

The Grand Master submitted the following Communication, which was read and adopted. When, on motion of the Grand Secretary, it was disposed of in the usual manner, by appointing Bros. W. G. Hill, E. F. Watson, and Thomas J. Patrick, a

Committee to report upon the various subjects, referred to in his Communication :

BRETHREN : Another year has passed, and we have again assembled around the common altar erected to friendship and morality, and to extend to each other our fraternal salutations, and renew our vows to the genius and spirit of Free Masonry. How thankful we should be to the great Author of our being, who has so bountifully bestowed his blessings upon us since our last annual communication. While the political world has been stirred to its depths, and wild fanaticism has swept like a sirocco over our land, threatening for a time, not only the permanency of our political institutions, but the perpetuity of the Union itself. While the sacred atmosphere of the church itself has not been exempt from the poisonous influence of sectional controversy, the old ship of Free Masonry, full freighted with the treasures of four thousand years, has prosperously pursued her voyage, unmoved by the breakers, unchecked by the storm, but guided by the unerring compass of universal benevolence, she is endeavoring faithfully to fulfill the exalted purposes of her mission. Our order is gradually approximating her true position before an enlightened public sentiment. The mists of error are rapidly disappearing before the rising sun of her brilliancy and glory. New recruits among the wise and good are daily enlisting under her banner. Many new Lodges have been organized under Dispensation, old ones have become resuscitated, and are zealous coadjutors in the promotion of her prosperity. The Church no longer regards her as a rival in the affections of her people, but rather an efficient co-laborer in the advancement of her principles, and in the promotion of morality. But a short time has elapsed in our history, since the fact being acknowledged in many communities, of a man's affiliation with Masonry, stamped upon him a mark of suspicion. He was regarded as having association with deeds of darkness, if not a closer alliance to the evil one himself. At present, probably in those very localities, it has become a passport to respectability and character.

I have found the labors attendant upon a proper discharge of the duties and responsibilities incumbent upon your Grand Master, oftentimes arduous and perplexing. A constant adherence to our ancient land-marks, and a zealous effort to promote the prosperity of all branches of our Masonic family, has been the ultimate object of all my labors. Influenced by these motives, I have endeavored to adjudicate all questions of doubtful construction submitted for my decision. I have endeavored to reconcile all disturbances, which have arisen among the brethren, agreeably to the morals which Masonry inculcates. In this, I have been more than sustained by the fraternity, in their ready forbearance towards each others differences, and when properly advised, evinced, by a ready recognition of our ancient usages and customs. Our information, from almost every section of this jurisdiction,

is full of testimonials of our increasing prosperity. I can but exceedingly regret, that a necessary attention to the active duties of an arduous profession has prevented me from visiting as many of the subordinate lodges as I could have desired under more favorable opportunities.

Three active Grand Lecturers have been, however, most of the time in the field, affording ample opportunities for such as desired it, to profit by their instructions. You will receive from themselves a detailed and more satisfactory report of their operations. I find the disposition quite prevalent in the various lodges to reconcile discrepancies, and approximate as nearly as possible to an exact uniformity of work. This can alone be accomplished by securing the services of some one of our Grand Lecturers in Lodge instruction. I would suggest to the Grand Lodge the propriety of the plan adopted in many jurisdictions, of dividing our State into districts, with a Deputy Grand Master appointed to each. I think this would not only relieve the Grand Master from a great deal of unnecessary labor in correspondence, but would greatly facilitate the business of subordinate lodges by having in their vicinity, a District Deputy Grand Master, who could visit them at intervals, reconcile differences, adjust doubtful constructions of Masonic usage, and harmonize discrepancies in work. From the remote situation of our subordinate lodges as well as the capacity of their increase in numbers, it is impossible that under the existing arrangement, they can all be visited by the Grand Officers. Many troublesome delays, frequently necessarily occur in their business relations, before they can procure a Dispensation to open a Grand Lodge, or transact any business apart from the ordinary routine. This, we think might, by the plan indicated, be, to a great extent, remedied.

From the report of the Agent of St. John's College, it will be found that the fraternity has not responded to our appeal to their liberality with the zeal which was anticipated. The Institution is in progress of erection. It has been embarked by this Grand Lodge upon the sea of experiment as her own legitimate offspring. Its Trustees have become embarrassed for the want of the necessary means to proceed with their operations. Are we willing to look on with indifference at their perplexities, and extend no hand to their assistance? This subject is one which I especially commend to your consideration. Some means must be devised to relieve its embarrassment; or the project abandoned entirely. In the present stringent condition of monetary affairs, it seems impossible to meet the necessary expenditures by voluntary contribution. I would suggest as an alternative, the propriety of endeavoring to negotiate a loan upon as advantageous terms as possible, based upon the real estate of the College as collateral security. Unless this or some other plan be adopted to relieve our difficulties, I see no other hope in the future of St. John's College but an inevitable failure. That alternative we must carefully and prudently determine. If, after having proceeded thus far, we abandon the enterprise, it will be a blot upon our escutcheon which will require years of industry to erase. It will herald to the world

our own imbecility. Are we willing to make the acknowledgment that the fraternity of North Carolina, with their generous hearts, their high intelligence, and numerical strength, their varied resources and abundant means, are unable to erect one single College of character within the State? We are rapidly approximating such a calamity. But, notwithstanding its unpropitious appearance, by a proper co-operation of effort we can make something of it if we will. We can render it a formidable engine for good in our future history, or a perfect incubus to our progress. If the brethren who erected the Temple immortalized their name by their stupendous achievement, why may we not render St. John's College a monument to our liberality more imperishable than brass, and when all the varied benefits are realized by posterity, our children's children will rise up and do honor to our memories. We will then have erected a monument more lasting than the Pyramids, as durable as our own native hills, because it will be embalmed and perpetuated in the safe repository of faithful breasts.

The Committee appointed at our last annual communication to prepare a digest of the resolutions and regulations now in force, for the purpose of having them printed with the constitution and by-laws, as well as the forms of Masonic trial, discharged the duty assigned them as soon as circumstances permitted. After a careful supervision, I forwarded them to the Grand Secretary, who had them printed and extensively distributed among the subordinate lodges. Much benefit will result from them, as well as many irregularities practiced in Masonic trials corrected. I have been pained to find, in the extended facilities I enjoy of becoming familiar with the internal operations of subordinate lodges, so many records of trial for violation of Masonic duty. This is evidently a difficulty of our own creation. Many young lodges, especially, under the enthusiasm of popular favor, do not sufficiently guard the portals to our inner temple against the introduction of the unworthy. From a misapprehension that numbers promote strength, they are not rigid enough in their investigations of character, and some find ingress, who, ever afterwards prove a constant source of mortification and trouble. Masonry has nothing to fear from adversity if it but remove the dross, and exhibit more fully the beauties of the metal. It is in prosperity alone we are in danger, when under a propulsive efforts to procure proselytes our favors are incautiously bestowed upon the immoral and unworthy, with the falacious hope of effecting a reformation by our association. This is no conjectural danger, but one which the annual proceedings of the Grand Lodge fully demonstrates. We are taught to recognize no distinctions but those of character, but that should be an indispensable prerequisite, to admittance to our privileges. He who does not sustain the reputation of a just and upright man before the world, is not worthy to participate in the vows which rest upon us. If he is a drone in society, he will prove a perfect vampire in Masonry.

Two years ago the Grand Lodge, through her College Agent, secured a subscription from many northern merchants, upon consideration of our pro

ceedings becoming an advertising medium for their firms, as well as their introduction to the favorable consideration of the fraternity of our State, in their patronage North. This innovation upon established Masonic usage has elicited the animadversions and strictures of some of our brethren in other States, in no ordinary measured tones. It is not our province nor is this the time, to enter upon a refutation of these allegations, but we think the chairman of the committee of foreign correspondence of the Grand Lodge of Iowa, not only transcended the bounds of ordinary propriety, but has seemingly forgotten some of the cardinal principles of our order. The portion of that report, in reference to the action of this Grand Lodge, in that matter, I commend to your consideration and action.

I do hope some ways and means may be devised, to erase this blot from our proceedings. I questioned the propriety of the policy when sanctioned by the Grand Lodge, and would greatly prefer that we should plod along at a snail's pace in poverty, rather than endeavor to soar in borrowed plumage, at the expense of our masonic character. I hope a satisfactory plan may be devised by which this subscription may be refunded, and no evidence exist to the world, that we are willing to compromise our Masonic honor for paltry gold.

Since our last Communication, a circular has been received from the Grand Lodge of Georgia, announcing the death of their Grand Master, W. C. Dawson. We deeply sympathize with that body in the sad bereavement they have sustained in the loss of one of its brightest jewels, and hope they may find many votaries of the art to imitate his virtues, skill, and fidelity to the craft.

A Document of the highest importance to the fraternity has been forwarded us from the Independent Grand Lodge of Canada. It details a multitude of grievances under which they labored, as well as a detail of the various causes, which impelled them to throw off their allegiance to the Grand Lodge of England. It is a very lengthy paper, and fully and satisfactorily explains itself. We regard it as one of the most important masonic occurrences of modern times. The representatives of forty-one subordinate Lodges in convention assembled, organized and perfected an Independent Grand Lodge. Masonry in that province has been governed by a Provincial Grand Lodge, chartered by the United Grand Lodge of England. Annoying and perplexing difficulties were perpetually arising, from the existence of many Lodges in the Province, holding charters from the Grand Lodges of England, Ireland and Scotland. The Brethren having time after time, used entreaty, petition and remonstrance to the parent Grand Lodge, to modify their provincial charter—to remove some of the burdens which were paralyzing their energies—to relieve them of some of the onerous contributions which were draining and impoverishing their treasury. Having appealed in vain for a redress of their grievances—no other alternative remained but to organize in an independent jurisdiction. I hope to see this

Grand Lodge extend her a cordial welcome, and greet her as an equal in the brilliant galaxy of American Grand Lodges.

We have also received a Circular from the Provincial Grand Lodge of Canada West, which will likewise be submitted for your consideration, severely censuring this so called schismatic movement. We think, however, that instead of disproving the position taken by the Independent Grand Lodge, it but affords, if possible, an additional argument in the justness of their complaint, and that the causes which forced them to a separation, were only such as would naturally influence an intelligent people to resist oppression.

There are a few irregularities of a local character growing common in Lodge proceedings, to which I desire to direct your attention. A prominent one is, that in very many instances too much haste is exercised in passing candidates through the various degrees. Very frequently, reasons however trifling are interpreted a case of emergency, and the candidate is hurried through the formality of the degree almost without illustration, and his impressions of them are indistinct and unsatisfactory. Before he becomes familiar with the proper uses of the compass and gauge as a master workman, the Trowel is committed to his hands. This is not practically elucidating according to their true intent our symbolic degrees, and no candidate should ever be permitted to pass onward, until he has given satisfactory evidence of a suitable proficiency in the inferior degrees.

Masons are not always sufficiently circumspect in their ordinary relations to each other in society. How often do we find it the case, that brethren in the ordinary assemblages of the Lodge room, apparently work harmoniously, every act seems in strict conformity to the prescribed principles of the order; even the mutual obligations of fraternity and morality, are respected and observed. Let these very brethren emerge from the Lodge, engage in the active pursuits of every day life—how often do we find their masonic vows forgotten, and they as men and citizens, engaging in bickerings and strife, and enacting scenes of hostility towards each other, not only derogatory to their masonic character, but disreputable as men. These irregularities doubtless, frequently originate from a want of proper admonition and instruction; they nevertheless are of frequent occurrence, and demand prompt and efficient remedies for their removal. This can alone be accomplished, by Lodges exercising a strict surveillance over the irregularities of its members, raising its standard of moral excellence in strict conformity to our ancient Landmarks, and permit no modern innovation to change them.

The most prominent danger which seems likely to threaten the perpetuity of our Institution, is the unprecedented rapidity of its increase, that it may lose its own identity in the modernisms incorporated from other organizations, somewhat similar in design. The surest prevention against the dangerous influences of these subtle poisons is to imbibe alone from the pure fountain of our order—familiarize ourselves with her Ancient Constitutions—garner up profitable instruction from the exhaustless treasures of

our own literature. The last few years have made most important and valuable additions to masonic lore. Journals full of profitable wisdom are scattered broadcast over our country, the energy and indomitable enterprise of recent times has rendered a Masonic library accessible to almost every member of the fraternity. Every Lodge should not only endeavor to accumulate a Library of Masonic works, for the improvement of its members, but should subscribe for one of the many valuable Masonic periodicals, so easily and cheaply obtained. How soon such a policy as this among subordinates, would tell upon the increased intelligence of the fraternity.

An increasing disposition in many portions of this jurisdiction is manifesting itself, in an effort to unnecessarily multiply Lodges. This does not always accomplish the purpose intended. Where too much crowded no good results follow. Under the pressure of popular favor they may increase their members in number, but not promote the strength of the Lodge. A species of rivalry is engendered, and persons who under ordinary circumstances, would not have been tolerated, are permitted to enter. During their novelty they may grow and flourish temporarily, but a single blast of disappointment nips all their hopes and they fall to rise no more. This is the prolific source of the forfeiture of so many Charters. Subordinate Lodges should be especially careful in their recommendations for Dispensation. Be satisfied in the first place that the petitioners are worthy master masons, proficient in the art, and whether the opening of a new Lodge at the place designated, will permanently advance the cause of Masonry. A little attention to this matter will generally ultimately prove of important practical benefit.

Brethren we have assembled under flattering auspices this evening.—Coming together in friendly counsel from the mountains to the seaboard—greeting each other as brothers, volunteers under the same broad banner of morality and philanthropy, let us consider that we are responsible, individually and collectively, for the result and influences of our present deliberations. Let us endeavor to diffuse from this Grand Lodge, influences calculated to elevate the position of our order in public confidence. May no discordant element intrude itself into our counsels—no selfish purpose influence our motives. But may every representative, assembled on this deeply interesting occasion, unite heart and hand, as citizens, patriots and Masons, in the same exalted purpose of rendering North Carolina Masonry what all desire to see her as a State, one of the brightest gems that adorn the brilliant galaxy of the Union.

To the Most Worthy Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The Committee appointed at the last Communication of the Grand Lodge, to procure new Regalia for its officers, and to have the necessary repairs and improvements made to the Gr. Lodge's Building—ask leave to report that they have discharged the duty assigned them. The Regalia they purchased at New York, for the sum of \$334 50 cents ; and the Repairs, Improvements, &c., were completed for the sum of \$628 81 cents ; making the whole amount expended, \$963 31 cents, which has been paid by the Grand Treasurer, and the bills are in his possession, and can be examined by the committee appointed to audit his Books, &c.

The Grand Secretary submitted his Report, which was read and adopted :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The clock of time in its regular and undisturbed revolvings and windings, has again brought around the season of the year, in which you have been accustomed to assemble in Grand Communication. Suffer me to congratulate you on the favorable circumstances under which you have met, to deliberate on the various subjects which may be submitted for your consideration.

Nothing of much importance has transpired in my department during the present year which is fast hastening to a close, and will soon be numbered with the years gone by. Those Lodges which have been organized by Dispensations during the year, will, I presume, petition for, and receive Charters. Their names can be ascertained by a reference to the Report of the Committee on Charters and Dispensations.

The Subordinate Lodges of this jurisdiction, and our Sister Grand Lodges of the States and Territories, with those of the Canadas, have been supplied with the usual copies of our proceedings of last year.

I have also supplied the Subordinates with the Constitution and Bye-Laws of the Grand Lodge, a form of Returns and Representation, and a Resolution of your Most Worshipful body, proposing to change the present mode of electing the Grand Master.

I have received from the Subordinate Lodges, and paid to our faithful and efficient Grand Treasurer, Bro. C. W. D. Hutchings, the sum of \$1691 50, for which I have his receipt, and hold in my hands a balance of \$7 95, which I have placed to the credit of the Grand Lodge for postage purposes.

Brother William C. Doub, the Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Correspondence, in obedience with a requirement of the Grand Lodge, furnished me with a copy of his Report which I have had printed, and it is in readiness for the perusal of your Body.

I continue to receive the fraternal interchange of the proceedings of our Sister Grand Lodges, which will be placed in the hands of the Committee to be appointed to examine and report upon their contents at the proper time.

At your last annual Communication, I was requested to purchase a copy of the Masonic Library, published by Bro. Robert Morris, a distinguished member of our Fraternity of the State of Kentucky, which duty, I have in obedience thereto, discharged, and I have in my possession 16 volumes of that valuable work, from which a large fund of Masonic knowledge may be obtained, from a careful perusal of its contents.

All of which is respectfully submitted,

To the Most Worshipful Grand Master, Wardens and Members of the Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

At the close of this Masonic year it becomes necessary for me to render to this Honorable body a statement of my proceedings. I have visited and instituted the following Lodges, viz : Royal White Hart Lodge, No. 2 ; Unanimity Lodge, No. 7 ; Sharon Lodge, No. 78 ; Joseph Warren Lodge, No. 92 ; Jerusalem Lodge, No. 95 ; St. John's Lodge, No. 96 ; Mt. Lebanon Lodge, No. 117 ; Conahoe Lodge, No. 131 ; Radiance Lodge, No. 132 ; and Marlboro' Lodge, No. 177, all of which I found working rather badly, but left them in a sound and healthy condition. And I must here say that those Lodges that I have visited, are composed of such men as will stand the test of the Grand Overseer's square, (with very few exceptions.) In the part of the State in which I have traveled, the Order is in a very flourishing condition, and the members manifest a great disposition for "more light." There has been in the bodies which I have visited, some over one hundred and thirty members added, all of which, I believe to be *good* men and *true*. In the early part of the year I received a communication from our Worthy Grand Secretary, Bro. Bain, requesting me to visit Hall Lodge, No. 53, and Sharon Lodge, No. 78, to ascertain why they had not made their reports and paid up their dues. I immediately addressed a letter to each of these Lodges, and was informed by Hall Lodge that they had not had a meeting for 18 months, but were very anxious to get to work again, and requested me to give them the necessary information how they should proceed to get to work, which information I gave them, and have heard nothing from them since. I also received a let-

ter from Sharon Lodge, No. 78, informing me that they still continued to hold their meetings regularly, but were anxious for more light, and wished me to come and lecture them, which I did, and was informed by the Worthy Master that their neglect in complying with the Laws of the Grand Lodge, was through no disrespect to the Grand Lodge, but from circumstances almost unavoidable on their part. During the present year, I have collected the following amounts on the subscriptions for St. John's College, in my possession, viz: Bryant Burnett, \$25; T. W. Ward, \$15; H. L. Williams, \$25: making in all, only \$65, which amounts I have paid over to the Brother authorized to receive the same. There are some subscribers on these petitions who refuse to pay their subscriptions. And, in conclusion, permit me to say that wherever I have visited I have been treated with the greatest degree of kindness and fraternal regard by the Brethren, and have been much pleased with the zeal and ardent desire for instruction exhibited by the Brethren. Should I be favored with the appointment of Lecturer this coming year, I will endeavor to visit those dormant Lodges in the eastern part of the State, to ascertain what their condition is.

The Report of the President of the Board of Trustees of St. John's College was read, and referred to a Special Committee, consisting of Bros. J. M. Happoldt, Baxter Clegg, John A. Taylor, of Wilmington, Wm. H. Beatty, and James Reid.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The Trustees of St. John's College beg leave to make the following communication to this most worshipful body, as their report of the progress and interests of that institution, since the last meeting of this Grand Lodge.

They respectfully submit that in all things appertaining to the interest of the College, they have endeavored to carry out the wishes of the Grand Lodge, so far as the same had been made to appear ; but in most matters of importance, they have been compelled to assume the responsibility of acting upon their own judgment, and they sincerely hope that the result of their endeavors may meet the approbation of this body, and be favorable to the interests of the College.

The time is near at hand when the building will be completed, and when this most worshipful body will, together with the Masonic fraternity throughout the State, assemble to perform the ceremonies incumbent upon its completion, the 24th of June, 1857, a period which has been looked to with more than ordinary interest by all Masons, and with profound anxiety by the

Masons of North Carolina. It will be an event unprecedented in the Masonic history of this State, and in its humane and benevolent designs will be without a parallel.

The College building has so far progressed as to show the beauty of its exterior, and the convenience of its internal arrangement, and during its progress, the materials and workmanship of which it is composed, have been under the supervision and inspection of the following building committee: Bros. Z. M. Paschall, R. P. Taylor, and J. R. Herndon.

The brick used have been pronounced of the best quality, and workmanship equally good. The wood-work, also, will doubtless be completed at the time agreed.

The Trustees are qualified in the assurance that they are engaged in an enterprise destined to be productive of good to the Order, and in the success of which, both the Grand Lodge and the Grand Chapter manifest so deep an interest, and they are encouraged to hope that the most sanguine expectations of its friends will be realized, in its dispensations of charity, and that it may become a nucleus around which Masonry shall flourish in all its beauty, shedding the fruits of virtue, morality, and benevolence.

In regard to the finances of the Institution, the Trustees have endeavored to pay to the contractors for the building, the several instalments as they became due; but, in this, they regret to say, that they have not succeeded; and that, while many who have subscribed to, and were in other respects indebted to, the College, have paid with commendable promptness, there are some who have deferred payment to such an extent as to cause surprise by this neglect of their obligations. Such delinquency has been the cause of the present financial embarrassment of the College, and consequently a loss of confidence by some of its friends, and disaffection on the part of others, while there are ample means to meet its liabilities, if they could be made available. As an evidence of this, the first four instalments amounting to \$7,200, was paid with comparative ease; and the three installments which have fallen due this year, amounting only to \$5,200 have not been paid. Whether this delay indicates a

want of interest in the College, or results from any other cause, it is equally a subject of inconvenience and regret.

The Agents in the employ of the Board of Trustees, have accomplished but little, compared with what was expected of them at a time when means were most needed; but the reports of Bro. R. C. Mainard, the traveling agent of the College, and of Bro. L. A. Paschall, the Agent for the County of Granville, will disclose more fully the extent and success of their operations. The same are recommended to your inspection.

It was deemed advisable to have other Agents in the field, and Bro. J. T. Littlejohn and Z. K. Paschall were appointed a Committee to employ them; but they had not succeeded in doing so at the time of their last report.

Though the success of our agents has not equalled our expectations, yet our friends should not be discouraged, as time and much labor is requisite in the accomplishment of every great enterprise; besides, we have some other resources upon which we may rely, should necessity force us to avail ourselves of them.

These would be, to sell the lots (which are a considerable number,) adjacent to the College grounds, and which should be put in market at a proper time, would doubtless prove valuable. Their management and disposition have been given to a Committee composed of Bros. L. A. Paschall, R. P. Taylor, and Z. M. Paschall, in the soundness of whose judgment we have the utmost confidence; and believe they will obtain their full value in the sale of them.

In pursuance of a recommendation of the Grand Lodge, that the President of the Board of Trustees, should procure from one to three thousand lithograph prints of the College Building, he reports that he visited Baltimore in October last, and made all necessary enquiries preparatory to the wish of the Grand Lodge. Messrs. Hoen & Co., were recommended to him as being well skilled in their profession, and reliable as to the performance of their contracts. The statement of the work and their terms are appended to this report, and any direction the Grand Lodge may think proper to give, he will have pleasure in

superintending its execution. He has no doubt that the copies lithographed will readily sell, and more than pay the expense of their execution in a short time; and, but for the scarcity of funds in the Treasury, he would have contracted for the work while in Baltimore, and had it forthwith executed.

The Report of the Committee on Foreign Correspondence, was read and adopted:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina:

The committee that was entrusted, at the last session of your honorable body, with the duty of examining and reporting upon the communications of such grand bodies as have saluted us with their annual greetings, beg leave to report, that they have received and examined, as carefully as their opportunity would

permit, the proceedings of the following grand lodges, viz : Alabama, Arkansas, California, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Mississippi, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Vermont, Virginia, Wisconsin, and from the grand chapters of Ohio and Indiana.

The committee are happy to inform your most honorable body that a spirit of peace and harmony, more general than has heretofore existed, now prevails throughout the extended jurisdiction exercised by these several grand bodies, and that whilst there may be a few questions, of no very general importance, that form the subjects of discussion between several of our sister grand lodges, yet they are handled in a manner that shows that our brethren generally are not disposed to stir up strife, or cause any breach among the members of the fraternity. Masons are but men, of like passions and prejudices with other men, and it is but reasonable to suppose that disagreements and differences of opinion will arise between individual members as well as grand bodies. But as Masons are under peculiar obligations to each other, it can but be supposed that they will examine, discuss and settle their difficulties, in that spirit of harmony and brotherly love that should make all mankind, and especially brother masons, firm in the right, but courteous and conciliatory in their disposition and demeanor towards each other. We do not propose to discuss any of these various questions that have been agitated within the jurisdiction of our sister grand lodges, because no very serious difficulties have arisen from them; nor do we conceive that an expression of opinion either from this grand lodge or from the committee, has been required or is even desired by any of our sister grand lodges.—As no good could result, in the estimation of your committee, from the discussion of questions that are really of minor import, and when examined carefully into are found to contain no very substantial disagreement, your committee decline entering into it, but prefer rather to call the attention of the brethren to a few points suggested by the perusal of the proceedings of our

sister grand lodges, that may be of some interest and profit to the lodges under this grand jurisdiction.

Before proceeding to the main object of this report, the committee would beg leave to state, that it is well known to this grand lodge, that within the jurisdiction of several of our sister grand lodges, very serious and alarming difficulties have heretofore existed, growing out of a conflict of jurisdiction between these grand lodges and foreign bodies that claimed an equal and concurrent jurisdiction with them within their own limits. All the varied and conflicting questions, growing out of this claim of concurrent jurisdiction on the part of foreign grand lodges, have been ably and fully set before this body by former committees, and this committee is fully confident that this grand lodge is in possession of all the information upon these points that can be laid before it, and hence they decline entering further into such discussions. But they mention this subject now, that they may have an opportunity of stating that the differences that have so long distracted some of our sister grand lodges, arising out of this question, have either been harmoniously adjusted, or are in such a train as to give great hopes of a speedy settlement of them all, and a restoration of that harmonious co-operation between the several grand and subordinate jurisdictions, that all good masons so earnestly desire and hope for.— At all events, the committee believe that they are fully warranted in declaring that it is their firm belief that we shall not soon be called upon to mourn over such scenes as have heretofore given so much uneasiness and pain to masons throughout the world.

One custom generally noticed and too prevalent among the various subordinate lodges, is the facility with which masons are made. Though it is gratifying to all good masons, that our beloved institution has safely weathered the storm of persecution that once threatened to overwhelm it in speedy destruction, and is everywhere commending itself to popular favor, yet we must be permitted to remark that masonry, though universal in its character and operations, is not intended to embrace all within its folds. It does not and ought not to go out upon the high-

ways, and proclaiming its excellencies and beauties, invite every one into its portals, regardless of qualifications, and despite of objections. To be a good and faithful mason, well tried and trusty, requires peculiar excellencies, peculiar qualifications.—It is not enough to inquire whether a man will do no positive injury to masonry, but it is important to know whether he will be an active working member, one who not only will do us no injury by his association with us, but reflect credit upon the institution wherever his connection with it may be known. The haste, then, with which many lodges make masons, their eagerness to enlarge the number of members, is no just criterion by which to judge of their prosperity, or of the progress of the cause. It would be far better for a lodge to have a dozen well tried and active members, men who will illustrate by their diligent attention, in and out of the lodge, to the various duties they take upon themselves when they become masons, and who will make themselves familiar with all of the usages and customs, than to have a large number, who, though they do nothing that may bring disgrace and reproach upon us, remain as ignorant of the true objects and purposes of the institution, as if they had never entered the sacred portals of the temple. The world is apt, nay, quick to judge of any institution by the daily deportment of those who manage its affairs. If they manifest a deep interest in all that concerns it, if they show that their connection with it has made them better men and more valuable citizens, it can but bear a favorable report to the world. But if it produce no change for good upon their character or actions, if the bad and the good are admitted indiscriminately within its portals, whilst the numbers of those who profess to be masons may be greatly increased, we are not so certain that the observant and well thinking portion of the community will regard the institution in its true light. Let it be remembered that it is not the numbers that flock to our portals that give us character and weight in the community, but the uprightness of their lives and the influence for good that they carry with them in their public and private walks. Lodges, then, ought to be admonished to be especially careful to inquire cautiously and

fully into the character of those who seek admittance into their portals.

Then again, the facilities for making masons in some lodges are so great that often two, three, and even more, are initiated, passed and raised in one night, when there can be no urgent necessity for it beyond the mere desire of the applicants. Apart from the fact that this is not in strict accordance with masonic usage, those who are thus hurried through our mysteries, however intelligent and observing they may be, are not and cannot be properly impressed with the sublime moral truths that are intended to be urged upon them. No excuse ought to betray the lodge or its master into such indiscreet or unnecessary haste.— If the mysteries of our institution are worth learning, they ought to be learned in our way and according to our usages. No supposed advantage can compensate for the indecent haste and irregularity so prevalent in many lodges, where the great aim seems to be to add to the number of members, without calculating whether it will add to the dignity or the respectability of the body.

We see complaints made in many of the proceedings of our sister grand lodges of the evils growing out of this inconsiderate haste. Men who are often made masons in one jurisdiction, and armed and equipped with what will commend them to the fraternal regard and brotherly greetings of masons elsewhere, show that the emergency that ensured them the privileges of masonry, did not fit them to take upon themselves the reciprocal obligations they have assumed. They prove to be masons only in name, reflecting no credit upon the lodges that sent them forth, and entailing only trouble and perplexity upon those lodges that receive them.

The committee trust that they are not traveling beyond the strict line of their duty when they call upon this grand lodge to take such steps as will put an end to this irregular and reprehensible practice within this jurisdiction. The strongest way in which we can urge the jurisdiction to conform to the ancient usages of the order, is to practice a strict and unvarying conformity to them ourselves. We can never ask others to aid us in

putting down irregularities and in preserving the ancient landmarks, if we do not ourselves first set the example. We trust that this Grand Lodge at its present annual communication, will adopt such measures as in its wisdom it may deem adequate to remedy a great and growing evil. We have thus imperfectly discharged our duty in reference to this question, and leave the matter in the hands of the grand lodge to dispose of as they may deem proper.

The subject of uniformity of work has engaged the attention of this grand lodge at sundry times. We observe that it has also been under discussion in other grand bodies, and there are some things mentioned, and some practiced in other jurisdictions that may be of some advantage to this grand lodge in arriving at the most feasible plan of accomplishing this desirable end.

The system of instruction by general lecturers alone, has been found by experience not to have met fully the wants of the lodges. However efficient and diligent any grand lecturer may be, or even if there be several, it is impossible for them to visit all the lodges every year and impart to them the whole work. Some lodges are indifferent, and some so remote that they cannot easily be reached. The very least time that a lecturer can devote to a single lodge with any benefit to its members, would be one week, and so, in a large jurisdiction like ours, some lodges would be overlooked.

Besides, there are often found those who differ from our grand lecturers in the work, and, although a grand lodge may have duly commissioned him and sent him forth under their official sanction, he may not be cordially received in all portions of the jurisdiction.

Now, is there no way in which this can be remedied, and a perfect uniformity of work secured? Can no means be devised by which all objections can be removed, and an almost perfect uniformity produced? Your committee are of opinion that it may be done.

We observe that in some jurisdictions, the State is divided into districts, and a deputy grand master is appointed for each district, whose business it is to have a general supervision over

the lodges in his district, and to make an annual report to the grand lodge. Now we are of opinion that something of this kind, combined with the present system of having grand lecturers, would produce the desired uniformity, if it were properly organized and carried into operation.

A deputy from each district might meet the grand lecturer appointed by the grand lodge at a designated place and time, where the work might be learned by at least one person in every district in the State. These deputies might then have similar meetings of masters of the different subordinate lodges, in their several districts, at any time and place that would secure the attendance of any number of them, and thus gradually but surely, a uniformity in the work would be produced throughout the entire State. Any differences of opinion as to the particular portions of the work, might be referred to a subsequent general meeting of the grand lecturer and the district deputies.

We throw out these suggestions, hoping that something may be evolved by this grand lodge that may lead to the desired result.

In connection with this subject, the committee would suggest that a stricter attention to the lectures of each degree, upon the part of the masters of the several subordinate lodges, would greatly aid in accomplishing this result. In initiating, passing and raising candidates, many masters, either from ignorance or from disinclination, omit or very imperfectly give the lectures appropriate to each degree, and which the master is bound by his obligation to give whenever he confers the degree. Then, if each master would oftener call his lodge together for instruction, and be more particular in giving a lecture at each meeting of his lodge, it would not take a long time to create such an interest in it, that all the members would attend punctually and avail themselves of the instruction offered them. No lodge should elevate to the responsible post of master a brother who either is not thoroughly qualified to give all the lectures of all the degrees, or who would not immediately upon his election, qualify himself for that important and responsible post.

If masters of lodges would be more careful in the proper discharge of this part of their duties, and members would insist upon the proper qualifications in those they choose to preside over them, this, one of the greatest evils to which the lodges are subjected, would be done away with, and masters and members would work together with more harmony, and a new and increased interest would spring up in all our lodges.

Your committee take pleasure in stating that they have marked with peculiar interest, the very great attention that is being paid by many of our sister grand lodges to the important subject of education. Grand Lodge after Grand Lodge is devising some plan to extend the benefits of a good education to the children of every mason within their jurisdiction. Some grand lodges have a large fund set aside, the income from which in some is devoted to the maintenance of some college or high school, and in others, distributed throughout the jurisdiction, where the needy and the destitute are supplied with the means of acquiring a good education. Whilst some grand lodges have colleges and high schools under their patronage, we observe that subordinate lodges are everywhere moving in the matter. This is a cheering sign of progress, and is a sure mark that whilst masons everywhere are exercising their benevolence and brotherly love, they are also vindicating their claim to be called the supporters and cherishers of the liberal arts and sciences.

Our forms and ceremonies are not mere unmeaning forms and ceremonies, but typical of something important to mankind, and that will promote the general welfare of the human family. This grand lodge and some of her subordinate lodges have already shown that they are awake to the subject, and let us hope that the day is not very far distant when the substantial benefits of masonry, in spreading light and knowledge, will be felt throughout the length and breadth of the land.

Your committee, in thus hastily and imperfectly discharging the duty imposed upon them by this grand lodge, are not aware that they have omitted any subject that ought to be brought before this body. They might have examined in detail and

commented upon the proceedings of each grand lodge, in communication with this grand lodge, but they did not see how it could afford either profit or pleasure to this body. The few points to which the committee have called the attention of the grand lodge, are deserving of its serious consideration; but beyond their recommendation, the committee are free to leave them to the action of this body, in full confidence that it will, in its wisdom and prudence, devise the best plan to remedy existing evils, and to produce the most good to the institution we all so much revere.

The Committee on Charters and Dispensations made their report, which was adopted :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The Committee on Charters and Dispensations beg leave to submit the following report :

They exceedingly regret that the limited time allowed them to investigate the important matters laid before them for reconsideration, matters which require deep thought and mature reflection, had to be passed over hurriedly, and comparatively in a very short time ; but, we would state that we have examined with as much care as possible, the proceedings and by-laws of the following Lodges, working under Dispensation, viz : Sandy Creek, Pine Forest, Central Cross, Palfour, Taylorsville, and Fair Bluff, and recommend that Charters be granted to them, and their delegates, on presenting their credentials, be permitted to take seats as members of this grand lodge.

We would also state that we found inaccuracies in the proceedings and By-Laws of some of the lodges, to wit :

We would respectfully suggest to Sandy Creek lodge to make her By-laws more concise. Pine Grove Lodge has fallen in the unmasonic practice of receiving petitions, balloting for candidates, initiating, passing and raising at the same meetings, which we believe to be the main reason why there are so many ignorant craftsmen in our midst. The 13th article requires a brother casting a black ball, to make known to the master his objections to the applicant. This is in conflict with Article 4th, Section 11th, of the By-laws of this Grand Lodge, which says one black ball shall reject without a question—except that a second ballot may be had to be satisfied that there is no mistake.

Taylorsville, Article 2nd, sec. 4th of By-laws, providing for vacancies in case of death, resignation or removal, at next regu-

lar meeting, which we consider to be contrary to the principles of masonry; believing that in case of the Master's office becoming vacant, that the Senior Warden is to fill his station until the regular time of election, the Junior Warden to fill the Senior Warden's station, and the Junior Warden's station to be filled *pro tem*, unless by dispensation from the Most Worshipful Grand Master.

Your committee would further state, that they have examined also, the proceedings and By-laws of the following lodges, viz: Granite, Burnsville and Unanimity lodges working under Dispensation, and we find some inaccuracies in their By-laws which we have marked that the lodges may correct, and we recommend that charters be granted to said lodges.

The Marshal, Sword Bearer, and Pursuivant in their stations.

Bro. E. J. Lutterloh's resolution submitted on yesterday, was taken up and after some amendments, was adopted as follows :

WHEREAS, Much more of the time of Bro. James Banks, Chairman of the Historical Committee, is being consumed, and more expense incurred by him in the collection of material for his report than was contemplated by this Grand Lodge, be it

Resolved, That the Treasurer of this Grand Lodge be instructed to pay to Bro. Banks the amount of expenses incurred by him during the past year, and that Bro. Banks be requested to report quarterly his expenses during the ensuing year, which amount be paid by the Grand Treasurer.

The Grand Master appointed Bro. R. N. Forbes, Peter Adams and W. T. Gannaway, a committee to examine the reports and accounts of St. John's College.

The Committee on Propositions and Grievances, made the annexed report which was adopted :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The Committee on Propositions and Grievances respectfully submit the following report :

In the case of A. R. Warner, from Blackmer Lodge, No. 129 : The accused was convicted by his Lodge for having violated his word after giving it as a master mason, to two master masons, without showing any justifiable reasons therefor that did not exist at the time the promise was made, to the prejudice and injury of two master masons, and was indefinitely suspended by said Lodge. We respectfully recommend that the decision of the subordinate Lodge be approved and affirmed by this Grand Lodge.

In the case of Wm. J. McElroy, from William R. Davie Lodge No. 119, who was suspended from all the rights and benefits of free masonry for three years, upon the charge of having lost his character as a man of truth, and for having threatened to expose the secrets of free masonry upon being reprimanded by a brother mason for his unmasonic conduct. Your committee respectfully recommend that the pro-

ceeding had in this subordinate lodge be approved, and their judgment in this case be affirmed by the Grand Lodge.

In the case of Bro. R. Gilchrist, from Phoenix Lodge, No. 8 : The accused was convicted of habitual intemperance by his lodge. Having been duly tried, and sentenced to indefinite suspension, we respectfully recommend that the decision of the subordinate lodge, in this case, be approved and affirmed by this Grand Lodge.

In the case of J. S. Robeteau, from Phoenix Lodge, No. 8 ; The accused was convicted by his lodge of habitual drunkenness, and sentenced to indefinite suspension. We respectfully recommend that the decision of the subordinate lodge in this case be approved and affirmed by this Grand Lodge.

In the case of Will. F. Harderson, from William R. Davie Lodge : We report that the transcript is in regular form, and the proceedings had in the case are proper. We respectfully recommend to the Grand Lodge that the decision of the subordinate lodge, in this case, be affirmed.

In the case of Brother Norwood Wiley, sent up from Greensboro' Lodge No. 76, who was indefinitely suspended upon a charge of "unmasonic conduct in violating his master mason's obligation by a gross falsehood and fraud, practiced on a brother master mason." Your committee would respectfully report that the transcript of the record in this case, is too imperfect to base any action of this grand lodge upon it. We recommend the case to be sent back for a more perfect record in the following particulars, to wit : whether the accused brother acknowledged himself guilty of both the specifications in the charge, the nature of the fraud charged, and lastly whether the accused brother was tried in a master mason's lodge.

In the case of Samuel Fisher, from Logan Lodge, No. 121 : Your Committee recommend that the decision of the subordinate Lodge, in this case, be affirmed by this Grand Lodge.

In the case of John B. Gatter, from Mocksville Lodge, No. 134 : Your Committee report that the only evidence against the

accused sent up to this Grand Lodge, in his own declaration before the lodge, wherein he admits that he had stricken a master mason in anger, but, at the same time he stated he did it under circumstances which justified him in so doing. Taking the whole of the declarations together, we think that the subordinate lodge erred in their decision, and we respectfully recommend that it be reversed.

The petition of Edward Ransdall represents that in the year 1855, he was expelled from all the rights, benefits, and privileges of masonry by Lafayette Lodge, No. 86, for drunkenness, that said lodge is now extinct, and that he has become a sober and peaceable citizen, and prays this Grand Lodge to restore him again to the rights and privileges of our order. And some forty names of persons representing themselves to be members of Clinton Lodge, recommend the petitioner to the favorable consideration of this Grand Lodge. This petition bears date the 2d day of November, 1855. Your Committee have availed themselves of the opportunity of inquiring at sources they rely upon, and they find that the applicant was expelled from his lodge many years ago for drunkenness, and that he lived a sober life for a long time as set forth in his petition, but unfortunately for him, his old infirmity has returned upon him since the date of his petition, and that he has been seen drunk upon divers occasions within the last year. Your Committee respectfully recommend that the prayer of the petitioner be not granted.

In the case of Bro. P. W. Wooley, indefinitely suspended from Pee Dee Lodge, No. 150, for unmasonic conduct, viz : Intemperance, your Committee recommend that the decision of the lodge be approved and affirmed.

In the case of Bro. T. B. Haskill, expelled from Pee Dee Lodge, No. 150, for unmasonic conduct, viz : intemperance and trading with negroes, your Committee report that it does not appear from the transcript sent up, whether the brother was notified to appear on trial or not, and would therefore recommend that the case be sent back to the Lodge for a more perfect

The report of the Committee on the Grand Master's communication was read and adopted :

The Committee to whom was referred the annual communication of the Most Worshipful Grand Master, have had the same under careful consideration, and beg leave to submit the following as the report, for the adoption of the Grand Lodge. Your Committee would respectfully recommend that portion of the Most Worshipful Grand Master's address, which relates to the appointment of District Deputy Grand Masters, to the favorable consideration of this Grand Lodge; and for the purpose of carrying out the views therein expressed, recommend that the same be referred to a Committee of three to report thereon.

We fully concur with the Most Worthy Grand Master in condemning in the severest terms, the haste, which many subordinate Lodges are guilty of, in making masons, and the great error they have fallen into, in believing that numbers add to their strength, after using materials without any regard to the internal qualifications, and often materials which will remain as a rough ashler, and that should be left to repose in the great quarry of nature as wholly unfit for the builder's use. The great haste exhibited by many lodges, in conferring the degrees, even upon the slightest pretext is certainly a departure from the ancient landmarks and usages of the fraternity, and we heartily concur with the views expressed by our Grand Master in relation to the same, and would recommend the subordinate lodges, working under the jurisdiction of this Grand lodge, to adhere strictly to the ancient landmarks of the fraternity.

The Committee, on that portion of the address which relates to the embarrassed condition of the Trustees of St. John's College, deeply feel the great responsibility which now rests upon

the fraternity of North Carolina. It has been truly said that the enterprise has been embarked by this Grand Lodge upon the sea of experiment, and that it is our legitimate offspring, and your Committee feel the obligations resting upon the present Grand Communication, to be of no ordinary character. Something must be done to prosecute to completion the noble edifice of St. John's College, which is to be an everlasting monument of the liberality of its founders, and which will be looked upon by generations yet unborn, with no small degree of admiration and wonder; or, if unfinished, to stand as an everlasting monument of disgrace to those into whose hands its destiny has been placed. Your Committee would much deplore that such should be its fate, and would recommend that this most worshipful grand body take the necessary steps to procure funds for its speedy completion, by adopting the following as the most feasible plan for the same: that the Trustees of St. John's College obtain by loan the requisite amount for the completion of the same, the payment to be secured by a mortgage upon the property.

That portion of the Most Worshipful Grand Master's Address which relates to the subscriptions obtained by the Agent of St. John's College, of northern merchants, fully meets the views of your Committee, and we recommend that the same be referred to a committee of three.

The Committee, on that portion of the address which refers to the Grand Lodge in Canada, feel that we, in common with our brethren in Canada, are engaged in one common cause: that is, the promotion of the interests of our time-honored institution, and that this Grand Lodge, with fraternal feelings, should recognize and receive, with cordial friendship, the Grand Lodge of Canada, and extend to her the courtesies usual among Grand Lodges.

There are many points of interests which are of great moral excellence set forth in the annual address of our Most Worshipful Grand Master, but which do not require any particular notice at the hands of your Committee. But we cannot refrain expressing our admiration of that portion of the address which

speaks of the conduct of masons, both in the lodge room, and in their intercourse with the brethren in the private transactions of every day life, the great moral lessons which are inculcated and impressed upon the candidate at every step he takes through the various degrees, should be indelibly impressed upon his mind, and should be the constant practice in their intercourse with each other and with the world. Any departure from or in violation of these moral lessons by individual brethren should be taken into consideration by the subordinate lodges.

Your Committee are fully satisfied that the views set forth by our Grand Master in regard to the recommendation of brethren by chartered lodges for dispensation, are correct and wholesome, and that many are the evils of granting dispensations for new Lodges, to the extent to which in various instances the practice has been carried; therefore, we would respectfully recommend that portion of the address to the careful consideration of the subordinate lodges.

Your Committee feel that they have but discharged the duty assigned them in an imperfect manner, and, in conclusion, beg leave to add their testimony to the high-tone and great moral worth of the address of our Most Worshipful Grand Master, as a document of Masonic lore, every way worthy of the high position in which your confidence has placed him.

The Committee to whom was referred that part of the Grand Master's address, in which he recommended the division of the State into districts, and the appointment of a Deputy Grand Master for each district, and Grand Lecturers, submit the following as their report :

Your Committee cordially approve the design of the Grand Master in recommending a plan to secure a uniformity of work in the Lodges of N. C., and after due deliberation upon the subject, they would recommend the following resolutions to be adopted by the Grand Lodge.

Resolved, 1st, That the State be divided into three districts, the Eastern, Central and Western as follows :—The *Eastern District* to comprise the counties of Currituck, Camden, Pasquotank, Gates, Perquimans, Hertford, Bertie, Chowan, Washington, Tyrrell, Hyde, Beaufort, Craven, Carteret, Northampton, Halifax, Martin, Pitt, Jones, Onslow, Lenoir, Greene, Edgecombe, New Hanover, Duplin, Wayne, Brunswick, Nash, Warren and Franklin. The *Central District* to comprise the counties of Sampson, Columbus, Robeson, Cumberland, Moore, Richmond, Wake, Chatham, Orange, Granville, Person, Alamance, Wilson, Johnston, Harnett, Person and Caswell. The *Western District* to comprise the counties of Cherokee, Macon, Jackson, Haywood, Henderson, Buncombe, Madison, Rutherford, McDowell, Burke, Yancey, Watauga, Wilkes, Caldwell, Alexander, Catawba, Cleveland, Lincoln, Gaston, Surry, Yadkin, Iredell, Rockingham, Stokes, Davie, Davidson, Rowan, Cabarrus, Union, Anson, Stanly, Montgomery, Randolph, Guilford, Rockingham and Forsythe.

Resolved 2d, That the Grand Master shall appoint three Grand Lecturers for the above Districts, who shall assemble at some convenient place as soon as practicable after the close of this Communication, for the purpose of consulting with each other and securing entire uniformity in their instructions throughout the State.

Resolved 3d, That it shall be incumbent upon each Grand Lecturer to visit once a year, each subordinate lodge within his jurisdiction, as shall desire his services, for the purpose of giving instruction in the work.

Resolved 4th, That each Subordinate lodge thus visited and instructed, shall pay to said Grand Lecturer twenty-five dollars

per week, together with the necessary expenses incurred during his visit, and in traveling from one Lodge to another.

Resolved 5th, That all resolutions now in force which conflict with the foregoing, be, and are hereby repealed.

Bro. Clegg, from the Committee on Education, made his report, which was adopted:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina:

The Committee on Education beg leave most respectfully to submit the following report:

The state of education, among the craft in North Carolina, has not assumed so marked a character as to entitle the fraternity to claim superiority over others in the noble and greatly needed work of educating the rising generation. Scarcely enough has been done to redeem the fraternity from the impeachment of indifference. A few lodges and masons, in their individual capacity, have done nobly in the cause, and still are exerting a most healthful influence on the public mind.

In the establishment of Academies, Germanton Lodge, No. 116, bears the palm, and the committee take great pleasure in commending the Masonic Institute, enjoying as it does, excellent facilities for the impartation of instruction, to the favorable regard of the fraternity, and its continued confidence.

Knap of Reeds Lodge, and Fellowship Lodge has each a male school in successful operation. Morning Star Lodge has also a male and female school established and under its control. These schools are doing good service in the cause, and are worthy of the regard of the fraternity.

These are all the schools brought to the attention of your

committee. Four schools for a fraternity numbering one hundred and ninety lodges, who ought to be in advance in every good work, represents a state of affairs that your committee cannot say redounds to the honor and praise of the craft.

Your committee has not thought proper to refer to the efforts of building a College, in this report.

Bro. W. K. Blake moved to amend the report on Education, by the addition of the following, which was adopted :

The representatives of Germanton Lodge, No. 116, report the Masonic Institute, organized and put into operation in January, 1852, by said lodge, to be still in a flourishing condition. The average attendance of students is about one hundred per annum.

The Institute building is estimated to be worth \$4,500. It contains a large chapel or hall, well furnished with a sufficient number of chairs and desks to accommodate a larger number of students than has yet been present at any one time.

There are five other rooms in the same building, used for Libraries, laboratory, museum, and recitation rooms. The library now numbers about 2,000 volumes, mostly new and well selected. The apparatus, which is new, cost \$700, and is used with great advantage to the students in Natural Philosophy, Chemistry and Astronomy. The museum contains about 1,000 mineral and fossil specimens, which can be applied with great practical benefit to those in the department of Mineralogy and Geology.

Bro. Clegg from the Committee on St. John's College, made his report, which was read and adopted :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

Your committee to which was referred the interests of St. John's College, would most respectfully state, that they have had the same under consideration.

Having consulted the action of previous Communications of this Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, and the resolves this Lodge has been pleased to express and send forth to the world, we could scarcely find any thing in this line, new, exciting, or novel, with which to instruct, stir, or please ourselves or others.— But after all our fine conceptions, pretty speeches and noble resolves, the work is not completed, and there is need of every craftsman and much work is yet to be done. You have had agents authorized to apply everywhere where available means could be obtained. You have authorized the sale of scholarships in perpetuity, for a limited time; the taking of subscriptions and bonds, and fully instructed all authorized agents and officers to accept the cash, and have bound this Most Worshipful Grand Lodge to pay over all surplus funds, after needful expenses have been met, to the Treasurer of St. John's College. These things you have done, and more than this. You have resolved, and said so to North Carolina, you were going to erect a College worthy of Masonry, and of the State in which you as Masons live.

We need not remind you of past bickerings and heart burnings in the conception of this noble offspring of your body. We find the child living, and we are called on to provide for its support. We may be pardoned for minor delinquencies and improprieties, but whence can forgiveness come to those guilty of infanticide? The living must be fed, or it soon dies.

This beautiful daughter of yours, in her helplessness and infancy, pleads imploringly for your aid and support. Give it. In the end she shall walk forth the loving and lovely mother of scores of sons to call you blessed, and point to her noble sons and say these are my jewels. The food is in the hands of Masons, in the coffers of lodges, and was a Masonic heart ever barred, or hand closed to the calls of the worthy suffering?— Your committee think the enterprise must go on.

The suggestions of the Committee on the Most Worshipful Grand Master's address, and the resolutions adopted, to borrow on mortgage, meets in part the present demand. We would respectfully urge a continuance of active agents, and all

other means becoming the spirit of Masonry, heretofore adopted by this Grand Lodge, and would propose that the President of the Board of Trustees of St. John's College, be allowed to draw on the Grand Treasurer of this Lodge for the cost of striking off 1,000 copies of the lithographs of said college, according to bill reported in his report. We would urge increased punctuality in the payment of bonds and subscriptions, and all authorized agents be cordially encouraged in their visits to Lodges, and communities in which these Lodges may be located.

And further. We propose that this Most Worshipful Grand Lodge instruct the Trustees of St. John's College, to organize that college on a military basis, so as to secure military discipline in the college and instruction in military tactics, and also a department of Polytechnics, securing instruction in the arts, as well as the usual literary branches of education.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina:

The Committee appointed to examine the reports and accounts in relation to St. John's College, beg leave to report as follows:

Upon examination of said papers, they find a report of a committee, appointed at the last session of this Grand Lodge, "to examine the books of the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees of St. John's College," made at this present session, which contains a full statement of the financial condition of the College, embracing all receipts and expenditures up to December 1st, 1856, including the report of L. A. Paschall, as agent for Granville county, so far as appears from said books, showing a balance in the hands of said Treasurer, of \$36 35, December 1st, 1856, subject to such remuneration as may be allowed him by the Board; and certain bonds as set forth in his report in 1855.

Bro. R. C. Maynard has made a general report of his proceedings as general agent for said College, but from it your committee are unable to make such a statement as would be sufficiently intelligible to answer the purpose of the report required of them, as they understand it. Before this can be done, it will be necessary that Bro. Maynard should make a full and particular report, and come to a settlement with said Board of Trustees. He having been appointed such agent by said Board, your committee conceive that it is to them and not to the Grand Lodge, that he is required to report, &c., and, that farther action in the matter must be deferred until this is done and the next annual report of the Treasurer is returned.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The Committee to whom was referred the Returns and Communications of Subordinate Lodges, beg leave to report that they have carefully examined the returns of eighty lodges, and of this number they find fifty eight Lodges deficient in important particulars. Lodges that have not yet provided themselves with seals are earnestly requested to do so at an early day, that they may make their returns properly authenticated. Their attention is likewise called to the duty of giving the date of their charters, the time of holding their regular meetings, and their post office address.

The resolution, adopted by the Grand Lodge at its last communication, to amend article 1, section 2. of the constitution, and submitted to the subordinate lodges for ratification, was adopted by nineteen subordinate lodges, rejected by two, and by the remainder no action at all was taken on the subject.

Resolved, That the Committee on Foreign Correspondence be instructed to correspond with the Grand Lodges of the other States, and get their opinion as to the propriety of holding a Convention to be composed of delegates from each Grand Lodge, in order that uniformity of work in the United States may be had.

Bro. W. K. Blake submitted the following resolution, which was adopted :

Resolved, That at each Annual Communication, in addition to the present standing Committees, the Grand Master shall appoint one styled, "A Committee on Jurisprudence," to whom shall be referred all questions of Masonic law and usage, that may be propounded by the representatives of the several subordinate lodges, and that the report of the committee, if concurred in by the Grand Master, and adopted by the Grand Lodge, shall be spread upon the minutes as the recognized law in this jurisdiction, of all questions therein decided.

Bro. W. J. Hoke, submitted the following resolution which was adopted :

Resolved, That a Committee of two be appointed to procure a copy of the Charter of incorporation of this Grand Lodge, to be returned to the next meeting of this Grand Lodge.

The Grand Treasurer and Secretary, were appointed a Committee to procure a copy of the Charter or Act of Incorporation of this Grand Lodge, from the Hon. William Hill, Secretary of State.

The Grand Lodge called from labor to refreshment until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

On motion of Bro. William K. Blake, it was ordered that the present No. 119 of William R. Davie Lodge, be changed to its original number, 37.

The Report of the Committee on the subscriptions of Northern Houses, was read and adopted. [See last days proceedings.]

Bro. J. F. Howlett, submitted the following resolutions which were read and adopted :

Resolved, That article 1, section 2, of the constitution of the Grand Lodge be amended so as to read as follows : "In the election of Grand Master, a ballot at large shall be taken, (every voter writing the name of the candidate he thinks best qualified) and the brother having a majority of the votes present, shall be declared Grand Master elect, and installed in due form."

Resolved, That the Grand Secretary be instructed to notify subordinate lodges to vote on this amendment, and report their decision to him in writing, under the seal of the lodge, by the next Annual Communication.

Bro. R. N. Forbes, submitted the annexed resolutions, which were read and adopted :

Resolved, That the Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of the State of North Carolina, appoint a Deputy Grand Master for each District of the State, whose duty it shall be to have a general supervision over the subordinate lodges in his district, and to make an annual report of his action to the Grand Master. That he shall meet the Grand Lecturer appointed by the Grand Lodge for his District, at such place and time as they may agree upon, as soon after each session of the Grand Lodge as may be practicable, and before said Lecturer shall proceed to the discharge of his duties, in order to consult together upon the work, &c. And that he call together the Masters of the several lodges in his district, at some convenient time

and place at least once in the year, and that the Grand Lecturer for the District be required to attend said meeting, and then and there to consult together upon the work. And that all differences of opinion as to particular portions of the work, be referred to the Grand Master, the several Deputy Grand Masters and the Grand Lecturers, at the meetings of the Grand Lodge.

Resolved, That each Deputy Grand Master be required to lay before the Committee on Masonic Jurisprudence all questions of Masonic law which may arise in his district. And in addition to the above, that the Grand Master issue a commission to said Deputy Grand Masters, assigning to them such powers and duties as he may see fit.

Bro. T. J. Patrick appointed Bro. S. Neal his proxy for Kilwinning Lodge, No. 64.

Bro. B. H. Bullock appointed Bro. W. S. Thompson his proxy for Mount Energy Lodge, No. 140.

Bros. J. R. Livingston and C. W. Wooley appointed Bro. Calvin W. Wooley their proxy for Blackmer Lodge, No. 127.

The Grand Lodge was called from refreshments to labor.

The Grand Officers and representatives in their seats.

The Committee to whom was referred the appeal case from St. John's Lodge, No. 3, Newbern, made the following report which was read and adopted:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The Special Committee to whom was referred the appeal from the decision of the W. M. of St. John's Lodge, No. 3, beg leave to report that after a careful examination of the records of said lodge exhibited by their representatives, they have arrived at the following conclusion.

It appears from the records of said lodge that at a regular meeting, held at their lodge room on the 13th of August, 1856, the lodge being opened in due form on the master masons' degree, the trial of Bro. Weinstein was then taken up for consideration. The charge being unmasonic conduct, in passing counterfeit money, and supplanting brother masons. Upon the first charge, he was found guilty, but acquitted upon the second. A ballot was then taken for expulsion, which was lost. It was then moved that Bro. W. be suspended, the length of time to be determined afterwards by ballot, which was carried. A motion was then made that his suspension be indefinite, which was lost. It was then moved that the suspension be for twelve months, which was also lost. A motion was then made to reconsider the vote of indefinite suspension, which was carried. It was then moved that he be expelled, which motion was lost. Several other motions for indefinite suspension, varying from twelve months to twenty-five years, were made at that and the subsequent regular meetings, which were all lost.

At the regular communication of said lodge, held September 10, 1856, the case of Bro. Weinstein being under discussion, the Worshipful Master decided that the accused brother remains suspended. After which decision, a motion was made and seconded "that he be suspended, or suspended for five years," which motion was balloted on and lost. The whole subject was then laid over for the purpose of "obtaining information from the Most Worshipful Grand Master, in regard to the laws which should govern their action, and as to the duty of members therein, and that he (the W. M.) also apply to the Grand Master for a Dispensation to renew its action, so far as the same may be irregular or contrary to law, after the determination of his (Bro. Weinstein's) guilt, and for full direction for their guidance, and also, that the members be regularly notified of the same." At a subsequent regular meeting, held November 12th, 1856, the case of Bro. W. again coming up, the Worshipful Master stated that he had received no reply from the Most Worshipful Grand Master, in regard to the trial of Bro. Weinstein.

Bro. Custis then appealed from the decision of the W. M. made at the regular meeting held Sept. 10, 1856, in which he decided, "that as the matter now stands, he (Bro. W.) remains suspended."

Your Committee after a careful examination and consideration of the whole Proceedings had in the case, have arrived at the following conclusions.

First, That the Proceedings had against Bro. Weinstein were regular, and in proper form up to and including the ballot had, re-considering the vote for indefinite suspension at the meeting held August 13, 1856. Since which time, the whole proceedings in the case have been irregular, and your committee are forced to come to the conclusion that no further action should have been had in the case—that Bro. Weinstein had been subjected to all the punishment which could be inflicted under the resolution by which he was suspended, and that the W. M. erred in permitting any other ballot or discussion on the subject, and that he also erred at a subsequent meeting when he decided that Bro. Weinstein remained suspended.

Your committee cannot refrain from expressing their great surprise and regret at the irregularities so often exhibited by the subordinate lodges in conducting masonic trials against delinquent brethren, as the Grand Lodge has supplied each subordinate lodge with a printed form for conducting such trials.

Although the trial of Bro. Weinstein, as we have stated in a former part of this report, was conducted regularly and in form up to a certain stage, we cannot agree with the verdict of the lodge in finding him guilty of the first charge, as after a careful examination of all the evidence in the case, we find no positive proof of his guilt.




