will be hard of attainment unless the ancient work is insisted upon and its practice by the Lodges enforced by proper legislation. The work of masonry, its language and symbolism, is intended to teach and impress upon the mind of the student the holy principles of our order. The hand of the innovator destroys the beauty of our order, and the hallowed sanctity with which its antiquity of style impresses the mind.

The ancient work, as taught by Stevenson, is simple, plain and grammatical; unencumbered by useless ceremony, and teaching the doctrines and pure principles of masonry in unmistakable language, while its traditional and historical narratives are presented in no doubtful form, and the student readily reads not only the event, but the grand principle intended to be illustrated from the symbols and ceremonies used.

Let us revive the office of Grand Lecturer for the State at large, giving to him plenary powers as to instructing and appointing District Lecturers. Let him be one who knows the ancient work, not only in the letter of the esoteric, but who apprehends and can teach its cryptic import.

Let him be the custodian of the work, entrusted with its dissemination through District Lecturers to be appointed on his recommendation,—thus to perpetuate the *work*, the ancient work,—not to change or amend. Unless there be some head centre especially entrusted with this department and duty, and efficiently armed by proper legislation for enforcing conformity, we may as well despair of ever attaining uniformity. He might be charged with another duty, one which is

very important and should be in competent hands, that of recommendation for dispensation for new Lodges. As now existing, that duty falls upon the nearest Lodge, which under the solemn sanction of its seal, declares to the Grand Master that the officers, "or at least the Master," of the proposed new Lodge have been found "to be well skilled in the *ritual* and *laws* of masonry." Upon this, every thing else being regular, the Grand Master causes dispensation to issue *empowering* the dispensing of the true light of masonry in a new Lodge, declaring that, reposing special trust and confidence in their zeal and masonic knowledge, he does so. Now, I am persuaded that he does so on trust, for he cannot have occupied the Grand Master's chair very long before he finds that very few of the chartered Lodges are competent judges of what is a proper knowledge of the ritual and laws of masonry.

Our Lodges are becoming too much enlightened to be satisfied with parrot teaching, and will not brook instruction from persons who cannot do more than give the mere verbiage of the ceremony. If we cannot have instruction of the right kind, if our intelligent young men, who are daily coming into our ranks, cannot be made to see some thing more in our rites than mere ceremony, if they are not so instructed as that the beautiful and holy principles of masonry will be unfolded and made to shine through every symbol, the whole becomes to him unmeaning jargon, and he votes the Lodge-room a bore and masonry a cheat. That follows complaints of luke-warmness in all the activities which engage the masonic heart and hand, inattention to the plainest requirements of duty—then defection and masonic crime.

We should have more frequent meetings of the Lodges, this the membership would desire if they were instructed in the work, and apprehended its import. Members would be glad when the day and hour of meeting arrived, if they knew that on the opening of the Lodge they were to receive instruction. Lectures on the cardinal virtues, the five human senses, the seven liberal arts and sciences, might be made to interest as well as instruct. The monitorial part of the second degree furnishes food for a wide range of study. Yet how few ever read it even to the candidate while taking the degree. Let us have such meetings as these remarks indicate and suggest, and we would soon have Lodges full of active, useful, energetic members; the unworthy and useless would find no congeniality within such walls, and they would soon be made to sever their connection, and thus make pure our rolls. Our works of benevolence—the true work of masonry—would be fostered and maintained, our light made to shine and the world to see that masons are what they profess to be. Our reference

committees would be courts of equity to whom every grievance might be referred and settled with satisfaction. Masons might thus shun the Court House, and much ill and hardship be avoided. Then, indeed, we would be a band bound together by the "indissoluble chain of sincere affection" among whom there would be no contention, save that justifiable emulation as to who can best work and agree, and united by a sincere attachment and pleasure reciprocally communicated. Then virtue, luminous as the sun at meridian, would shine refulgent on the mind, enliven the heart and elevate and mature us in knowledge.

I very much favor the call made by the Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Florida for a convention of Grand Masters, looking to the adoption of Uniformity of Work. While the end may not be practicable, yet, in such a convention much might be done to protect masonry against imposture. Such is our connection, every section with the other, that a common bond ought to be established whereby we may more perfectly know each other. The Grand Master of Florida has issued a circular letter calling for such a convention to meet in Jacksonville on the 15th inst. Should there be evidence of a pretty general acquiescence, we should not fail of representation there. Mutual fraternal interchange of sentiments in such a friendly, social meeting could not fail of good results, in promoting harmony and the cultivation of the brotherly element so peculiarly ours.

DISCIPLINE.

In conformity to the recommendation of the Committee on Propositions and Grievances, adopted by the Grand Lodge at its last session, (see pages 47 and 48), I gave notice to the Worshipful Master of Blue Lodge, No. 287, to show cause why the charter of said Lodge should not be forfeited. He answered fully, frankly, and explicitly, fully exonerating his Lodge from any criminality in the proceedings which were the subject of complaint. His answer shows that his Lodge was not perfectly familiar with the rules of procedure in the conduct of masonic trial, and there were some irregularities. Were we to withdraw charters for such cause, I regret to say we would have a much more scattering roll than we now have.

I find that in matters of discipline Lodges are alarmingly loose. There is too much disposition to wink at the short comings of their members. It must be remedied. Our halls must be purified,—purged of that which give offence to the pure masonic principle. One Lodge with twenty pure men, exemplifying in their walk the doctrines we profess,

is worth more than fifty with hundreds on their rolls, immoral, dissolute, inattentive to masonic duty, condemning masonic requirement. With proper enforcement of discipline by the Lodges we would hear less complaint about luke-warmness of the membership. Our halls would become attractive retreats and the great objects we profess to foster would flourish, and good men who are now kept out of our councils would flock to us. Want of familiarity with procedure, I am satisfied, has been the reason for much neglect of discipline. That reason should now vanish, for there is now furnished the desideratum.

THE MASONIC CODE OF NORTH CAROLINA.

This work is the final result of a resolution introduced several years ago, looking to the compilation of a hand-book for the guide of Lodges in Masonic law. I cannot better say than has Bro. Bain what the volume contains. He says in the preface: "It embraces the Constitution and laws of the Grand Lodge, the Ancient Constitution and Charges, all public ceremonies, and necessary blank forms used by Lodges."

It will be seen at a glance that it was a work involving great labor, research, and knowledge of masonic law. He has from the past legislation of the Grand Lodge, from its by-laws and resolutions, eliminated the law as now existing, arranged the various subjects under appropriate sections, and perfectly digested the crude mass into intelligible, legal and masonic phraseology, and with the index we may, with readiness, turn to any subject. Too high praise cannot be awarded for the faithfulness with which the work has been done, and, I might almost say, the exquisite taste in its arrangement and order.

It will relieve Masters and other officers of Lodges of much work in the performance of their duties, and save them the trouble of correspondence with the Grand Master; and to a very great extent aid the Grand Master. Let it be adopted by the Grand Lodge as the law, and then let every Lodge, Master, and intelligent mason obtain copies, and make the work a hand-book indeed. Let the Grand Secretary be rewarded for his labor, by seeing the result appreciated by the fraternity; and by proper compensation by order of the Grand Lodge. He makes no charge. He is entitled to wages.

OUR PERIODICALS.

The *Masonic Journal*, published at Greensboro', and the *Orphans' Friend*, at Oxford, should receive the patronage of every mason. The one to discuss and promulgate questions which pertain to masonry in general, to chronicle the movements of the order, to serve as a means

for the more general diffusion of masonic intelligence, and as a vehicle for communication among the brotherhood,—that it may be such in every sense it should be the weekly masonic visitor to every one desiring such intelligence and communication. The other, established and published by the Orphan Asylum, is the medium through which we are informed of the progress of the work, its nature, needs and necessities. No mason having the interest of the craft at heart, and wishing to keep abreast with all the events of the day in the masonic sphere, can afford to be deprived of either. Besides being means of communication these papers contain most wholesome reading matter for the family—particularly for children; and now, when there is such a flood of pernicious publications insinuating their way into notice, it is particularly incumbent upon all desiring the preservation of purity of thought and the inculcation of right sentiment, to choose well what may tend to encourage and develop a pure, healthy, moral literature.

I am glad to know that both papers are meeting with merited success. Let us give them such an impetus at this meeting as that abundant prosperity may crown their efforts.

DISPENSATIONS.

I have caused to be issued dispensations for the establishment of nine new Lodges, which will be particularly referred to by the Grand Secretary.

I deputed P. G. M. Nichols to dedicate and consecrate to masonic purposes the Masonic Temple in Charlotte, and Bro. S. S. Everitt, W. M., of St. John's Lodge, No. 1, to lay the corner-stone of the Temple of Israel in the city of Wilmington, and I am happy to state that the manner in which they performed their duties did honor to themselves and credit to the fraternity.

I have issued a large number of dispensations, authorizing the election and installation of officers where the same had not been done at a proper time.

Upon proper recommendation I appointed Bro. Richard T. Turner, of Savannah, Georgia, to represent our Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of Georgia.

ORPHAN ASYLUMS.

No subject can engage our attention which is more important, more sacred, more peculiarly the work of masons, than that of the maintenance of the Orphan Asylums. I regard their sustenance as the Grand test of the sincerity of our attachment to the great principles taught by Masonry. We are heralded to the world by our published works,

through our journals, and our orators on festive occasions, as a great benevolent institution founded on the principles of Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. We declare that Charity is the chief round in the ladder which extends from Earth to Heaven. In our halls these principles are taught, and by the beautiful symbolism of our ritual are continually impressed upon our minds. If, then, when these are the principles we publish as being the ground work of the order, and on this foundation there have been established homes for destitute orphans, a class peculiarly the charge of masons, if, when we tell the world that charity is the grand moving principle on which we lay claim to recognition, we permit these institutions to languish or to continue to be piteous, pleading, beggars, we should hang our heads in shame.

Of the one hundred and fifty-six answers by Masters of Lodges to a circular letter on the subject of the support of the orphan work, I am happy to say that very few showed disinclination to continue the work, many deplored their inability to do as much as they desired, promising more activity in the future. Some favored legislation looking to a more general participation in the burthen of supporting this charity by levying a tax upon the Subordinate Lodges. Some favored the making the work in its operations strictly masonic, and there were some growlers and complainers. There were those who thought charity ought to begin at home. For those who answered not at all I can make no record, except, that, their silence shows such forgetfulness of obligation that we cannot expect much co-operation from them, and just here I would say that legislation should be had defining in what way the Grand Master may rebuke such contempt of his authority.

After carefully comparing and digesting the views of the answering lodges, I am of opinion that it is the wish of the majority that the orphan work shall not be circumscribed in its usefulness, that while it is peculiarly masonic, and its support ought chiefly to come from masons, yet such is the character of its recognition from without, that, if masonic charity permitted, we should not take from it the high character we have impressed upon it, that of a general benevolent and charitable enterprise.

It is gratifying that every year we see manifested more interest in its success in every quarter. Churches, conventions, associations, conferences, the press, all now lend their aid in furthering the work. And I cannot leave this part of the address without grateful notice of the act of the Governor calling attention to this object, in his thanksgiving proclamation, as one worthy of the thank-offerings of the various congregations of the State, and to return thanks for the liberality with which response was made. May we not hope that it may be the precursor of more material endorsement and aid?

Let us not abate in zeal for this, the crowning glory of North Carolina Masonry, but rather let us push it with the energy which its importance demands, and its sacredness and our honor require. Let us persevere until all shall recognize, aid and encourage the manumission of the helpless orphan from a thralldom which, in some instances, is ignoble and degrading.

To the recommendations of the Superintendent I beg special attention, as being far more worthy of consideration than any thing I might say.

I regret very much that he has intimated, more than once, a wish to retire from office at the close of this term. I do hope such considerations may be presented as will induce him to continue. I know it must be a position full of care and perplexity, one from which anyone might well shrink from assuming, yet it is one of highest importance, promising higher rewards than perhaps any other save that of proclaiming the glad tidings of salvation; one which Bro. Mills has honored by self-sacrificing devotion, unfaltering faith and unwearied effort. He has shown to the people the claims of the orphans upon them; he has shown them that the 'Orphans have rights which all good people are bound to defend.' He has so labored as that their claims are being heard, and we may confidently hope the day is not far distant when proper provision shall be made for their relief. They are as much entitled to the fostering care of the State as those who are bereft of reason, or the deaf, dumb, and blind, and the work set on foot by Bro. Mills, and fostered by the Grand Lodge, we may yet see amply provided for by the government, as, we insist, it is its absolute and imperative duty.

When this is effected, then, and not until then, can we circumscribe the benefits of our Asylums to the Orphans of Masons, and we should not desire it. We can support them; we must do it. Not to do so will be a shame.

The Grand Master of Alabama, in his address to the Grand Lodge in 1868, puts on record an incident, which our Committee on Foreign Correspondence quoted in the report of 1869, and which I deem worthy of perpetual record, as showing how much a simple offering of a child of great faith did for a great and noble cause. He says: "In Mississippi, at Lauderdale Springs, a Home for Orphans is in successful operation; there are within its walls ninety odd orphans of masons, besides many others; a little girl, living in Kentucky, Jennie Moxley by name, nine years old, became impressed with the importance of the subject and gave all the money she was saving to buy a doll for the benefit of the Home of Lauderdale Springs, not satisfied, after much

concern of mind, consented to part with her memory string composed of beads and flowers," very precious to her. Her mother told her no one would give any thing for that, she replied in simple, but grand, faith, I will try. She gave it to a friend to sell, who offered it to a friend, relating the incident, who gave ten dollars for it and returned it. This was repeated until one thousand dollars were realized for the Orphan's home." He adds, and I here repeat, cannot we, and will we not, strong men, do more than this child of faith?

It is proper that it should be stated, as it may not be known to all, that our work has no connection with that started during the war, to the endowment of which such praiseworthy contribution was made. That perished with the close of the war. All of its accumulations were Confederate securities, except some real estate, which the Supreme Court of this State turned over to the grasp of a creditor of the person who sold it to the "Orphan Fund." On the ground that the "Orphan Fund" was against public policy in that its benefactions, as set forth in the act of incorporation, were promised to those who should be made fatherless by the events of the war, to-wit, the orphans of Confederate soldiers. I mention this not to take issue with the court, though I am of opinion the dissenting Judge was right, and consistent with the law, but to show to those who may not know, the way their money went, as some enquiry has been made to that effect. See Trustees N. C. Endowment Fund vs. S. S. Satchwell, 71 N. C. Reports, page 111. The Courts of Mississippi refused to allow confiscation of the Lauderdale Springs property acquired under same circumstances.

I have received a letter from Bro. Melvin E. Carter, giving information that title to the Mars Hill property has been perfected, and that as soon as the deed shall have been recorded it will be forwarded to the Grand Master. The thanks of the fraternity are due to Bro. Carter for the interest manifested and labor done in behalf of our orphan work.

WASHINGTON MONUMENT.

I am in receipt of an appeal from the Secretary of the National Monument Association, asking for aid from the masonic fraternity to complete that great National work, so long neglected, in honor of the man whose fame is the common heritage of our whole country. While he needs no monumental shaft, no stately pile to perpetuate his memory in the hearts of the lovers of Constitutional Free Government, it is, perhaps, on the near approach of the one hundredth year of our independence, fitting that the American people should testify their gratitude by the completion of the Washington Monument at the Capital of the Nation.

It is fitting, too, that masons should join in the great work, for besides the common interest we all feel in the perpetuity of the memory of his greatness, we cherish with pride his memory as one of our noblest members, and most illustrious exemplars of the principles and aims of our order.

I hope the Grand Lodge will take proper notice of the appeal, and such steps in furtherance of the object as may be deemed expedient, consonant with our appreciation of the Great name of Washington.

To the reports of the Grand Secretary and Treasurer I invite special attention, that the recommendations pertaining to their offices may be heeded and such legislation had as will aid and carry out their suggestions.

In conclusion, brethren, let me express to you my profound gratitude for the undeserved honor you have conferred upon me, and the uniform courtesies I have received at your hands. I have come far short of my duty, and have from the beginning of my term keenly felt my want of ability to properly discharge the high and responsible duties of Grand Master, and I am persuaded that I have not come up to the exalted requirements of the office. I desire to work in the vineyards and shaded retreats, not on the house tops. I desire not honors and rewards, such as position gives. I reiterate what P. G. M. Reade said: "It has been the custom of this Grand Lodge to continue in office the Grand Master for two terms, a wise and judicious precedent and one which ordinarily ought not to be departed from; for the experience of the first year enables the Grand Master to be more efficient and useful the second year. I say this lest the course which I feel impelled to take may be followed as precedent." My felt inability to perform the high duties of the office, the multifarious perplexities of my business, private and professional, demand that I should retire. The station of Grand Master is not one of honor solely, but one of great labor, requiring almost constant care and attention, which, with the other duties devolving upon me it is impossible for me to give. So I hope you will relieve me at the next ballot.

I shall always cherish in my memory the high honor you have conferred—a life-time of devotion to the cause cannot repay the debt of gratitude I feel. To the Masters of Lodges, my compeers, and particularly to the Grand Secretary, am I indebted for valuable assistance in the discharge of my duties. To them all I tender my heartfelt thanks.

May we all be guided by a desire for the good of the order, for the spread of its principles, for enlargement of usefulness to mankind. "May brotherly love prevail, and every moral and social virtue cement us." Let the benign genius of the Mystic Art preside over our coun-

cils, and under her sway let us act with a dignity becoming the high moral character of our venerable institution. And when we have done the work laid out on the trestle board and assigned to us, may we all gain an abundant entrance into the realms of the blest—through Him in whom we trust. Amen.

The Grand Secretary submitted his annual Report as follows, which was read and referred to the committee on his Books :

Brethren of the Grand Lodge of North Carolina:

I greet you on assembling in the eighty-ninth Annual Communication, and, on the part of the brethren of this City, extend to you a cordial and fraternal welcome to this new hall, which you find prepared for your reception and future use, and which is to be dedicated to Freemasonry.

I appreciate the honor of submitting another annual report, which, though brief, contains a notice of such matters relating to the office of Grand Secretary as may be of interest to you.

The increasing claims of the Fraternity on the office have been, I trust, duly respected, and met as far as the humble abilities of the officer would admit.

The proceedings of the last Annual Communication were published and distributed early in the year. The appearance of the pamphlet in its mechanical feature, shows an improvement on former years, and indicates care and skill on the part of the contractors.

The revenue of the Grand Lodge, since my last annual report, amounts to three thousand two hundred and sixty-seven dollars and ten cents, and was derived from sources as follows:

Trap Hill Lodge, at Trap Hill, Wilkes county, was continued under Dispensation.

Twelve new Lodges received charters at the last Annual Communication with numbers from 332 to 343, both inclusive, were regularly constituted and are at work. I have received definite information that Flat Creek Lodge, No. 285, and Germanton Lodge, No. 290, have ceased to exist.

SUSPENSIONS, EXPULSIONS AND REINSTATEMENTS.

Sixteen Suspensions, twenty-one Expulsions, and six Reinstatements were reported to the office during the year, a detailed special statement of which is herewith presented in compliance with the requirements of law.

While the new law is generally accepted as an improvement on the former unsatisfactory and expensive system of publishing to the Lodges the suspensions, expulsions and reinstatements, a still further improvement is needed to make the present system entirely successful. In many instances Secretaries of Lodges fail to promptly transmit the required notices to the Grand Secretary, owing to which the necessary information given through the quarterly circulars is delayed beyond

the quarter in which the circulars should be issued, and the Lodges remain in ignorance of the status of those who have been deprived of, or restored to, Masonic rights. I do not suggest any amendment to the existing law on this subject, but point out the defect with a view to call the attention of Masters of Lodges to the importance of a more prompt observance by Secretaries of the law requiring the notices to be transmitted to the Grand Secretary, except in cases of appeal within one month.

NEW REVENUE SYSTEM.

The law passed at the last Annual Communication, changing the annual dues of Lodges from the uniform amount of fifteen dollars, to fifty cents per capita on each member reported on the annual returns, will, as contemplated, increase the revenues of the Grand Lodge. To what extent, however, cannot now be stated as the returns of many of the Lodges have not been received, and the amount per capita not reckoned. The returns thus far received show an increase, rather than a diminution, of membership, in the general aggregate. While some Lodges have resorted to the legitimate course of excluding members for non-payment of dues, thereby relieving their rolls of many whose interest in Masonry extended no further than a mere nominal Lodge affiliation, yet many have been saved to the Lodges through the commendable activity of Secretaries in collecting the dues.

RETURNS OF LODGES.

The fiscal year of the Grand Lodge closes on the 31st of October. It is intended that the annual returns of the Lodges shall embrace their statistics and workings to that date, and the annual dues be paid on the membership then existing. Secretaries have, by custom, from that time to the first Monday in December, in which to prepare and transmit the returns to the Grand Secretary. The returns of many Lodges are not received, however, until after the Grand Lodge convenes, Secretaries preferring to forward them by the representatives, to insure their safe delivery. There could be no objection to this course if the examination of the returns did not involve the expenditure of considerable time, and the exercise of much care. Under the present revenue system of fifty cents per capita on the membership, it is important that the returns show all gains and losses in membership and a true aggregate at the close of the fiscal year, so that accurate accounts of the Lodges can be kept. The correctness of the returns can be ascertained by a thorough examination only. This fact is established by

the experience, heretofore, of the committees of the Grand Lodge, and in the examination made by myself of the returns received the present year, which revealed the omission, without explanation, of many names that were embraced in the returns of last year, thus causing extensive correspondence before the accounts of such Lodges for dues could be closed on the Ledger. In view of these irregularities I venture, with the consent of the Grand Master, without making it a subject of his address, to suggest the adoption of a new regulation requiring Secretaries of Lodges to transmit the returns to the Grand Secretary by the 25th day of November, in order to afford that officer time to thoroughly examine them, correct them if necessary, and close the accounts for dues before the Grand Lodge convenes. Such a system would establish the uniformity so much desired and needed, enable the Grand Secretary to discharge his duties in this respect more effectually and expeditiously, render the examination of committees less tedious, and save much of the time usually occupied in receiving, and receipting for dues.

In the suggestions herein made no reflection is intended on Secretaries, neither is willful neglect in making up the returns charged upon them. My appreciation of the services of this officer to his Lodge and the Fraternity forbids it. The respect generally paid, with, perhaps, few exceptions, to the circular letter of instructions as to the manner of preparing the returns, which I have had the honor for several years to send them, have, I may be permitted to say, had the effect of securing entire accuracy on the part of many and improvement in others.

MASONIC CODE.

This work has been prepared and published under the authority given by the Grand Lodge at its last Annual Communication. Much care was taken to make it entirely reliable. It was examined by the committee appointed by the Grand Lodge to revise it, and received their endorsement before publication. It being designed for a handbook as well as a Code of Jurisprudence, the various public ceremonies and blank forms used by Lodges, and other important matter, are comprised in it.

After consultation with the Grand Master and committee, its price was fixed at one dollar. The residue of the proceeds of its sale, after paying the expenses of publication and distribution, will be paid into the Grand Treasury. One thousand copies were printed. It was a work of pleasure, and was cheerfully performed under a due appreciation of the need of the Fraternity in this Grand Jurisdiction, of such a compilation.

GRAND LODGE LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES.

The library, records and papers of the Grand Lodge have been removed to the room adjoining this hall, which has been assigned to the Grand Secretary for his office and the use of the Grand Lodge, by the committees acting for the Grand Lodge and Masonic Bodies of this city. The final arrangement and the removal having been completed rather late in the year, and at a time when I was engaged on the Masonic Code, the more convenient and systematic filing of the papers, which is in contemplation, has not been finished.

Twenty-seven bound volumes have been added to the library, making the number now in it three hundred and fifty.

REMOVAL OF LODGES.

I have received a transcript of the proceedings in the removal of Saint Paul's Lodge, No. 166, from Beatty's Bridge, Bladen county, to Point Caswell, Pender county, and Edgecombe Lodge, No. 298, from Temperance Hall, Edgecombe county, to the town of Toisnot, Wilson county. The law regulating removals was, in general, complied with.

CONCLUSION.

To the century through which Masonry in this Commonwealth has passed, and to which this Grand Body is approaching, another year has been added, carrying in its departure regrets for failures, though leaving pleasant recollections of some achievements, in our work. The comparative prosperity which has attended the Order in this Jurisdiction through the year, and the auspicious circumstances under which this Grand Lodge has assembled, call forth renewed expressions of gratitude to that Providence whose protection and favor have been extended to us, and under whose direction and wisdom our labors have been prosecuted.

May the spirit of unity, which has usually characterized the deliberations of this Grand Lodge, continue with us throughout this Communication, so that influences for good may extend to the entire brotherhood, and increased light be imparted to every Lodge in this broad jurisdiction. May our noble charities, the pride of our Fraternity and people, the further support of which claims our earnest consideration, continue to be the homes of the orphans, under the endowment of Heaven and a Christian philanthropy.

Bro. A. W. Tourgee moved as an amendment that the note be cancelled and surrendered, which was agreed to, and the motion as amended prevailed.

The appropriations made by the Grand Lodge at its last Annual Communication, together with the necessary current expenses, have kept the Treasury in a depleted condition, and as necessity demanded I have had to borrow money to meet the payments of orders of the Grand Master, and to pay bills for stationery, postage, &c.; the amount borrowed has not been large and I have paid but six dollars interest, for which amount I have credited myself in the above statement, and filed the proper voucher. It is hoped that the new system of collecting dues from subordinate lodges adopted at your last Annual Communication, will obviate this necessity for the future.

Your committee appointed at the last Annual Communication "to confer with Hiram Lodge, No. 40; Wm. G. Hill Lodge, No. 218, and Raleigh Chapter, No. 10, to procure a suitable hall in which to hold their communications," of which committee I was made chairman, in presenting for your use and future occupation this beautifully furnished and well appointed hall, beg leave to report:

That they have been met by committees from all the bodies above referred to, in a spirit of liberality, and with a desire on the part of all to furnish a proper place of meeting for the Grand Lodge as well as the Subordinate Lodges and Chapter; the result of their labors is before you and has been obtained at a cost to the Grand Lodge of two hundred and fourteen dollars and twenty-five cents, for which the proper voucher is filed, which is approved by your committee. The above mentioned Lodges, the Chapter, and individual subscriptions have furnished the balance of the money. Your committee have also agreed with committees from the Lodges, that the Grand Lodge will pay one hundred dollars per annum towards the rent of this hall and the Grand Secretary's room adjoining

All of which your committee respectfully submits for your approval, and asks to be discharged from further consideration of the subject.

I congratulate your honorable body that you are thus permanently fixed in so safe and commodious a hall and at such moderate cost to all concerned.

It is probable that the old Lodge site and building will soon be sold; but as the Grand Lodge holds no ownership except in the dilapidated frame house, it is not probable that much will be realized from her share of the sale, and as there is a resolution of the Grand Lodge still in force, requiring the Grand Treasurer to keep the building insured, I respectfully recommend that he be instructed to allow the policy to lapse after its present term shall have expired.

I desire to call the attention of the Grand Lodge to its position as regards the Masonic Temple Association, and to say that, in my judg-

ment, this Grand Body owes it to said association, as well as to its own dignity, either to take steps to render its subscription effective, by making payments upon it, or by the passage of a resolution withdrawing such subscription. Shortly after the passage of the order making this liberal contribution to the stock of the Temple, the Directors of the Association, encouraged by the action of the Grand Lodge, and believing that such a building as was proposed to be erected was not only necessary for the good of the craft but essential to its dignity, sent an agent throughout the length and breadth of the State and even into other States, and an amount sufficient to erect a handsome edifice was subscribed; relying on the faith of these subscriptions the Directors of the Association bought a most eligible and central lot in this city, procured plans for an edifice, which, if erected, would be alike an ornament to the city and a credit to Masonry, and in the hope that action on their part would meet with a hearty reponse from subscribers, broke ground, and dug the excavations for foundations and cellar at a large expense, then sent their appeals to Masons throughout the State to come up and help them by redeeming their pledges and paying up subscriptions: the result has been to impress the Directors of the Masonic Temple Association with the belief that the Masons of North Carolina "do not desire to have a Temple in this city at this time," as was pointedly said by a Director of the Association who is not a Mason.

The Directors of the Association who are Masons are thus placed in an awkward position with regard to those Directors and subscribers who are not Masons and feel the responsibility of their position; it is believed that the enhanced value of the property bought will cover all or most of the expenses incurred thus far, but interest on the purchase money, taxes, &c., will soon overbalance this increase in value, and while the Temple Association is paying interest on money borrowed to purchase the land, it is receiving no interest on the subscription of ten thousand dollars made by the Grand Lodge; it is for these reasons that I recommend that said subscription be either rendered effective or withdrawn by resolution. It is hardly necessary for me to repeat what I have stated in my every report since the subscription was made and what is still true, that there was no money to spare from the Treasury towards this subscription.

I have received from the Superintendent of the Oxford Orphan Asylum the sum of twenty dollars given by four benevolent persons (three of them not masons) for the endowment of the orphan work. I learn from him that several persons have made wills containing bequests to the Orphan Asylums under the care of this Grand Lodge, and that there are men of wealth ready to make liberal contributions to an en-

dowment fund, wherever the Grand Lodge shall decide to endow these Institutions.

I have been asked to bring this matter to your attention and to make such suggestions as will induce the Grand Lodge to act promptly and wisely: it seems to me, however, in a matter of such paramount importance, better to make no suggestions, but necessary only to make this mention of the subject to ensure your earnest consideration and speedy action, and I earnestly recommend that the matter be placed in the hands of an able committee with instructions to report a plan of endowment, as early in this communication as practicable.

I feel sure that no more important matter can engage your attention.

Referring to a resolution of the Grand Lodge passed at its last Annual Communication, (page 68 of proceedings) I have to report that I found in possession of the Grand Lodge a joint note of Bro. C. W. D. Hutchings and his brother, Mr. Wm. B. Hutchings, for three hundred and seventy-eight dollars and six cents due March 10th, 1869, which, with interest to the present time, would amount to more than five hundred dollars; this note was given for balance due the Grand Lodge by Brother C. W. D. Hutchings as Grand Treasurer at his final settlement with a committee appointed for that purpose, and has never been in possession of the present Grand Treasurer, except as custodian for said committee, until the passage of your resolution above referred to. I have made earnest efforts to collect this note, by personal application to the makers, but as yet without success: I am informed that Bro. C. W. D. Hutchings intends sending a communication to your body at its present session in relation to the matter; of its nature I am not informed, but if no other disposition is made of it I ask the Grand Lodge for more specific instructions, as to whether I shall enter suit on the note and if so whether such suit shall be for principal and interest or for principal alone; you will readily understand that it is a delicate matter for me to deal with and I urge the Grand Lodge to give me positive instructions in regard to it.

The Special Committee on the Grand Master's Address submitted the following report, which was read and adopted:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

Your Committee, to whom was referred the Grand Master's Address, have had the same under consideration and beg leave to recommend :

1. That so much as relates to our fraternal dead be referred to a memorial committee of three, with instructions to prepare suitable notices of the deceased and report at this Communication.

2. That so much as relates to Decisions be referred to the Committee on Masonic Jurisprudence.

3. That so much as relates to "*Work*" be referred to a committee of five, with instructions to report as early in the session as possible.

4. That so much as relates to Books and Periodicals be referred to a special committee of three, with instructions to enquire into the condition and prospects of the periodicals alluded to in the address, and make such recommendations as may be deemed appropriate in the premises.

5. That so much as relates to Orphan Asylums be referred to a special committee of five, who may take into consideration the condition of our Asylums and, if possible, present plans for the future support of these institutions.

6. That so much as relates to the Washington Monument be referred to a special committee of three.

Bro. J. H. Mills, Superintendent of the Orphan Asylums, submitted the following as his annual report, which was read and referred to the Special Committee on the Orphan Asylums :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina:

The benevolent people of our State have carried on the orphan work during one more year. Some Lodges have been regular and liberal in their donations, while others have been deplorably indifferent. In some cases the committees have forgotten their appointment. Yet wherever the claims of the orphans have been fairly presented, a generous response has followed. Several times during the year we found it absolutely necessary to visit communities and give orphan entertainments in order to excite interest and facilitate collections. These journeys took the children away from their studies and the Superintendent away from his appropriate duties. Thus it has happened that many needy orphans have not been reached, the internal operations of the institutions have not received the attention they needed, and several contemplated improvements have not been made. But the work has been placed before a larger number of people, and the zeal of many Lodges has been greatly augmented.

THE ORPHAN ASYLUM AT OXFORD.

The contributions to the Orphan Asylum at Oxford from December 1, 1874, to November 30, 1875, inclusive, were \$13,095.98. The disbursements were \$12,540.37, leaving in hand \$555.61, together with the amount (\$82.37) reported on hand last year, making \$637.98 in the treasury on the first day of the present month.

The amounts here reported as received and disbursed include the

receipts and disbursements of the Mars Hill Asylum until the first day September when the books of that institution were opened. They also include the receipts and expenses of the *Orphans' Friend*.

The number of orphans reported present last year was one hundred and thirty-two. Admitted since last report fifty, making one hundred and eighty-two. Discharged, fifty-seven; died, two; ran away, three; expelled, two, leaving now at Oxford one hundred and five. The number is now smaller than usual because many larger boys and girls have been discharged within the last few days to take eligible situations offered them, and the Superintendent has had no time to bring on those awaiting transportation.

THE MARS HILL ASYLUM.

The total contributions in cash from September 1, to November 30, inclusive, were \$343.34. One mule was sold for \$100 and \$110 received from the Oxford Asylum, making the total receipts \$553.34. The disbursements amounted to \$548.20, leaving in hand \$5.14. The Oxford Asylum also paid claims against the Mars Hill Asylum amounting to \$196.75. The contributions in kind have not been so liberal as might have been expected in a country blessed with abundant crops; but some few individuals have made frequent and liberal donations.

Repairs on the main building, the erection of smaller additional buildings, the fences and the furniture and fixtures have made the first year of this institution apparently very expensive; but these improvements are of a permanent character.

The number of orphans admitted at Mars Hill is thirty-five. Expelled, one; ran away, two; discharged, three; now present, twenty-nine. Of these ten were transferred from Oxford, some to assist in entertainments and others for the restoration of their health.

The continuance of this institution is recommended for three reasons:

1. It has surpassed the most sanguine expectations in restoring to immediate and vigorous health, the feeble and chill-shaken orphans from the swamps and pocosons of the East.

2. The people of the mountains do not yet appreciate the claims of the orphans, nor their obligations to relieve the suffering poor. Their duty ought to be placed before their eyes, sounded in their ears, and impressed upon their hearts, till willing feet shall go on errands of mercy and helping hands shall reach down and take hold of those now feeling for sympathy and support.

3. Many orphans in the West are still enduring the most abject

slavery. They are held in bondage by those who seem to think that when fathers and mothers are dead, the children left have no rights which the living ought to respect. The voice of humanity pleads for these orphans, and the ever-listening ear of the just and upright Mason will not let it plead in vain.

One supervision over both institutions is recommended for two reasons:

1. That no obstruction may be placed in the way of the easy transfer of children from one institution to the other whenever their welfare shall require it.
2. That one may assist the other in case of distress and make harmonious coöperation a mutual honor and advantage.

THE PRESENT PLAN.

The present plan of collecting funds for the support of the Orphan work, through committees of the Subordinate Lodges, has succeeded whenever efficient committees have been appointed; but in most Lodges the committees have disregarded the resolution of the Grand Lodge. In some whole counties and large districts there are no Lodges. These are not reached under the present plan. It is, therefore, recommended that it be amended and put in lively operation, or that some other plan be adopted.

THE ORPHANS' FRIEND.

The paper is a success. It has bought its own outfit and paid its way, besides doing much active service for the orphan work. It has done this without any special editor, most of the work being done by the Steward of the Asylum at Oxford, and that too when the duties of his office were pressing heavily upon him. But it ought to have five thousand instead of one thousand subscribers, and the Lodges might easily increase its circulation and its usefulness. It may be entitled to the entire time of an active editor; but the decision of this question is left to the wisdom of the brethren.

ORPHANS IN OTHER SCHOOLS.

We frequently find among those whom, on account of age or advancement we are required to discharge, children whose studies ought to be continued. So far the best that we have been able to do for the boys is to put them where they will learn trades and have opportuni-

ties of improvement. Sometimes by the benevolence of proprietors and sometimes by partial payments, we have been able to procure admission for some of our most promising girls into higher female schools. We have five promising girls now prosecuting their studies in the higher female schools of the State. In this way, a very small expenditure of money and a little attention will raise up a number of wise and useful women to aid in the orphan work and prove a blessing to the State. But this part of the work has so far been carried on without any definite instructions. It is, therefore, recommended that judicious and liberal regulations be adopted in regard to it.

DEATH.

The children at Mars Hill have enjoyed uninterrupted health. At Oxford their general health has been good, in spite of a wet and sickly summer. Two orphans have, however, been called to their Father's house, Franklin Braxton, of Greene county, had a spell of fever, and when he seemed to be nearly well was taken with consumption of the bowels and after intense sufferings found rest in everlasting sleep.

Rev. J. R. Griffith, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, preached his solemn funeral sermon.

Marie Carrington, of Mecklenburg county, knew no ties of blood, nor even the name by which her mother called her. She was a pleasant, affectionate and promising little girl; but her heart was diseased and the doctor told us that brief would be her stay upon the earth. At four o'clock in the morning she seemed to be enjoying peaceful slumber. At six o'clock she was sleeping in the icy arms of death. Rev. M. H. Vaughan, of the Episcopal Church, performed her funeral service. And now the names of two more orphans are recorded on marble head and foot-stones in the neat and quiet grave-yard of the Oxford Orphan Asylum; and the children often think of their late companions while they sing

"Let the dead and the beautiful rest."

PERSONAL.

After three years of constant care and anxiety of mind, and unusual toil and exposure of body, I feel the need of rest; and that I ought to give some attention to my private business and to my neglected family. Besides, I have necessarily offended many who claim the services of the orphans and who insist that they have been collected in order that they might be distributed among those who wish for servants without kin, to work without wages.

Again, my sympathies have been so deeply stirred, and my heart has been so often harrowed by the sorrows and sufferings which I have seen, that I sometimes lose control of my feelings and make remarks which are indiscreet, if not fanatical. Some new man may now enter the field, impart fresh life to the work, and profit by my experience. I, therefore, in spite of my affection for the children, and of my undying interest in the work, earnestly request the brethren not to vote for me, as I have decided to enter another field of labor. May Heaven repay the kindness which the officers of the Lodges and unnumbered friends in different parts of the State have always shown to the orphans and to me.

No. 3. on Suspensions and Expulsions :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

Your Committee No. 3, on Suspensions and Expulsions, have examined the papers in the following cases:

Farmington Lodge, No. 265, against Bro. G. F. Howell. Sentence—Indefinite suspension.

Edgecombe Lodge, No. 298, against Bro. William F. Mercer. Sentence—Indefinite suspension.

Lock's Creek Lodge, No. 333, against Bro. L. H. Godwin. Sentence—Expulsion, and do recommend that the action of the said Lodges be approved.

Your Committee, in this connection, would say that in the case of Lock's Creek Lodge, No. 333, the transcript of the proceedings shows that the Lodge was opened in the third degree and the evidence of two witnesses (profanes) was offered in support of the charge, but does not show that the Lodge was called off during the presence of these witnesses. Your Committee do not presume but that the regulation was duly observed, but make this mention that the attention of Secretaries may be called thereto, and that they may be more particular in keeping "a true record of all things proper to be written."

In the case of Palmyra Lodge, No. 338, against Bro. S. R. Spruill, your Committee find the transcript of proceedings in several particulars, irregular—in omitting the names of the officers and members present at the Communication held, in preferring charges at a *special* meeting called to receive the report of the Committee of Reference, and a non-compliance with the prescribed rules of evidence, laid down for the government of Subordinate Lodges.

Your Committee deem it their duty to point out these irregularities, and recommend that the matter be re-committed to the Lodge for a new trial.

Bro. W. J. Stanly, from Committee No. 2, on Charters and Dispensations, submitted a report recommending that charters be granted to Lodges U. D., which was adopted. Charters were issued to the Lodges with numbers as follows:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

Committee No. 2, on Suspensions and Expulsions beg leave to report that they have examined the records of proceedings from the Lodges hereinafter mentioned and recommend as follows:

1st. That the action of Monroe Lodge, No. 244, in the expulsion of W. H. H. Houston be sustained.

2d. That the action of Hatcher Lodge, No. 310, in the suspension of L. H. Boykin be sustained.

3d. That the action of same Lodge, in the indefinite suspension of W. A. Crocker be sustained.

4th. That the action of Radiance Lodge, No. 132, in the expulsion of Henry Canaday be sustained.

5th. That the action of Jonesville Lodge, No. 227, in the expulsion of P. A. Miller be sustained.

6th. In the case of Wm. R. Holmes, Good Samaritan Lodge, No. 336, your Committee find several material irregularities, and from the record the entire matter seems to have been frivolous in the highest degree and a mere pique upon the part of the Master of the Lodge by whom the charges were preferred. In effect, the accused was charged with perjury upon what appears to have been a mere matter of opinion, to-wit: whether the school-house in a certain district was one-fourth or one-half a mile from the centre of said district, and whether children would have to go three or four miles to attend the school. Even in regard to these questions there was conflicting testimony on the trial.

The Worshipful Master, who was the prosecutor and a witness, has forwarded to the Committee of the Grand Lodge a letter which is annexed hereto, and which the Committee desire to have read as a part of their report.

In consideration of these premises, your Committee recommend that the sentence of the Lodge be declared null and void, and that the Worshipful Master of said Lodge be reprimanded by vote of the Grand Lodge, for addressing the letter, referred to, to the Committee.

No. 1, on Suspensions and Expulsions :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

Committee No. 1, on Suspensions and Expulsions have carefully examined the following cases presented to them for consideration, to-wit :

From St. Patrick's Lodge, No. 274, Boon Hill, charges and specifications against Bros. Haywood Rains and J. T. Rains, found guilty of both charges and specifications. Judgment—expulsion, which is affirmed.

From Beulah Lodge, No. 257, we have charges and specifications against Bro. E. J. Pearce. 1st, non-payment of dues; 2d, refusing to obey summons of the Lodge. Bro. Pearce was found guilty of both specifications. Judgment—indefinite suspension.

It is useless for us to say that no punishment of this character could be inflicted, upon the first specification, though the accused were flagrantly guilty, and on the second specification the punishment would have been just, or *very severe* in proportion as the proofs would show the contumelious behavior of the accused or otherwise, on this, the papers throw no light whatever. The whole proceedings as presented to your Committee are irregular, and we can arrive at no sensible conclusion about the matter at all, from what appears of record. The papers ought to be returned to Beulah Lodge, No. 257, with instructions to send up to the next Annual Communication an intelligent record of the proceedings in this case, in other words a new trial ought to be granted, with an admonition to the brethren of Beulah Lodge to study very carefully the law and forms of Masonic trials as plainly laid down in the books.

Fellowship Lodge, No. 84, charge and specification against Bro. N. G. Green, found guilty of the charge and specification. Sentence—expulsion, which sentence ought to be affirmed.

Central Cross Lodge, No. 187, charges and specifications against Bro. Calvin Benton, charge unmasonic conduct. Specification 1st, "He took me out to have a private conversation with me." Specification 2d, called me a liar, &c. The proof was *clear* on the first specification, but on the other specifications—two in number, the Subordinate Lodge found Bro. Benton not guilty, and refused to punish him on the first specification, which, as we have said, was established, when Bro. B. Gay, the accuser, feeling himself aggrieved, appealed to this Grand body. Here we desire to call the especial attention of all whom it may concern, that an appeal from the findings of a Subordinate Lodge *must* state the *grounds upon which the appeal is prayed, in writing*, and

must be filed with said Lodge within thirty days from the day the issue is decided by the Lodge. It is a very reasonable presumption on the part of Committees on Suspensions and Expulsions, if no grounds are stated by the appellant in *writing*, and the papers are otherwise regular, that equal and impartial justice was done in the disposition of cases in the Subordinate Lodges, and there is nothing to rebut this presumption. The action of "Central Cross" Lodge in this case ought to be affirmed.

Mattamuskeet Lodge, No. 328, charges unmasonic conduct, with one lengthy specification. Trial had, which, in the language of the case sent up, "resulted in a verdict of guilty." "The Lodge then proceeded to ballot on Bro. John Bateman's expulsion, and resulted in his *indefinite expulsion*." If the specification against Bro. Bateman was sustained, the sentence was a terrible one for the offense, and we would ask for a modification of the sentence, but for a foot note to the case as sent up, "John Bateman has since died." We, therefore, reverently leave his case to the adjudication of ONE who cannot err, and spread the mantle of charity over all his faults and foibles.

For a model of neatness, brevity and compliance with the requirements of masonry in masonic trials, and a sensible record of *what was done*, so that we can clearly understand the whole matter, commend us to a case from Mt. Lebanon Lodge, No. 117, on charge and specification against Brethren S. T. Brown, Ransom Hinnant, J. H. Renfrow, R. W. Clayton, John Y. Gaylord, S. W. Aycock, and D. W. Barnes. Of these S. T. Brown and J. W. Aycock were indefinitely suspended, the others, expelled from all the rights and benefits of masonry. We cheerfully approve the judgment of the Lodge. and recommend that it be affirmed by this Grand body.

Mingo Lodge, No. 206, charge and specifications made against Bro. Wm. Daughtry by Bro. A. T. Herring, neither the charge nor specifications were sustained, and Bro. Herring appealed, that is the records in the case *say* that he appealed, what for, or on what grounds does not appear, and we are compelled to say that we discover nothing to appeal from. The action of the Lodge below ought to be affirmed.

Rehoboth Lodge, No. 279, in the case of Bro. V. N. Sewell charged with gross unmasonic conduct—we, your Committee, after patiently weighing all the testimony, and hearing the able arguments of the council for the Lodge, and the accused, are of opinion that the judgment of the Lodge, to-wit: indefinite suspension, is not warranted by the testimony in the cause, the charge, we think, is not sustained, nor the specifications, and recommend that the action of the Lodge be not

sustained. We are of opinion, from what we have gathered in this trial, that a very bad state of feeling exists amongst the members, which, we sincerely trust, will cease to exist. In the kindest spirit of brethren and masons we would intimate to this Lodge that these harsh feelings which seem to have existed for some time might constrain the Grand Master to do what would doubtless be painful to him, to-wit: suspend their work. We hope the brethren of this Lodge will hereafter dwell together in unity. Let discord cease.

Mingo Lodge, No. 206, charges preferred against Bro. A. T. Her-ring by Bro. Wm. Daughtry: this is evidently an off-shoot of the last case, the croppings out of a state of feelings very far removed from the feelings which ought to actuate masons. The charges were not sustained in the Lodge below and Bro. Daughtry appealed, so the record says, and on that bald statement we are required to look over the whole case. We discover no error committed by the Subordinate Lodge and none is assigned by the appellant. The truth is neither of these cases ought ever to have troubled a masonic body at all. There is a growing disposition, we are very fearful, amongst the members of our order, to drag into Lodges little personal piques and quarrels which ought never to have lodgment in the hearts of true masons.

From Mt. Pleasant Lodge, No. 157, case against Bro. W. C. Page. Charge unmasonic conduct, specification, not obeying a legal summons. Sentence—expulsion, from what appears by the record, the brother ought to have been expelled, and so ought all brethren who *wilfully and contemptuously refuse to obey a legal masonic summons*; it is, and ought to be, a high masonic offence.

Carolina Lodge, No. 141, Bros. J. A. Lee, Shepherd Lee, and B. F. Davis, charged with gross unmasonic conduct, to-wit: disobedience of summons, found guilty as to all. Sentence—indefinite suspension. The papers are all regular and we see no reason why the action of Carolina Lodge should not be confirmed.

The Special Committee, to whom was referred the case of George A. Foote, from Johnston Caswell Lodge, No. 10, beg leave to submit the following report :

They have carefully examined the transcript sent up from the Lodge below, and heard the able counsel, who appeared on the part of the Lodge and for the accused, and are of opinion that the charge and specifications are too indefinite, in that they do not charge the accused with intending to do the prosecutor an injury. It appears that there was a misunderstanding between the prosecutor, Bro. J. W. Norwood, and the accused, which, in the opinion of your Committee, could and ought to have been settled by the Reference Committee of the Lodge, and thereby prevented much unpleasant feeling between the parties, and saved the Lodge the trouble of a tedious and embarrassing trial.

Your Committee do not wish to be understood as exonerating the accused from all blame. They think he acted indiscreetly, but the intent to do the prosecutor, Bro. J. W. Norwood, an injury, or to bring disgrace upon the masonic fraternity, or Johnston Caswell Lodge, No. 10, does not sufficiently appear to justify the punishment imposed by the Lodge.

The Committee, therefore, recommend that the action of the Lodge below be reversed, and that the officers of the Lodge be instructed to direct the Reference Committee to take charge of the case, with instructions to settle, if possible, the difficulty between the parties satisfactory to themselves, and to the honor of Masonry.

Your Committee on Appeals beg leave to report that they have carefully considered the appeal of Bro. B. Kahn, from a judgment of suspension for two years of himself, by New Berne Lodge, No. 245, upon the charge of unmasonic conduct in the violation of his obligation as a Master Mason, and having examined the charge and specifications and voluminous testimony, they find that the brother was only convicted upon the fourth specification, and that upon the testimony of a female of bad repute and a *profane*, as it does not appear that the Lodge called off during her examination. Your Committee regret to state that they find the testimony so irregular and leading in its character as to leave in the minds of your Committee the impression that there was an overzeal on the part of the Lodge to convict the accused, that your Committee are by no means certain that the specification upon which the accused was convicted, was any violation of his obligation, that even if *the specification* was a violation of his obligation, your Committee do not think the evidence shows the guilt of the accused.

From the foregoing statement your Committee recommend that the

An invitation from Mr. F. P. Hobgood, Principal, to the Grand Lodge, to attend at the Raleigh Female Seminary (Baptist) this afternoon at four o'clock, to witness and hear special exercises (calisthenic and musical), was read and accepted with the unanimous expression of thanks.

The proceedings of yesterday's sessions were read and approved.

A memorial was presented by Bro. A. S. Lee, Master of Hiram Lodge, No. 40, of this city, setting forth that Mr. W. W. Smith, an American citizen, while residing in France, had been made a Mason, but having become a resident of this city, had deposited his dimit with said Lodge with a view to affiliation; and requesting of this Body an expression of its sense as to the authority of said Lodge to entertain the petition for membership, in view of the action of the Grand Lodge at its Annual Communication of 1869,

discontinuing intercourse with the Grand Orient of France, for causes then shown and published.

On motion of Bro. Thos. S. Kenan, the Lodge was authorized to receive and act upon the petition, with a view to healing in the event of favorable ballot.

The Special Committee on the Orphan Asylums made their report on matters recommitted to them last evening, which was read and adopted. The report entire was then adopted, and is as follows:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

Your Committee, to whom was referred that portion of the Grand Master's Address, which relates to the Oxford and Mars Hill Orphan Asylums, cordially approve his suggestions, and commend the zeal he has manifested in their behalf.

From the report of the Superintendent, Bro. J. H. Mills, which was likewise referred to this Committee, they are gratified to see that the orphan work has been so successfully prosecuted, and that these institutions have been the instruments of alleviating much suffering, rescuing from misfortune and crime many of the unprotected and destitute children of our beloved State, and placing the means within their reach of becoming useful and valuable members of society.

They are gratified to discover from this report that some of our leading institutions of learning propose to receive and educate, gratuitously, a limited number of the most promising and intelligent of these children, provided they are supplied with suitable clothing and books.

The Committee, therefore, recommend: 1st, the acceptance of these generous propositions and that the Superintendent, with the approval of the Most Worshipful Grand Master, be authorized to make suitable provisions for each year not exceeding four such children, who may continue to be thus provided with clothing and books at the expense of the Asylums, for not exceeding three years each.

They likewise recommend that when churches, individuals or societies, are willing to aid in this benevolent work, by furnishing clothing, books and other expenses as above suggested, the Superintendent, with the approval of the Most Worshipful Grand Master, be authorized and directed to transfer from the Asylums to such schools as may be preferred by such churches, persons or societies, such child or children as may be thus provided for.

2d. They are gratified to hear of the success of the "*Orphans*'

Friend," published at the Asylum at Oxford, and recognizing it as a valuable auxiliary to the work, earnestly recommend its patronage to every Mason within this jurisdiction.

3d. It having been called to their attention that there are large areas of territory, in which there are no Lodges, and where it has proved impossible to interest the people in the orphan work, by the means hitherto employed, they recommend the establishment in all such localities, of Orphan Aid Societies, under such rules, regulations and restrictions as may be prescribed by the Most Worshipful Grand Master.

4th. The present plan for raising funds from the Subordinate Lodges, for the support of the Asylums, is believed to be as efficacious as any they can suggest, and needs only to be carried out faithfully to guarantee success. They, therefore, advise no additional legislation, but recommend that the Most Worshipful Grand Master use all legitimate means to induce the Lodges aforesaid to appoint active and diligent committees, as provided by this Grand Lodge, and to see that they discharge their responsible duties.

5th. They respectfully recommend the appropriation of two thousand dollars towards the support of the Orphan Asylums for the current (Masonic) year, and that the Grand Treasurer be instructed to pay the same, in monthly installments, upon the warrant of the Superintendent.

6th. They would respectfully urge the erection of a permanent endowment fund, for the support of the Asylums, and to this end suggest that all committees, agents or others, soliciting and receiving contributions for a temporary support, be authorized and requested to receive any land, notes or other securities, given for this purpose, and that as such land, notes or other securities are from time to time received, the same shall be accounted for and turned over to the Grand Treasurer, who shall hold the same subject to the further orders of this Grand Lodge, and that the Most Worshipful Grand Master be requested to bring this subject prominently before the public in order to accomplish this design.

7th. Inasmuch as we now have two Asylums and much of the time of the Superintendent is taken up in travelling, we recommend that he be authorized to employ clerical assistance on such terms as he may deem necessary: *Provided* that the expenditure for such services, shall not exceed three hundred dollars per annum, and board, during the time when actually employed.

8th. The Committee, in closing their report, desire, as an act of justice to Bro. Mills, to express their high appreciation of the work, which he has to a great degree inaugurated, and thus far conducted with such

gratifying success. To his labor is due, in a good measure, the present prosperous condition of these institutions. Amidst many and great disadvantages; with parental anxiety and devotion, he has watched over them since their commencement, until he has made them the brightest ornaments of our venerable order. We sincerely trust that in the future his efforts will meet with a more ready and cheerful response from the benevolent everywhere, and that his labor and anxiety, which would have been too great for one less fitted for this beneficent, but difficult, undertaking, may be lightened by the hearty sympathy, and material aid and cooperation of every well wisher of so noble a cause.

We heartily recommend these institutions to the kindest consideration of our brethren and the people of the State, hoping they may receive the support they so richly merit, and under the blessings of the Supreme Grand Master, prove the fostering mother of many more of the destitute and unfortunate of our land.

Your Committee, appointed at the last Annual Communication, to examine the Code of Masonic Law, then in preparation by the Grand Sec-

retary, beg leave to report that, upon the completion of the compilation by the Grand Secretary, he submitted the manuscripts to us. Your Committee carefully read and corrected (wherever correction was deemed necessary) the entire work, and take pleasure in bearing testimony to the able and faithful manner in which the work has been performed by Bro. Bain. One thousand copies have been printed, and the price fixed at one dollar per copy—a little more than sufficient to pay expenses of compilation and publication.

1. Your Committee recommend that the Code be adopted as the law of this Grand Lodge, and that Subordinate Lodges and Masons in this grand jurisdiction be required to recognize and treat it as such.

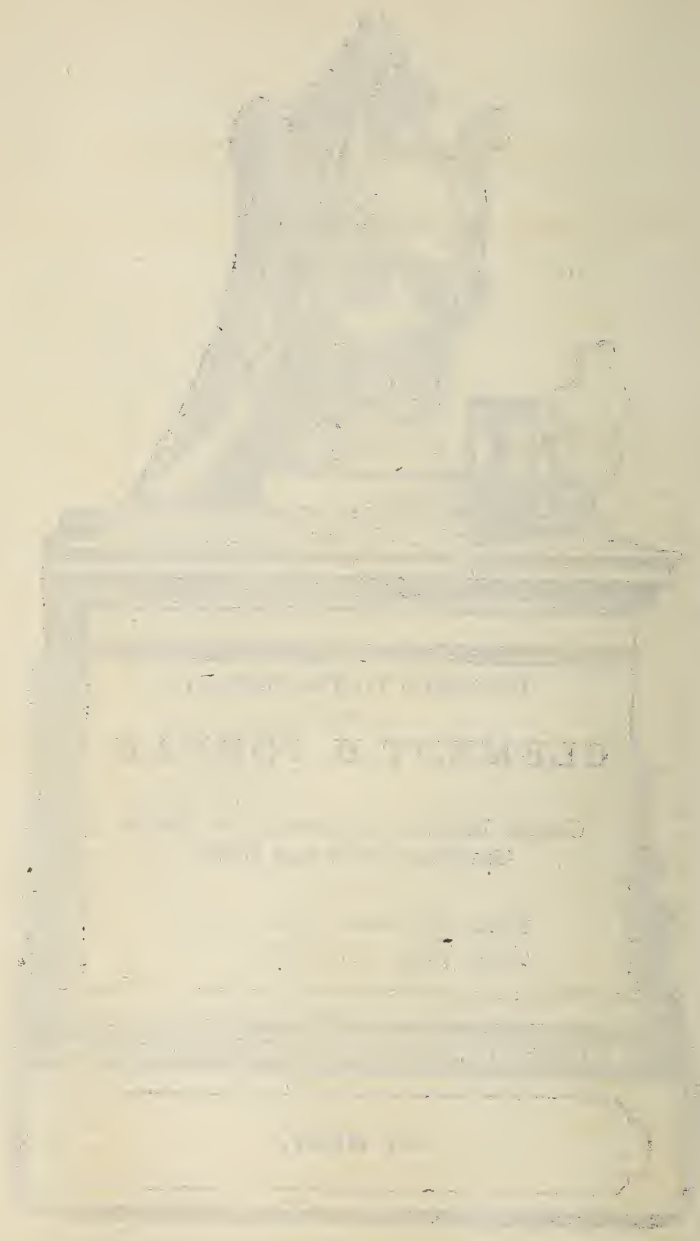

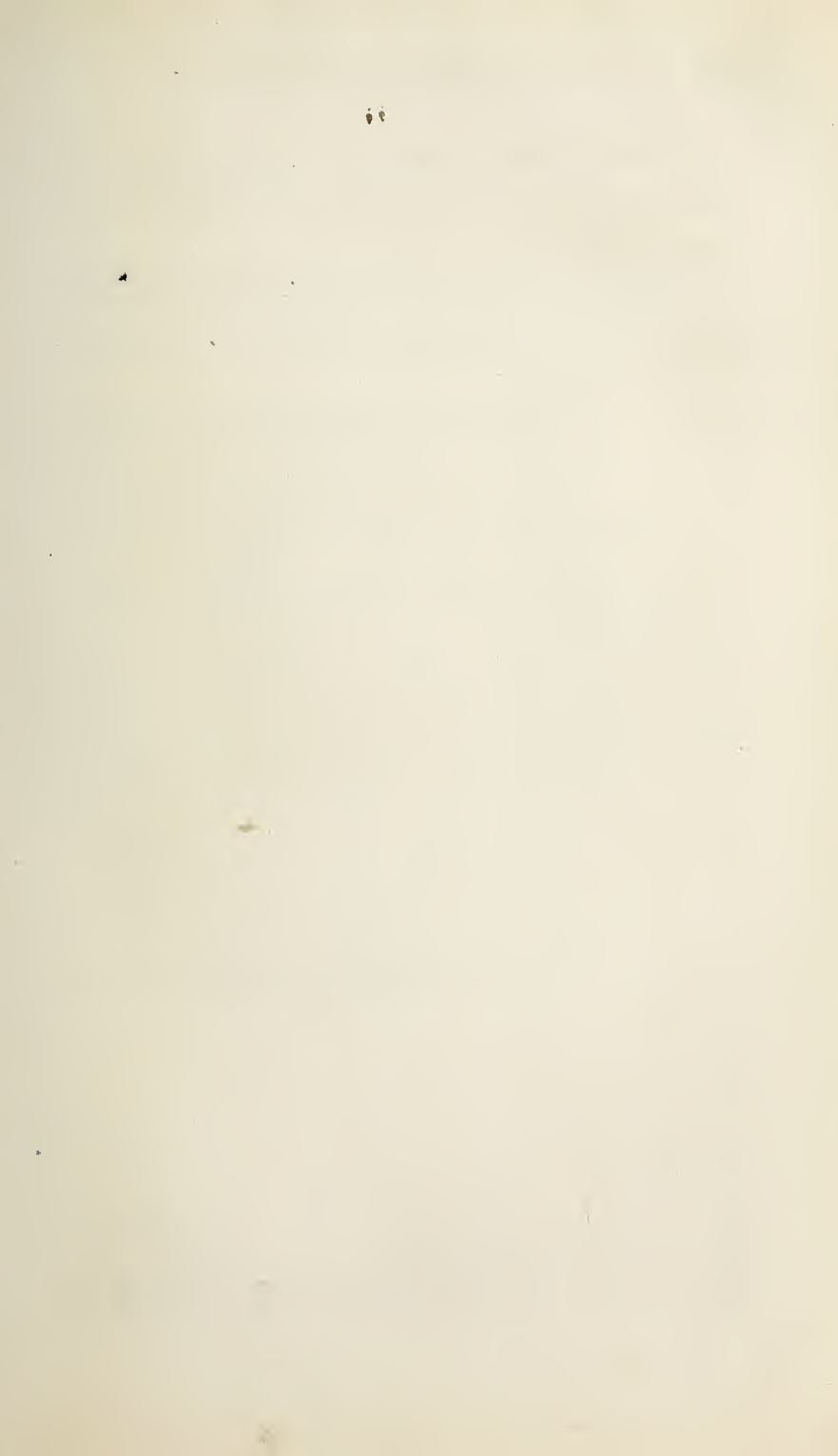
